ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 133—Scott (Senator Peace, coauthor). An act to amend Section 1203.085 of the Penal Code, relating to crimes.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 134—Baca. An act to amend Section 3540.1 of the Government Code, relating to public school employees.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 135—Hertzberg. An act to add Section 14069.5 to the Corporations Code, relating to small business development, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 136-Villaraigosa. An act to repeal Section 53071 of the Government Code, and to amend Section 12026 of the Penal Code, relating to firearms.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 137—Poochigian. An act to add Section 461.5 to the Penal Code, relating to sentencing.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 138—Poochigian (Senators Costa and Maddy, coauthors). An act to amend Sections 6377, 17053.49, and 23649 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 139—Poochigian. An act to amend Section 3058.8 of the Penal Code, relating to parole.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 140—Baca and Floyd. An act to add Chapter 10 (commencing with Section 6725) to Part 1 of Division 5 of the Labor Code, relating to occupational safety and health.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 141—Runner and Pacheco. An act to amend Sections 11055, 11351, 11351.5, 11370.2, 11370.4, 11377, 11378, 11379, 11379.8, and 11383 of, and to add Sections 11377.1, 11378.1, and 11379.1 to, the Health and Safety Code, relating to controlled substances.
