Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the costs related to the fees the Department of Motor Vehicles (department) charges for vehicle registration information. This report concludes that in fiscal year 1989-90, the department overstated its costs for providing registration and

licensing information and has used these costs to establish inequitable fees. Further, because it has not reassessed its costs or revised its fee schedule during the last seven years, the department cannot ensure that its current fees are fair or that they cover the department's costs to deliver information. The report also identifies a few instances when the department did not comply with the law when providing registration and licensing information.
