Members of the Senate: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the California State Department of Transportation's implementation of the recommendations made in the March 10, 1995, interim audit conducted by its Audits and Investigations Division. Specifically, the interim audit evaluated standard agreement number 42K364 between the department and Boster,

Kobayashi and Associates, a firm that is its primary provider of expert witness services for accident reconstruction and investigation.

Our report concludes that while the department has implemented two of the three recommendations for Boster, Kobayashi & Associates and its other expert witness consultants, it has not incorporated a clause in all of its contracts with expert witness consultants that addresses compensation for travel time. Further, the department has not formally adopted procedures to assist its staff in selecting expert witness contractors, or negotiating the rates and terms of the contracts.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I am writing to bring clarification to an issue raised in the Assembly Public Employees, Retirement and Social Security Committee in regard to Senate Bill 1026 by Senator Adam Schiff.

During the July 9, 1997 meeting of the Public Employees, Retirement and Social Security Committee hearing a member of the committee suggested that as a vested member of the State Teachers Retirement System (STRS) that I should recuse myself from voting on Senate Bill 1026 by Senator Schiff. SB 1026 would make certain adjustments to the STRS Supplemental Benefit Maintenance Account for the purpose of restoring purchasing power to retired members, disabled members, and other beneficiaries.

Although prior to the hearing on SB 1026 I had received a verbal opinion from Legislative Counsel which held that my voting on SB 1026 would clearly not constitute a conflict of interest under either the Political Reform Act or the Code of Ethics, I abstained from voting on the measure. Consequently, I have obtained a written opinion from Legislative Counsel, #18128, which reflects counsel's earlier conclusion.

Consequently, any questions regarding the propriety of my service on the Public Employees, Retirement and Social Security Committee or my ability to vote on legislation relative to STRS are clearly answered by Legislative Counsel opinion #18128.
