ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 855 (Mazzoni)—An act to add Part 68 (commencing with Section 100400) to the Education Code, relating to education facilities funding, by providing the funds necessary therefor through an election for, and the issuance and sale of, bonds of the State of California and by providing for the handling and disposition of those funds, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
