Dear Mr Speaker I voted in support of SB 1 since in my opinion it is essential that we resolve the problem of employer-employee relationships in agriculture. I have reservations about the legislation and specifically whether it is going to be fair to all the people. The measure, however, is supported by most agricultural organizations and opposed actively by none. It is supported by all segments of organized labor. It

is probably the best we can do under the circumstances

I regret that the majority party and the Governor have not given the public a longer period of time to digest the full implications of this legislation. Over my objections on the floor of the Assembly all normal rules were waived and the bill was considered by legislative committees with little input available from the individuals who are being affected. It is true that the organizations representing the special interests were given an opportunity to evaluate the measure However, I feel that it would have been wiser to delay implementation of this measure for a month or so, so that the average citizen would have an opportunity to evaluate how this legislation will affect his family's life

It is anticipated that with the passage of this bill, church and union leaders will consider the use of the secondary boycott obsolete and will withdraw their organized support against California farm products.
