RE: Tentative Agreements/Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) for the Service Employees International Union (SEIU) Local 1000, Bargaining Units 1, 3, 4, 11, 14, 15, 17, 20, and 21

Speaker

Dear Senators De León and Fuller, and Assembly Members Rendon and Mayes: The Department of Human Resources (CalHR) reached new Tentative Agreements with SEIU Local 1000 representing Bargaining Units (BU): 1—Administrative, Financial and Staff Services, BU 3—Professional Educators and Librarians, BU 4—Office and Allied, BU—11 Engineering and Scientific Technicians, BU 14— Printing Trades, BU 15—Allied Services, BU 17—Registered Nurses, BU 20—Medical and Social Services, and BU 21—Education Consultants and Library Employees. Upon approval of the Legislature and the Governor, and ratification by the membership, these agreements will be effective July 2, 2016 through January 1, 2020.

These agreements will roll over language from past agreements and make several changes to address the state's retiree health care costs and associated unfunded liabilities. The state and SEIU Local 1000 have agreed to begin to phase-in the prefunding of retiree health care benefits with the goal of each contributing 50 percent of the actuarially determined normal cost by July 1, 2020.

Following ratification, all eligible members shall receive a one-time bonus of \$2,500. Members will also receive a four percent General Salary Increase (GSI), effective July 1, 2017, a four percent GSI, effective July 1, 2018, and a three and one half percent GSI, effective July 1, 2019.

In accordance with Government Code Sections 3517.5, 19829.5, and Senate Rule 29.4, I am forwarding copies of the Tentative Agreements, including legislative and fiscal summaries. The Legislative Analyst will be forwarded a copy for analysis, and the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the Assembly will be forwarded copies to make them noted as available for review in the daily journals.

Tentative Agreements/Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) with Bargaining Units 1, 3, 4, 11, 14, 15, 17, 20, and 21, dated December 14, 2016, were received in the Senate from the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR) and filed pursuant to Senate Rule 29.4, and is hereby noted in the Assembly Journal. INTRODUCTION OF ASSEMBLY BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 69—Travis Allen. An act to amend Section 220 of the Streets and Highways Code, relating to state highways.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 70—Travis Allen (Coauthors: Chávez and Mathis). An act to add Section 409.16 to the Military and Veterans Code, relating to the California National Guard.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 71—Chiu (Coauthors: Mullin and Ting). An act to amend Sections 12206, 17058, 17225, and 23610.5 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 72—Santiago and Chiu (Coauthor: Mullin). An act relating to housing, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 73—Chiu and Caballero (Coauthors: Mullin, Santiago, and Ting). An act to amend Section 65582.1 of, and to add Chapter 11 (commencing with Section 66200) to Division 1 of Title 7 of, the Government Code, and to add Chapter 4.3 (commencing with Section 21155.10) to Division 13 of the Public Resources Code, relating to land use.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 74—Chiu and Santiago (Coauthor: Mullin). An act to add Part 14.2 (commencing with Section 53590) to Division 31 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to housing, and making an appropriation therefor, to take effect immediately, bill related to the budget.
