Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 334

Dear Mr. Wilson: Assembly Bill 334 represents my attempt to facilitate a resolution to the distribution of public safety sales tax revenues between the County of Los Angeles and the cities within that county for the 1996–97 fiscal year, and to provide a methodology for the allocation of those same funds within Los Angeles County for fiscal year 1997–98 and each fiscal thereafter.

To facilitate a retroactive redistribution of 1996–97 public safety tax revenues from Los Angeles County to the cities within that county, a complicated three-year payment schedule of a “reconciliation amount” was established, commencing in fiscal year 1996–97 and ending in fiscal year 1998–99. In each year in which a payment of the reconciliation amount is due, the County is permitted to offset that payment by the “positive growth” occurring in the allocation of the public safety sales tax. Positive growth is the positive difference between the public safety sales tax revenues allocated in the year in which the payment of the reconciliation amount is due less an amount calculated in a specified manner or the amount of public safety sales tax received in the prior year, excluding any revenues attributed to the repayment of the reconciliation amount.

In fiscal years 1997–98 and 1998–99, the County’s payments of the reconciliation amount are due before positive growth can be calculated. It was my intent that the County could apply its positive growth offset against any public safety sales tax revenues allocated to a city within the same fiscal year, whether those allocations are derived from the formula or as payment of a reconciliation amount.

Only in this way is the County able to meet the statutory requirements imposed upon it, while receiving its specified benefits.
