Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 400

Governor's Office, Sacramento September 8, 1997

To the Members of the California Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill No. 400 without my signature:

This bill would revise spousal support provisions. Specifically, the bill would provide that marriages of long duration remain with the Court's discretion and jurisdiction to determine the appropriate spousal support, and these marriages would not be subject to the "one-half the length of marriage" rule. The bill would also eliminate the admonishment the court is required to give recipients of spousal support to make reasonable good faith efforts to become self-supporting.

Current law directs the court to consider specified circumstances in determining spousal support in a dissolution or legal separation action. Among the circumstances under consideration is the goal that the supported party become self-supporting within a reasonable period of time, which is defined as one-half the length of the marriage.

This bill assumes that those recently enacted provisions (SB 509—Calderon, Ch. 1163, statutes of 1996), require the court to automatically terminate spousal support payments after a certain period of time, thereby creating economic hardships for particular recipients. They do no such thing. The law recognizes that a dissolution of marriage presents an anxious and uncertain period, so the statute specifically grants the court discretion to order support for whatever period of time is necessary. Self-support within a reasonable period of time should be the goal of the supported party, but that is only one factor, among many others, to be considered by the court in ordering spousal support. In every instance the court is required to determine what is equitable based upon the particular circumstances of the case.

Likewise, the admonition required to be given by the court in specific instances is not an ultimatum, but a fair and reasonable advisement of the goal of this state that each party should make sincere efforts to become self-supporting as soon as practicable.
