Proclamation

Executive Department
State of California

WHEREAS, An extraordinary occasion has arisen and now exists requiring that the Legislature of the State of California be convened in extraordinary session, now therefore,

I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested by Section 9 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of California, do hereby convene the Legislature of the State of California to meet in extraordinary session at Sacramento, California, on the thirtieth day of March, 1964, at 12 noon of said day for the following purpose and to legislate upon the following subject:

To consider and act upon the Budget Bill for the succeeding fiscal year and revenue acts necessary therefor.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this twenty-fifth day of March, 1964.

House Resolution No. 1

Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, As follows:

(1) That those persons elected as officers of the Assembly for the 1964 First Extraordinary Session shall serve also in their same positions as officers of the Assembly for the 1964 Second Extraordinary Session.

(2) That notwithstanding the provision of Assembly Rule 10 relating to the selection of members of the Standing Committee on Rules, the members of the Standing Committee on Rules for the 1964 Second Extraordinary Session shall be the same as those on the Assembly Interim Committee on Rules immediately prior to the convening of this session.

(3) That the Temporary Rules of the 1964 Regular (Budget) Session be and the same are hereby adopted as the Temporary Rules for the 1964 Second Extraordinary Session.

(4) That the Chief Clerk or the Sergeant at Arms be and they are hereby authorized to receipt to the Controller for all warrants for the payment of Members' Officers and Attachés of the Assembly.

(5) That the Chief Clerk is authorized to receive from the Members of the Assembly a mailing list of Histories and Legislative Digests to be directed to libraries,

clubsets of committee and other public centers, and to individuals for general inspection. This list is to be limited to ten (10) names each and shall be forwarded to the Legislative Bill Room for regular mailing. No Member shall include on the list any state department or employee thereof except state colleges and universities. The Chief Clerk is further authorized to place accredited newspaper representatives on the regular mailing list as well as the Attorney General, the Office of the Legislative Counsel, and the Governor's Office. No additional mailing list shall be allowed or authorized unless the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15) each is paid therefor to the State Printer, which sum shall be credited to legislative printing and accounted for to the Legislature.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act, on July 1, 1964, there is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Military Department, for capital outlay, the amount that reverts to the General Fund as of June 30, 1964 from the appropriation made by the provisions of Section 10.7 of the Budget Act of 1963, which shall be available for expenditure until June 30, 1965 for major construction, improvements and equipment, Military Department and in addition thereto any grants made available by the federal government, provided, no expenditure shall be made from this appropriation until receipt of assurances satisfactory to the Department of Finance that the federal government will reimburse the State for the federal share of the cost of construction, to be expended for armories located in the following areas: Benicia, Newark."

The location designation in the above schedule shall be liberally construed so as to include any location within 10 miles of a city or town named therein.

In addition to any other money provided therefor, not to exceed fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) of the amount appropriated by Items 4 and 8 of Section 2 of this act for the contingent expenses of the Senate and Assembly may be expended for the expenses of the Citizens Advisory Commission, and its members, appointed by the Joint Committee on Legislative Organization to assist the committee in its studies of revision of the California Constitution, to be paid from the Senate and Assembly Contingent Funds, equally and disbursed, after certification by the chairman of the Joint Committee on Legislative Organization, upon warrants drawn by the State Controller upon the State Treasurer."

Executive Orders—No. 896

Dear Mr. Porter: You have asked three questions in respect to executive orders issued by the Governor:

Question No. 1

What information is available on the history of executive orders issued by California's Governors?

Opinion and Analysis No 1

We have found very little information on the subject. Governors' messages to state agencies are not printed and distributed in the manner of the state laws. We are informed by the Government Publications Section of the State Library that in 1952 a plan to issue statements of general policy in some sort of series was considered, but that no definite action was taken. The only executive orders of the Governor that the State Library has on file are an order of September 26, 1942 concerning the use of state-owned automobiles, and an order of July 10, 1951 creating a special crime study commission on organized crime.

Question No 2

Under what authority may a Governor issue an executive order?

Opinion and Analysis No 2

There is no constitutional or statutory provision expressly authorizing the Governor to issue "executive orders." There are a number of provisions empowering him to take action which would involve an official order, such as calling forth the militia (Const., Art. VIII, Sec. 1), granting pardons (Const., Art. VII, Sec. 1), convening the Legislature in special session (Const., Art. V, Sec. 9), and filling certain vacancies in office by appointment (Const., Art. V, Sec. 8). Aside from particular instances such as these, his chief authority derives from the constitutional provisions conferring the supreme executive power on the Governor (Const., Art. V, Sec. 1), and providing that he shall transact all executive business with the officers of the government (Const., Art. V, Sec. 6), and see that the laws are faithfully executed (Const., Art. V, Sec. 7).

This power is recognized in the statutes providing that the civil administration of the laws of the State is vested in the Governor (Gov. C., Sec. 11150), and that it is his duty to supervise the official conduct of all executive and ministerial officers, and to see that all offices are filled and their duties performed (Gov. C., Secs. 12010, 12011). Under this authority, the Governor, like other administrators, may direct certain action to be taken to promote the purposes of legislation and carry it into effect, although in so doing he may not vary or enlarge the terms or conditions of the legislation (See *Knudsen Creamery Co. of Calif. v. Brock* (1951), 37 Cal. 2d 485).

Question No 3

Are there any provisions of law relating to the recall or rescission of executive orders?

Opinion and Analysis No 3

No. However, there is nothing to prevent the Governor, under the same authority by which he may issue an order to a state administrative agency, from countermanding a previous order or superseding it by a new order. Of course, such orders must also be consistent with statutory law.

Opinion and Analysis

It is of course basic that state policy is declared by the Legislature by the enactment of statutes and the role of the executive branch of state government is to put such policy into effect or to administer such policy The legislative and administrative roles have been expressed as follows

“It is the function of the Legislature to declare a policy and fix the primary standard To promote the purposes of the legislation and carry it into effect, the authorized administrative or ministerial officer may ‘fill up the details’ by prescribing administrative rules and regulations (*First Industrial Loan Co v Daugherty*, 26 Cal 2d 545, 549 [159 P 2d 921]), but as so empowered, he may not ‘vary or enlarge the terms or conditions of [the] legislative enactment’ (*Boone v Kingsbury*, 206 Cal 148, 161 [273 P 797]; also *Whitcomb Hotel, Inc v California Emp Com*, 24 Cal 2d 753, 757 [151 P 2d 233, 135 A L R 405]) or ‘compel that to be done which lies without the scope of the statute’ (*First Industrial Loan Co v Daugherty*, supra, p 550)” (*Knudsen Creamery Co v Brock* (1951), 37 Cal 2d 485, 492-493)

However, as we understand your question, you are not so much interested in the establishment of the official policy of the State (ie by the enactment of a provision of law) as you are interested in the process of proposing policy or in representing to the federal government what policies and plans the State desires it to implement

Clearly the Legislature, acting as representatives of the people of the State, can express itself on policies which it desires to be adopted by the federal government by the passage of a joint resolution A joint resolution does not, of course, establish the official policy of the State

We also believe that the Governor has the power to express himself on matters of interest to the people of the State, including proposals relating to water policy being considered by the federal government (see Sec 12012, Gov C which provides that he “ is the sole official organ of communication between the government of this State and the government of the United States ” Such expressions do not constitute official state policy any more than does the enactment of a joint resolution

Also we believe that other people in the executive branch of the state government concerned with administration of state water laws may express themselves on matters relating to the adoption of water policies

We note that the Department of Water Resources has considerable statutory authority to express its views on water policy proposals. The following provisions of the State Water Resources Law of 1945 (Sec 12570 et seq, Wat C) are in point. The department is authorized to participate in conferences or hearings with interested parties of this State or any other state, or with the Congress of the United States, congressional committees or officials of the federal government, concerning water projects, plans or problems (Sec 12602, Wat C). The department is to keep itself informed as to federal activities, requirements or procedures affecting a proposed water project within the scope of the State Water Resources Law of 1945 (Sec 12603, Wat C). As to any matter involving the federal government, which is in the scope of the power and duties of the department, the department may represent the interests of the State (Sec 12604, Wat C). The department may conduct investigations of water resources of the State and formulate plans for the control, conservation, protection and utilization of such water resources (Sec 12616, Wat C).

Dear Mr Stevens: You have asked us to assume that the following section is contained in A B 1 of the 1964 Second Extraordinary Session:

"SEC 325 Notwithstanding the provisions of any appropriation of state funds made in the Welfare and Institutions Code for the public assistance programs specified in the following schedule, expenditures of state funds for those programs for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965, shall not ex-

ceed, in the aggregate, the sum of three hundred fifty million nine hundred sixty-one thousand eight hundred dollars (\$350,961,800).

"The Department of Social Welfare, subject to the limit placed on aggregate expenditures by this section, may transfer funds between the programs specified in the following schedule, when the need appears, but shall, subject to the provisions of this section, limit expenditures to the total of the following schedule:

(a) Aid to the Blind	\$10,579,100
(b) Aid to Potentially Self-Supporting Blind	369,600
(c) Aid to the Disabled	48,206,800
(d) Aid to Families with Dependent Children	105,585,500
(e) Old Age Security	162,427,200
(f) Medical Assistance for the Aged	23,793,600

Total of Schedule\$350,961,800

"The Department of Social Welfare shall administer the public assistance programs specified in this section so that the counties will bear no more than the amount of welfare costs that they would be obligated to bear under the applicable provisions of the Welfare and Institutions Code, without the expenditure limitations set forth herein, and so that the amount authorized to be expended under this section shall fully cover the State's share of aid payments and for services under such programs for the 1964-65 fiscal year.

"The limitations on amounts imposed by this section shall apply to any amounts which are determined by the Director of Finance to be necessary to meet increases in cost arising out of approvals made by the Department of Finance pursuant to the provisions contained in Item 186.

"Provided further that the Director of Finance is authorized to approve expenditures in those amounts made necessary by changes in either caseload or payments, or both, unrelated to any change in rule or regulation adopted during the current fiscal year except those rules and regulations necessary to implement 1963 legislation, which are in excess of Budget Bill estimates for 1964-65. Not later than the fifth day following the submission of the Governor's Budget in the 1965 Regular Session of the Legislature the Director of Finance shall report to the Legislature the amount, if any, by which the current estimate of expenditures for public assistance programs in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965 will exceed the limitation on aggregate expenditures in this section. At such time the amount of the limitation shall be increased by the amount of such excess unless and until otherwise provided by law."

You have asked various questions concerning the above section, which we will discuss in series.

Question No 1

If the Governor eliminates all of the amounts specified in the quoted section would any money be available for the various public assistance programs set forth in the Welfare and Institutions Code

Opinion No 1

While there is no case on this point, we believe that it would not be safe to conclude that if the Governor takes such action there would be any money available for the support of these programs for the 1964-65 fiscal year

Analysis No 1

At the present time the various welfare aid programs are financed through continuing appropriations contained in the Welfare and Institutions Code These appropriations are not limited as to total amount (W & I C, Secs 1510, 2021, 3025, 3420) For example, Section 2021 appropriates money to support aged persons who qualify under the Old Age Security Law, sufficient to pay six-sevenths of each aid grant

The section quoted above would place in the Budget Bill an appropriation for the 1964-1965 fiscal year of a fixed amount for each aid program which would control and limit the statutory appropriation during the 1964-1965 fiscal year The section makes it clear that it is the intention of the Legislature that the amount therein appropriated be in lieu of the statutory appropriation Thus the section states "Notwithstanding the provisions of any appropriation of state funds made in the Welfare and Institutions Code for the public assistance programs", the expenditures for these programs shall not exceed the sum specified in the section Section 2 of the Budget Bill makes this clear when it states

"Whenever by constitutional or statutory provision the revenues or receipts of any institution, department, board, bureau, commission, officer, employee, or other agency, or any moneys in any special fund created by law therefor, are to be used for salaries, support or any proper purpose, expenditures shall be made therefrom for any such purposes to the extent only of the amount herein appropriated, unless otherwise stated herein, or authorized pursuant to Section 11006, Government Code."

It has been held by the courts that a special fund continuing appropriation can be limited during any fiscal year to the amount provided for in the Budget Act for the particular purpose if the intention is expressed in the Budget Bill (*Railroad Commission v Riley* (1923), 192 Cal 54, 59; *Board of Fish and Game Commissioners v. Riley* (1924), 194 Cal. 37).

It could be argued that the effect of the Governor in eliminating the amount in question would be to remove any restriction on the continuing statutory appropriation However, the effect of such a conclusion would be to empower the Governor to increase an appropriation made in the Budget Bill when clearly the intention of the Legislature was to limit the continuing appropriation. Also the Constitution does not purport to give the Governor any power to increase an appropriation.

Section 16 of Article IV of the Constitution, as amended in 1908, provides, in part, that as to any bill containing several items of appropriation of money, the Governor may object to one or more items while approving other portions of the bill.

Section 34 of the same article, which section was added in 1922 and provided for our present Budget Bill, authorizes the Governor to "reduce or eliminate" any one or more items of appropriation in any appropriation bill passed by the Legislature while approving other portions of the bill.

The 1922 ballot pamphlet points out that one purpose of the amendment was to give the Governor power to "reduce an appropriation" since under the then existing law the Governor could only veto an entire appropriation act. Clearly it was not intended that the Governor be given any power to increase appropriations.

In view of the clearly expressed intention of the Legislature in the Budget Bill that the quoted section operate in lieu of the statutory appropriations for public welfare purposes and in view of the restriction on the Governor's veto power of a budget item to a reduction or elimination of items of appropriation, it appears quite possible to us that if the Governor strikes out the various amounts contained in the section he would thereby be reducing the amounts available during the next fiscal year for the various public welfare programs, to zero.

Question No 2

Could the Governor merely delete the next to last paragraph of the item?

Opinion and Analysis No 2

The Governor's power under Sections 16 and 34 of Article IV of the Constitution is limited to the reduction or elimination of "items of appropriation." He is given no power to veto other provisions or conditions of an appropriation bill. In an opinion of this office published in the Assembly Journal for December 20, 1949, following page 364, we concluded that the Governor could not eliminate a condition or restriction on an appropriation. We adhere to this conclusion.

The provision referred to is not an item of appropriation but is rather a condition. Therefore, in our opinion the Governor cannot eliminate this provision.

Question No 3

If the Governor deletes one of the subdivisions in the schedule contained in the section, would this increase the amount of the remaining subdivisions?

Opinion and Analysis No 3

Under the second paragraph of the section the Department of Social Welfare is given power to transfer funds between the programs specified in the schedule provided therein, but it is required to limit expenditures to the total of the schedule.

If the Governor eliminates one of the subdivisions of the schedule, but without reducing the total amount appropriated, it appears to us that in view of the second paragraph the effect would be to permit the Department of Social Welfare to transfer the amount deleted from

the particular subdivision but remaining in the total amount appropriated, to one of the other programs in the remaining subdivisions

Gentlemen - This letter constitutes an expression of the intent of the Committee on Conference on Assembly Bill No 1 as amended in Senate May 14, 1964, Second Extraordinary Session, and may be regarded as an addendum to the Report of the Committee on Conference

During the Second Extraordinary Session it was disclosed before hearings of the Senate Finance Committee and the Assembly Ways and Means Committee that there existed a surplus in the appropriations made in the 1963 session for salary increases applicable during the 1963-64 and 1964-65 fiscal years. This surplus totaled \$1 million. In calculating the amount of General Fund surplus available for expenditure in 1964-65, the Committee on Conference intended that this \$1 million should revert to the General Fund and thus be available for other expenditure purposes in the 1964-65 fiscal year.

The committee has authorized the signatories to this letter to express this statement of intent with the further understanding that the Joint Legislative Budget Committee should be instructed to obtain from the Director of Finance a report verifying the actions taken to effect such reversion.

Gentlemen. Rather than take excessive time on the floor to outline a position regarding the Budget which, in a practical sense, would have had no immediate effect on the final vote, I have decided to use this means to bring to the attention of the Members of the Assembly a condition, which I believe to be most critical in the immediate future, and which deserves the most serious consideration on the part of every Member next year, as it relates to fiscal matters in the State of California.

Between now and 1970 the school population in the State of California will grow from its present four million to more than six million. In that same six-year period, the State of California will spend more in capital outlay and operational funds than it has spent since the beginning of the century until now. An increasingly large part of that total amount of money will be spent in higher education.

It is to this particular segment of the education finance picture that I now draw your attention. Governor Brown has already indicated that a tidal wave of students is beginning to inundate higher education here in California. In my mind, the expression "tidal wave" is inaccurate, only in that it implies that there will be a recession from the high water level of the ordinary tidal wave. There will be no slackening of the "high water mark" of students in higher education, once it has been achieved.

Since this is the case, it seems obvious to me that, in view of such imminent danger of destruction of the futures of many of our younger students and their hopes for higher education, we should do everything we can to make sure that this new increased pressure is contained. That is, we as a Legislature should make sure that our youngsters actually have a school in which they can get the basic education they need. This should become our primary policy as a Legislature. In my mind, this is not the policy of the Legislature, nor of the Governor, nor of the Coordinating Council for Higher Education at the present time.

In order to rectify this situation, it is necessary to change our present policy in two specific ways:

1. We must change the proportion of money used for capital outlay purposes between the state college system and the University of California. This is not an easy suggestion to make, and I realize the significance of my suggestion, but I see no alternative if we keep our attention focused on that tidal wave. We simply cannot ignore the problem which faces us.

2. I believe it will be a disaster of the most serious consequence to continue our policy of site acquisition for construction of campuses for higher education purposes after it has been determined that a particular area in the State has reached a density of population which forces the construction of a college or university campus.

No school board could remain in office very long with such a policy. The cost in increased property value for such a shortsighted policy has already cost the State the equivalent of many new buildings and facilities, and I would guess that it might even amount to the total cost of one or more complete campuses for higher education facilities in the State.

We are about to adjourn. The Legislature can do nothing more between now and next year on this question, and perhaps it is well that this is so. I urge you, indeed, I beseech you to consider this problem with the deliberation and concern worthy of the tradition of this deliberative body. By January I hope you will reach conclusions similar to mine, and I urge you to join in taking whatever action seems appropriate at that time.
