ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 205—Machado. An act to amend Sections 2530.2 and 2534.2 of, to amend and renumber Sections 2538 and 2539 of, and to add Article 7.5 (commencing with Section 2538) to Chapter 5.3 of Division 2 of, the Business and Professions Code, and to amend Section 56363 of the Education Code, relating to speech-language pathology, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 206—Hertzberg. An act to add Chapter 5.1 (commencing with Section 8321) to Division 1 of Title 2 of the Government Code, relating to state government.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 207—Frusetta. An act to amend Section 1054.2 of the Penal Code, relating to criminal procedure.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 208—Migden. An act to amend Section 17039 of, and to add Section 17052.21 to, the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to tax, making an appropriation therefor, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 209—Baca. An act to add and repeal Chapter 2.6 (commencing with Section 1000.10) of Title 6 of Part 2 of the Penal Code, relating to controlled substances, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 210—Hertzberg. An act to amend Section 12308 of the Penal Code, relating to explosive devices.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 211—Baca. An act to amend Section 29550 of the Government Code, relating to booking fees.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 212—Woods. An act to add Section 2085 to the Fish and Game Code, and to add Section 21080.12 to the Public Resources Code, relating to environmental quality.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 213—Wildman (Principal Senate coauthor: Schiff) Havice, Hertzberg, and Scott (Senator Peace, coauthor). An act to amend Section 290 of the Penal Code, relating to sex offenders.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 214—Thomson. An act to add Section 14105.438 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to human services.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 215—Baldwin. An act to add Section 17053.65 to the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 216—Wayne. An act to amend Section 1466 of the Penal Code, relating to criminal procedure.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 217—Firestone (Senator O’Connell, Coauthor). An act to amend Section 14094.3 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to Medi-Cal.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 218—Takasugi. An act to add Section 11515.5 to the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.
