WHEREAS, An extraordinary occasion has arisen and now exists requiring that the Legslature of the State of California be convened in extraordinary session; now, therefore,

I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of Cahforna, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested by Section 9 of Article $V$ of the Constitution of the State of Californa, do hereby convene the Legrslature of the State of Callfornia to meet in extraordinary session at Sacramento, Californio, on the fifth day of April, 1966, at $11: 00 \mathrm{AM}$. of said day for the following purpose and to legislate upon the following subject:
To consider and act upon the Budget Bill for the succeeding fiscal year and revenue acts necessary therefor.
