Dear Mr Porter What are the respective roles of the Legislature and the executive branch of State Government with reppect to makng water policy? You state that you are particularly interested in the presentation of positions to the federal government

It is of course basie that state policy is declared by the Legrislature by the enactment of statutes and the role of the executive branch of state govermment is to put such policy into effect or to admunster such policy The legislative and admmostrative roles have been expressed as follows
"It is the function of the Legiclature to declare a polacy
and fix the primary standard To promote the purposes of
the legislation and carry it into effect, the authormed admin-
intrative or mumsterial officer may 'fill up the detals' by
prescribug admustiative rules and requations (First Ju-
dustral Loan Co v Danghrrty, 26 Cal 2 - 545, 549 [159 P
2 2 921]), but as so empowered, he may not 'valy or enlarge
the terms or conditions of [the] legslative enactment'
(Boone v Kengsbury, $206 \mathrm{Cal} 148,161$ [273 P 797]; also
Whatcomb Hotel, Inc v Calffornu Emp Cam, 24 Cal $3 d$
753,757 (151 P $2 d 233,155$ A LR 40.']) nx compel that to
be done which lies without the scope of the statute' (First

However, d wo understand your question, you are not so moch interected m the establinhment of the offical policy of the State (ie by the enactment of a provision of law) at a ou are interested in the process of proposing policy or in representing to the federal government what policies and plans the State desires it to mplement

Cleaty the Legrslature, acting as repocontatives of the people of the State, can expres itself on poliries which it desures to be adopted by the federal gosernment by the passage of a jomt resolution a jount resolution does not, of culure, eqtablish the official policy of the State

We also believe that the Governor has the power to express himself on matters of interest to the people of the State, muluding proposals relating to watei policy beng considered by the federal government (see Sec 12019, Gov C which provides that he " is the sole official organ of communation between the govermment of this State and the government of the Unted States" Such expressions do not constitute official state policy anv more than does the pmactment of a jomt resolution

Also we beleve that other people in the executive branch of the state government concerned with admmotration of state water laws may express themselves on matters relating to the adoption of water policies

We note that the Deparment of Water Resonres has considerable statutory authority to express its views on water policy proposals The following proviswons of the State Water Resources Law of 1945 (Sec 12570 et seq, Wat () are in point The department is authorized to particopate m conferences or hearng, with interested parties of this State or any uther state, or with the Congzesy of the United States, congressional commuttees or offichats of the federal gosernment, concermug water projects, plans or problems (Ser $12602, \mathrm{Wa}_{\mathrm{d}} \mathrm{C}$ ). The department is to keep atself miformed as to federal activities, refurements or procedures aftecting a proposed water project within the scope of the State Water Resources Law of 1945 (See 12603, Wat C) As to any matter involving the federal govemment, which is in the scope of the power and duties of the department, the department may lepresent the interests of the State (Sec 12604, Wat C) The department may conduct mestagations of water tesources of the State and formulate plans for the contiol conservation. protection and utilization of such water resources (Sec 12616 Wat (C)

"The limitations on annouts moposed by this section shall apply to any amounts which are ceteumned by the Director of Finance to be necessary to mept meleases in cost arisimg out of approvals made by the Department of Fimance pursuant to the provisions contaned in Iteni 186

## Aualysts $\mathrm{N}_{\mathrm{B}} 1$

At the present time the various welfare aid programs are financed through continuing appropriations contamed in the Welfare and Institutions Code These appropriations are not limited as to total amount (W \& I C, Secs 1510, 2021, 3025, 3420) For example, Section 2021 appropriates money to support aged persons who qualify under the Old Age Securty Law, sufficient to pay six-sevenths of each aid grant

The section quoted above would place in the Budget Bill an appropriation for the 1964-1965 fiscal year of a fixed amount for each aid program which would control and limit the statutory appropriation during the 1964-1965 fiseal year The section makes it clear that it is the intention of the Legıslature that the amount therein appropriated be in lieu of the statutory appropriation Thus the section states "Notwithstanding the provisions of any appropriation of state funds made in the Welfare and Institutions Code for the public assistance programs', the expenditures for these programs shall not exceed the sum specified in the section Section 2 of the Budget Bill makes this clear when it states
"Whenever by constitutional or statutory provision the revenues or receipts of any institution, department, board, bureau, commssion, officer, employee, or other agency, or any moneys on any special fund created by law therefor, are to be used for salaries, support or any proper purpose, expenditures shall be made therefrom for any such purposes to the extent only of the amount herein appropriated, unless otherwise stated herem, or authorized pursuant to Section 11006, Government Code."
It has been held by the courts that a special fund continuing appropriation can be limited during any fiscal year to the amount provided for in the Budget Act for the particular purpose of the intention is expressed in the Budget Bill (Ralroad Commasson 5 Raley (1923),

- $192 \mathrm{Cal} \mathrm{54}, \mathrm{59;} \mathrm{Board} \mathrm{of} \mathrm{Fish} \mathrm{and} \mathrm{Game} \mathrm{Commisszoners} \mathrm{v}$. (1924), 194 Cal . 37 ).

It could be argued that the effect of the Governor in elmmating the amount in question would be to remove any restriction on the continuing statutory appropriation However, the effect of such a conclusion would be to empower the Governor to merease an appropriation made in the Budget Bill when clearly the intention of the Legislature was to limit the continuing appropriation. Also the Constitution does not purport to give the Governor, any power to increase an appropriation.

Section 16 of Axticle IV of the Constitution, as amended in 1908, provides, in part, that as to any bill contanng several items of appropriation of money, the Governor may object to one or more items whale approving other portions of the bill

Section 34 of the same article, which section was added mi 1922 and provided for our present Budget Bill, authorszes the Governor to "reduce or elimmate" any one or more items of appropriation in any appropriation bull passed by the Legislature while approving other portions of the bill

The 1922 ballot pamphlet points out that one purpose of the amendment was to give the Governor power to "reduce an appropriation" since under the then existing law the Governor could only veto an entire appropration act Clearly it was not intended that the Governor be given any power to merease appropriations

In view of the clearly expressed intention of the Legslature in the Budget Bill that the quoted section operate in lieu of the statutory appropriations for public welfare purposes'and in view of the restriction on the Governor's veto power of a budget item to a reduction or elimination of items of appropriation, it appears quite possible to us that if the Governor strikes out the various amomats contained in the section he would thereby be reducing the amonnts available during the next fiscal year for the various public welfare programs, to zero

## Opinion and Analysas No 2

The Governor's power under Sections 16 and 34 of Article IV of the Constitution is limsted to the reduction or elmmation of "items of appropriation" He ss given no power to veto other prorisions or conditions of an appropriation bill $\ln$ an opmion of this office published in the Assembly Jounal for December 50, 1949, followng page 364, we concluded that the Governor could not elımmate a condition or restriction on an appropriation We adhere to this conclusion.

The provision referred to is not an Item of appropriation but is rather a condition Therefore, in our opinon the Govermor cannot eliminate this provision

## Opinion and Analysts No $s$

Under the second paragraph of the section the Department of Social Welfare 1 s given power to transfer funds between the programs specified in the schedule provided therem, but it is required to Imit expenditures to the total of the schedule

If the Governor eliminates one of the subdivisions of the schedule, but without reducing the total amount appropiated, it appears to us that in view of the second paragraph the effect would be to permit the Deparment of Soeal Welfare to transfer the mount deleted from
the partucular subdivsion but remanme in the total amount appropriated, to one of the other purarams in the remaming subdivisions

## Speaker Jesse M Dnruh and <br> Members of the Assembly State Capitol, Sacramento

Gentlemen. Rather than take excessive time on the floor to outlune a position regarding the Budget which, im a practical sense, would have had no immediate effect on the final vote, I have decided to use this means to hring to the attention of the Memhers of the Assembly a condition, which I believe to he most critical in the immediate future. and which deserves the most serious consideration on the part of every Member next year, as it relates to fiscal matters in the State of California

Between mow and 1970 the school population in the State of California will grow from its present forr mullion to more than sux mullion In that same six-year perind, the State of ('ahfornia will spend more in capital outlay and operational funds than it has spent sunce the begmuinc of the century untal mow An increasingly large part of that total amount of mones will be spent in higher education

It is to this particular semment of the education finance picture that I now draw your attention Governor Brown has already indicated that a fidal wave of students is beginning to mundate hogher edneation here in California In my mme, the expression "tidal wave" is inaccurate, only in that it implies that there will be a recession from the high water level of the ordinary tidal wave There will be no slackening of the "high water mark" of students in higher education, once it has been achieved

Since this is the case, it seems whwors to me that, in veew of such mminent danger of deatristion ot the futures of namy of our younger students and their hopen tom higher edueation, we hould do evere thang we can to make sure that the new motedsed plessure is contaned That 1s, we as a Legrotatme shouln mork: unre that our pomgsters actually have a sthool in which they ian ent the base education thry need This should become one primary policy as a Legislature In my mond, this in not the policy of the Legislatmer, nor of the Governor, nor of the Coordinating Council for Gigher Eituation at the present time

In order to rectify thes situatwo, it is necessary to change our present policy in two specific was

1 We must change the proportion of money used for capital outlay purposes between the state rollege $s$, tem and the Univeraty of Californua This is not an easy suggestion to make, and I realize the significance of my suggestion, but I see no alten native if we keep our attention focused on that tidal wave We simply eannot ignore the problem whech faces us

2 I believe it wall be a disaster of the most serons consequence to contanue our pulicy of site aecurition for construction of campnee for higher education purposes aftel it has been detelmmed that in particnlar area $m$ the State has reached a dennty of population wheh forces the construction of a college of unversity campus

No school board conld reman in office very long with such a policy The eost in mereased proneity value for such a shortsighted policy has already cost the State the equivalent of many new buldings and facilities, and I would guess that it might even amount to the total cost of one or more cumplete campuses for hagler education fachitios me State

We are about to adjourn The Legslature can do unthing more between now and next year on this question, and perhaps it is well that this is so I urge you, indeed. I beseech you to eumsider this problem with the delberation and concern worthy of the tradition of this dehiberative body. By January I hope you will reach conclusions similar to mine, and I urge you to jom in takng whatever action seems appropriate at that tume
