Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1562

RE: Assembly Bill 1562, Statutes of 1996, Chapter 908

Dear Dotson: It has come to my attention that certain clerical errors have been found in my AB 1562, Statutes of 1996, Chapter 908, relating to community notification of sex offenders. I am writing to clarify this error, as well as the intent of one minor portion of the bill that has caused some confusion of application.

It was my intent in AB 1562 that high risk sex offenders, who are defined in Penal Code section 290, subdivision (n)(1)(A), be defined as follows: "A high risk sex offender is a person who has been convicted of an offense enumerated in Penal Code section 290.4, subdivision (a)(1) and also meets one of the following criteria: . . ."

Due to a clerical error, the legislation erroneously defined a high risk sex offender as "a person who has been convicted of an offense for which registration is required under paragraph (2) of subdivision (a)" of Penal Code section 290, "who also meets one of the following criteria: . . ."

It was my intent in AB 1562 that persons requesting to view the CD-ROM or other electronic media pursuant to Penal Code section 290.4 be allowed to take notes by hand. Thus, the prohibition on "copying" in section 290.4, subdivision (c), was not meant to apply to copying information by hand writing.

In order to correct these errors, I have introduced AB 290. However, as AB 1562 is already operative, a prompt resolution is necessary.
