Dear Mr. Wilson,

As authors of Assembly Bill 2, we wish to clarify Section 53055 related to the Governor's Reading Award program.

It is the intent of the authors and the Secretary for Education that this program would serve all schools in the state, divided into equal quarters. That is, all schools in the state would have the opportunity to compete for the Governor's Reading Award program, and they would be competing against all schools in their respective quartiles. The bill provides for at least four hundred awards statewide. At least one hundred awards would be awarded to schools in each quartile.
