Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the Kern County Child Protective Services system. This report concludes that the Kern County Department of Human Services' Family Preservation Bureau has management weaknesses at critical points in its child protective process. Additionally, although the Kern County Juvenile Court is generally effective in adjudicating cases of abuse or neglect, it could minimize the negative effects the dependency process has on children by better controlling continuances. Furthermore, a statewide survey of county child protective services agencies indicates that the problems Kern County is experiencing may be prevalent throughout the State. Finally, we find that the California Department of Social Services could help find solutions to these problems by improving its oversight of the State's child welfare services system.
