Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the State's process of contracting with outside counsel for litigation services. This report concludes that of the requests for litigation services that the Department of Justice (DOJ) declined in fiscal year 1995-96, a substantial portion were the result of DOJ's determination that it lacked resources to provide the service. Further, consent by the DOJ to use other counsel usually results in departments contracting with outside counsel for litigation services. Nevertheless, the DOJ's decision not to provide services because of insufficient resources is not a statutory basis for contracting for legal services. Further, departments do not use adequate management tools to monitor legal contracts and do not consistently use restrictive contract provisions to help control contract costs.

Members of the Assembly: The Bureau of State Audits presents its Independent Auditors' Report on the State of California's general purpose financial statements for the year ended June 30, 1997. These financial statements are presented on a basis in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). The financial statements show that the State's General Fund spent approximately \$1.7 billion more than it generated in revenues for fiscal year ended June 30, 1997. The General Fund ended the fiscal year with a fund deficit of nearly \$2.5 billion. The GAAP basis statements included all liabilities owed by the State while the budgetary basis statements that are used to report on the State's budget do not reflect all liabilities.

We conducted the audit to comply with the California Government Code, Section 8546.4.

Dear Mr. Speaker: Under the provisions of Rule 104, I request the following statement be entered into the Journal:

On September 9, 1997 I voted on the floor for SB 291 (Appropriations) that satisfied a number of claims against the state. One claim in the bill concerned payment of \$1.93 million from the General Fund to the Attorney General to pay attorney fees in the case of *American Academy of Pediatrics et. Al. v. Daniel E. Lungren* which permanently enjoined the law requiring unemancipated minors to obtain the consent of one parent or a judge before a physician could perform an abortion.

As the sponsor of the original Parental Consent legislation, I would have never knowingly voted to pay the plaintiff's attorney fees in this misguided judicial decision. With the crush of the end of session and the number of differing analyses on the bill, as well as the confusion that results when we in the Legislature try to deliberate on 150 pieces of legislation per night, I unknowingly voted for something that is in direct conflict with all my principles and convictions.
