Members of the Assembly: As required by Chapter 518, Statutes of 1995, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning Los Angeles County's (county) fiscal condition and the status of issues we previously reported.

This report concludes that the county completed its final budget-balancing action for fiscal year 1996–97 by reducing the net county costs of county departments by \$51 million. Also, in January 1997, it opened the Twin Towers jail. Beginning in fiscal year 1997–98, with the passage of Proposition 218 and a September 1995 court ruling regarding Proposition 62, approximately \$110 million in annual county taxes and benefit assessment revenues are in jeopardy. Further, in January 1997, the county initially projected a \$386 million shortfall for its 1997–98 budget; however, it subsequently revised its estimated shortfall to \$212 million. Nevertheless, the county has a history of solving major budget shortfalls and adopting a balanced budget as required by law. Finally, the county is preparing for federal and state welfare reforms, which could have a significant fiscal impact in the future.

Members of the Assembly: As required by Senate Bill 727, Chapter 518, Statutes of 1995, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the impact on the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) of transferring \$50 million to the County of Los Angeles (county). This report concludes that MTA used rail construction funds to replace the \$50 million diverted to the county. Furthermore, MTA budgeted for a slight decline in bus service for 1996–97 compared to 1995–96 actual levels, but increased its funding level for its specialized paratransit services. In addition, the diversion of the \$50 million added to an

existing shortfall of more than \$300 million in funding for MTA's rail construction projects. Finally, if the county is unsuccessful in appealing a recent superior court ruling ordering it to return the \$50 million plus interest to MTA, the impact of Senate Bill 727 will be nullified.
