INTRODUCTION OF ASSEMBLY BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 97—Mendoza. An act to add Article 6.6 (commencing with Section 110808) to Chapter 5 of Part 5 of Division 104 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to food.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 98—Niello. An act to amend Section 11322.9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to public social services.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 99—Feuer. An act to add Article 7.1 (commencing with Section 43885) to Chapter 4 of Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to vehicular air pollution control.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 100—Nunez. An act to amend Sections 17070.40, 17078.52, 17078.54, and 17078.58 of, and to add Part 69.2 (commencing with Section 102000) to Division 14 of Title 3 of, the Education Code, relating to education facilities, by providing the funds necessary therefor through an election for the issuance and sale of bonds of the State of California and for the handling and disposition of those funds.
