Members of the Assembly: The Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the Department of Personnel Administration's (department) management of the Savings Plus Program. In a previous investigation, we reported that a state employee at the department stole over \$400,000 held by the State in long-term savings plans. The thefts occurred because the department lacked an adequate system of internal controls. We conducted this follow-up audit to assess the adequacy of the existing system.

This report concludes that the department needs to improve internal controls over long-term savings plans to reduce the risk of theft. Specifically, the department has a number of dormant accounts in the State's 457 deferred compensation plan and 401(k) thrift plan. It also has an inordinate number of dormant accounts in the Part-Time, Seasonal and Temporary employees retirement plan. These dormant accounts are susceptible to theft. In addition, the department has not adequately segregated duties among employees, has minimal requirements for establishing the identity of participants when distributing funds or making changes to accounts, and maintains insufficient security over sensitive participant files. Finally, the department is working with the Department of Finance but has not yet established a funding source to replace the \$400,000 stolen by the state employee.

Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the use of the Habitat Conservation Fund (fund) by the state agencies receiving appropriations from the fund.

This report concludes that the agencies generally complied with the act creating the fund; however, the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy and the State Coastal Conservancy paid \$4.2 million more than necessary to conserve land and did not always comply with state laws. We also conclude that the Wildlife Conservation Board was unable to fulfill the act's spending goals. Finally, the Department of General Services did not adequately protect the State's interest when it agreed to pay \$1.8 million more than the seller paid for the same land and has not provided clear land acquisition guidance to state agencies that acquire conservation land.
