PROCLAMATION

Executive Department
State of California

WHEREAS, an extraordinary occasion has arisen and now exists requiring that the Legislature of the State of California be convened in extraordinary session;

Now, therefore, I, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Section 3(b) of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of California, do hereby convene the Legislature of the State of California, on the sixth day of December, 1982, at 12:00 o'clock noon to address the major problems facing the State by legislating on the following subjects:

- Item No. 1 To consider and act upon fiscal legislation required by the severe national economic recession.
- Item No. 2 To consider and act upon legislation relative to the structure and functions of state government agencies and commissions.
- Item No. 3 To consider and act upon legislation relative to reapportionment.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this 6th day of December, 1982.

an inhabitant of that district as revised and renumbered
by this act.

SEC. 5. If any provision of Section 4 or the
application thereof to any person or circumstances is held
invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions
or applications of the act which can be given effect
without the invalid provision or application, and to this
end the provisions of Section 4 are severable from the
other provisions of this act.

SECTION 1. Section 6459 of the Revenue and
Taxation Code is amended to read:

6459. The board for good cause may extend for
not to exceed one month the time for making any return or
paying any amount required to be paid under this part.
The extension may be granted at any time provided a
request therefor is filed with the board within or prior
to the period for which the extension may be granted.

Any person to whom an extension is granted shall
pay, in addition to the tax, interest at the adjusted
annual rate and by the method established pursuant to
Section 19269 from the date on which the tax would have
been due without the extension until the date of payment.

SEC. 2. Section 6471 of the Revenue and

Taxation Code is amended to read:

6471. (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b),
upon written notification by the board, any person whose
estimated measure of tax liability under this part
averages one hundred thousand dollars (\$17,000) or more per
month, as determined by the board, shall, without regard
to the amount of tax in any one month, prepay not less
than 40 25 percent of the amount of state and local tax
liability for each of the first two monthly periods of
each quarterly period. Persons engaged in their present
business during all of the corresponding quarterly period
of the preceding year, or persons who are successors to a
business which was in operation during all of that
quarterly period, may satisfy the above prepayment
requirement by payment of an amount equal to one-third of
the measure of tax liability reported on the return or
returns filed for that quarterly period of the preceding
year multiplied by the state and local tax rate in effect
during the month for which the prepayment is made.
Prepayment shall be made during the quarterly period
designated by the board and during each succeeding
quarterly period until further notified in writing by the
board.

(b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), upon
written notification by the board, any person whose
estimated measure of tax liability under this part
averages two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) or more
per month, as determined by the board, shall, without
regard to the measure of tax in any one month, make the
following prepayments:

(1) In the first, third, and fourth calendar
quarters, the person shall prepay not less than 40 25
percent of the amount of state and local tax liability for
each of the first two monthly periods of each quarterly
period.

(2) In the second calendar quarter, the person
shall prepay a first prepayment of 40 25 percent of the
amount of state and local tax liability for the first
monthly period of each quarterly period and a second
prepayment of either:

(i) 40 25 percent of the amount of state and
local tax liability for the second monthly period of the
quarterly period plus 90 percent of the amount of state
and local tax liability for the first 15 days of the third
monthly period of the quarterly period; or

(ii) 40 25 percent of the amount of state and
local tax liability for the second monthly period of the

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quarterly period plus 50 percent of 80 ~~25~~ percent of the amount of the liability for the second monthly period of the quarterly period.

Persons engaged in their present business during all of the corresponding quarterly period of the preceding year, or persons who are successors to a business which was in operation during all of that quarterly period, may satisfy the above prepayment requirements for the first, third, and fourth calendar quarters by payment of an amount equal to one-third of the measure of tax liability reported on the return or returns filed for that quarterly period of the preceding year multiplied by the state and local tax rate in effect during the month for which the prepayment is made.

The persons may satisfy their prepayment requirements for the second calendar quarter by making a first prepayment of an amount equal to one-third of the measure of tax liability reported, and a second prepayment of an amount equal to one-half of the measure of tax liability reported, on the returns or returns filed for that quarterly period of the preceding year multiplied by the state and local tax rate in effect during the month for which the prepayment is made.

Prepayments shall be made during the quarterly periods designated by the board and during each succeeding quarterly period until further notified in writing by the board.

(c) This section shall become operative on May 1, 1983, only if Section 6471.5 is repealed as of that date.

SEC. 3. Section 6477 of the Revenue and Taxation Code is amended to read:

6477. Any person required to make a prepayment pursuant to Section 6471 who fails to make a prepayment before the last day of the monthly period following the quarterly period in which the prepayment became due and who files a timely return and payment for the quarterly period in which the prepayment became due shall pay a penalty of 6 percent of the amount equal to 80 ~~25~~ percent of the tax liability for each of the monthly periods during that quarterly period for which a required prepayment was not made.

SEC. 4. Section 6482 of the Revenue and Taxation Code is amended to read:

6482. The amount of the determination, exclusive of penalties, shall bear interest at the adjusted annual rate and by the ~~method~~ established

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pursuant to Section 19269 from the last day of the month following the quarterly period for which the amount or any portion thereof should have been returned until the date of payment.

SEC. 5. Section 6513 of the Revenue and Taxation Code is amended to read:
6513. The amount of the determination, exclusive of penalties, shall bear interest at the adjusted annual rate and by the ~~method~~ established pursuant to Section 19269 from the last day of the month following the quarterly period for which the amount or any portion thereof should have been returned until the date of payment.

SEC. 6. Section 6591 of the Revenue and Taxation Code is amended to read:

6591. Any person who fails to pay any tax to the state or any amount of tax required to be collected and paid to the state, except amounts of determinations made by the board under Article 2 (commencing with Section 6481) or Article 3 (commencing with Section 6511) of this chapter, within the time required shall pay a penalty of 10 percent of the tax or amount of the tax, in addition to the tax or amount of tax, plus interest at the adjusted annual rate and by the ~~method~~ established pursuant to Section 19269 from the date on which the tax or the amount of tax required to be collected became due and payable to the state until the date of payment.

SEC. 7. Section 6907 of the Revenue and Taxation Code is amended to read:

6907. Interest shall be paid upon any overpayment of any amount of tax at the adjusted annual rate and by the ~~method~~ established pursuant to Section 19269 from the last day of the calendar month following the quarterly period for which the overpayment was made; but no refund or credit shall be made of any interest imposed upon the person making the overpayment with respect to the amount being refunded or credited.

The interest shall be paid:

(a) in the case of a refund, to the last day of the calendar month following the date upon which the person making the overpayment, if he has not already filed a claim, is notified by the board that a claim may be filed or the date upon which the claim is approved by the board, whichever date is the earlier.

(b) in the case of a credit, to the same date as that to which interest is computed on the tax or amount against which the credit is applied.

SEC. 8. Section 8936 of the Revenue and Taxation Code is amended to read:
8936. In any judgment, interest shall be allowed at the adjusted annual rate and by the authority established pursuant to Section 19269 upon the amount found to have been illegally collected from the date of payment of the amount to the date of allowance of credit on account of the judgment or to a date preceding the date of the refund warrant by not more than 30 days, the date to be determined by the board.

SEC. 9. Section 19062.11 of the Revenue and Taxation Code is amended to read:
19062.11. (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), if any overpayment of tax imposed by this part is refunded or credited within 90 days after the return is filed, or within 90 days after the last day prescribed for filing the return of such tax (determined without regard to any extension of time for filing the return), whichever is later, no interest shall be allowed under Section 19062 on such overpayment.

For the purposes of this section, the term "overpayment of tax" shall be defined to include a refund in excess of tax liability as prescribed in subdivision (b) of Section 17053.5.

25954. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding sections of this article, the addition to the tax with respect to any underpayment of any installment shall not be imposed if the total amount of all payments of estimated tax paid on or before the last date prescribed for the payment of such installment equals or exceeds the amount which would have been required to be paid on or before such date if the estimated tax were

(4) For the first nine months or for the first 11 months of the income year, in the case of the installment required to be paid in the 12th month of the taxable year.

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(2) For purposes of this subdivision, the term "large worldwide corporation" means any corporation or corporation or bank for any five consecutive years (a) had taxable income of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) or more for any income year during the testing period, and (b) included during the testing period, for purposes of the tax imposed by this part, income and apportionment factors of one or more banks or corporations which derive all of their income from sources outside the United States which are not subject to the income taxes imposed by Subtitle A of the United States Internal Revenue Code.

(3) For purposes of this subdivision, the term "testing period" means the three income years immediately preceding the income year involved.

- (4) Multiply the tax computed under paragraph (3) by the base period percentage for the filing month and all months during the income year preceding the filing month.

(c) For purposes of this subdivision, (1) The base period percentage for any period of months shall be the average percent which the net income

for the corresponding months in each of the three preceding income years leads to the net income for the three preceding income years.

(2) The term "filing month" means the month in which the installment is required to be paid.

(3) This subdivision shall only apply at the base period percentage for any six consecutive months of the income year equals or exceeds 70 percent.

(4) The Franchise Tax Board may by regulations provide for the determination of the base period percentage in the case of corporations, new corporations, and other similar circumstances.

SEC. 15. Section 803 of the Unemployment Insurance Code is amended to read:
803. (a) As used in this section "entity" means any employing unit that is authorized by any provision of by Section 801 or 802 to elect a method of financing coverage permitted by this section.

(b) In lieu of the contributions required of employers, an entity may elect any one of the following: (1) To pay into the Unemployment Fund the cost of benefits, including extended duration benefits and wages with respect to employment for the base period charged to its account in the manner provided by Section 1026, pursuant to authorized regulations which shall prescribe the rate or amount, time, manner, and method of payment or advance payment or providing a good and sufficient bond to guarantee payment of contributions.

(2) Two or more entities may, pursuant to authorized regulations, file an application with the director for the establishment of a joint account for the purpose of determining the rate of contributions they shall pay into the Unemployment Fund to reimburse they for benefits paid with respect to employment for such entities. The members of the joint account may share the cost of benefits, including extended duration benefits and federal-state extended benefit wages with respect to the base period wages with respect to employment for such members and charged to the joint account in the manner provided by Section 1026. The director shall prescribe authorized regulations for the establishment, maintenance, and dissolution of joint accounts, and for the rate of amount, time, manner, and method of payment or advance payment or providing a good and sufficient bond to guarantee payment of contributions by the members of joint accounts, on the

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cost of benefits charged in the manner provided by Section 1026.

(c) Sections 1001, 1011, 1014, and 1022.5, and any provision of this division for the noncharging of benefits to the account of an employer, shall not apply to an election under subdivision (b) of this section. The cost of benefits charged to an entity under this section shall include, but not be limited to, benefits or payments improperly paid in excess of a weekly benefit amount, or in excess of a maximum benefit amount, or otherwise in excess of the amount which should have been paid, due to any computational or other error of any type by the Employment Development Department or the Department of Benefit Payments, whether or not such error could be anticipated.

(d) In making the payments prescribed by subdivision (b) there shall be paid or credited to the Unemployment Fund, either in advance or by way of reimbursement, an amount determined by the director, such amount as he or she estimates the Unemployment Fund will be entitled to receive from each entity for each calendar quarter, reduced or increased by any sum by which he or she finds that his or her estimates for any prior calendar quarter were greater or less than the amounts which should have been paid to the fund. Such estimates may be made upon the basis of such statistical sampling, or other method as may be determined by the director.

Upon making such determination, the director shall give notice of the determination, pursuant to Section 1026, to the entity. The director may cancel any contributions or portion thereof which he or she finds has been erroneously determined. The director shall charge to any special fund, which is responsible for the salary of any employee of an entity, the amount determined by the director for which the fund is liable pursuant to this section. The contributions due from the entity shall be paid from the liable special fund, the General Fund, or other liable fund to the Unemployment Fund by the Controller or other officer or person responsible for disbursements on behalf of the entity within 30 days of the date of mailing of the director's notice of determination to the entity. The director may postpone any amount for not to exceed 60 days, the time for paying without penalty the amount determined and required to be paid. Contributions are due upon the date of mailing of the notice of determination and are delinquent if not paid on or before the 30th day following the date of mailing of

such notice. Any entity which fails to pay the contributions required within the time required shall be liable for interest on the contributions at the adjusted annual rate and by the method established pursuant to Section 19209 of the Revenue and Taxation Code from and after the date of delinquency until paid, and any entity which without good cause fails to pay any contributions required within the time required shall pay a penalty of 10 percent of the amount of such contributions, if the entity fails to pay the contributions required on or before the delinquency date, the director may assess the entity for the amount required by the notice of determination. The provisions of Article 8 (commencing with Section 1126) of Chapter 4 of Part 1 of this division with respect to the assessment of contributions, and the provisions of Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 1701) of Part 1 of this division with respect to the collection of contributions, shall apply to the assessments provided by this section. The provisions of Sections 1177 to 1180, inclusive, relating to refunds and overpayments, shall apply to amounts paid to the Unemployment Fund pursuant to this section. The provisions of Sections 1221, 1223, 1224, 1241, and 1242 shall apply to matters arising under this section.

(e) The director may terminate the election of any entity for financing under this section if the entity is delinquent in the payment of advances or reimbursements required by the director under this section. After any such termination the entity may again make an election pursuant to this section but only if it is not delinquent in the payment of contributions and not delinquent in the payment of advances or reimbursements required by the director under this section.

(f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, no entity shall be liable for that portion of this extended duration benefits or federal-state extended benefits which is reimbursed or repayable by the federal government to the State of California.

(g) After the termination of any election under this section, the entity shall remain liable for its proportionate share of the cost of benefits paid and charged to its account in the manner provided by Section 1026, which are based on wages paid for services during the period of the election. Any such liability may be charged against any remaining balance of a prior reserve account used by the entity pursuant to Section 712 or 713. Any portion of such remaining balance shall be included in

the reserve account of the entity following any termination of an election under this section which occurs prior to the expiration of a period of three consecutive years commencing with the effective date of such election. For purposes of section 984, the period of an election under Section 803 shall, to the extent permitted by Federal law, be included as a period during which a reserve account has been subject to benefit charges.

SEC. 16. Section 1111 of the Unemployment Code is amended to read:

1111. The director for good cause may extend for not to exceed 60 days the time for making a return or paying without penalty any amount required to be paid under this division. Any employer to whom an extension is granted and who pays the amount required within the period for which the extension is granted shall pay, in addition to the contributions, interest at the adjusted annual rate and by the method established pursuant to Section 1926 of the Revenue and Taxation Code from the date on which the payment would have been delinquent without the extension until the date of payment.

SEC. 17. Section 1113 of the Unemployment Insurance Code is amended to read:

1113. Any employer who fails to pay any contributions required of him or his workers, except amounts assessed under Article 8 (commencing with Section 1128) of this chapter, within the time required shall become liable for interest on such contributions at the adjusted annual rate and by the method established pursuant to Section 1926 of the Revenue and Taxation Code from and after the date of delinquency until paid.

SEC. 18. Section 1129 of the Unemployment Insurance Code is amended to read:

1129. The amount of each assessment, exclusive of penalty, shall bear interest at the adjusted annual rate and by the method established pursuant to Section 1926 of the Revenue and Taxation Code from and after the last day of the month following the close of the calendar quarter, or from and after the 15th day of the month following the close of the calendar month, for which the contributions should have been retained until the date of payment.

SEC. 19. Section 1134 of the Unemployment Insurance Code is amended to read:

1134. If any refund or portion thereof is erroneously made, the director shall assess such amount to the employing unit or other person to whom the refund was

made, together with any interest paid thereon, but no assessment shall be made with respect to any amount of worker contributions which the employer has extended to his or her employees. The amount of the assessment shall bear interest at the adjusted annual rate and by the method established pursuant to Section 1926 of the Revenue and Taxation Code commencing 30 days after the service of notice of such assessment, if not paid within such period, until the date of payment. The director shall give the employing unit against whom the assessment is made a written notice of the assessment pursuant to Section 1140.

Such notice shall be given within three years from the date the refund was made unless the employing unit waives this limitation period or consents to its extension. Sections 1135, 1136, 1222, 1223, and 1228 shall apply to assessments made under this section. The director shall collect the amount of any assessment made under this section in the same manner that other assessments are collected.

SEC. 20. Section 1302 of the Unemployment Insurance Code is amended to read:

1302. (a) Every employer required to withhold any tax under Section 1302 shall for each calendar quarter, whether or not wages are paid in the quarter, file a withholding return in a form prescribed by the department, and pay over the taxes so required to be withheld. Except as provided in subdivisions (b) and (c) of this section, the employer shall file a withholding return and remit the total amount of income taxes withheld during the calendar quarter on or before the last day of the month following the close of the calendar quarter.

WHEREAS, Existing law does not specify which agencies have responsibility for the control of toxic substances emitted into the air; and

WHEREAS, In 1981, Assembly Bill 1005 by Assemblyman Duffy was introduced with provisions authorizing the State Air Resources Board to set emission standards at any source where air pollutants pose a significant risk of harm to the public health and would have enabled the state board to initiate a uniform, coordinated regulatory program to control these toxic air emissions; and

WHEREAS, In 1982, Assembly Bill 1005 was substantially amended in the Senate and was reheard by the Assembly Committee on Consumer Protection and Toxic Materials on August 24, 1982, and the committee felt that there were concerns with the bill which could not be adequately analyzed and resolved in the short time available to the committee at the end of the session and it held the bill in committee pending a more thorough review at an interim study hearing; and

WHEREAS, The Assembly Committee on Consumer Protection and Toxic Materials conducted an interim hearing on November 23, 1982, where state officials, industry representatives, and environmental groups presented extensive testimony on the airborne toxic substances issue, and, at the conclusion of the hearing, the committee stated it would develop legislative proposals to address issues related to the control of airborne toxic substances; and

WHEREAS, The State Air Resources Board proposed regulations amending Chapter 1 of Part III of Title 17 of the California Administrative Code regarding the emission of toxic air contaminants; and

WHEREAS, The Chairwoman and members of the Assembly Consumer Protection Toxic Materials Committee expressed concern with the state board's adoption of regulations pending legislative action to establish clear authority and responsibility for the control of airborne toxic substances; and

WHEREAS, On December 1, 1982, the state board adopted regulations to amend Chapter 1 of Part III of Title 17 of the California Administrative Code despite receipt of a letter from the Assembly Committee on Consumer Protection and Toxic Materials again expressing concern; now, therefore, be it

(b) Persons engaged in their present business during all of the corresponding quarterly period of the preceding year, or persons who are successors to a business which was an operation during all of that quarterly period, may satisfy the above monthly prepayment requirements for the first, third, and fourth calendar quarters by payment of an amount equal to one-third of the measure of tax liability reported on the return or returns filed for that quarterly period of the preceding year multiplied by the state and local tax rate in effect during the month for which the prepayment is made.

The persons may satisfy their prepayment requirements for the second calendar quarter by making a

first prepayment of an amount equal to one-third of the measure of tax liability reported, and a second prepayment of an amount equal to one-half of the measure of tax liability reported, on the return or returns filed for that quarterly period of the preceding year multiplied by the state and local tax rate in effect during the month for which the prepayment is made.

Prepayments shall be made during the quarterly periods designated by the board and during each succeeding quarterly period until further notified in writing by the board.

(c) This section shall remain in effect only until May 1, 1983, and as of that date is repealed, unless either of the following two events occur:

order to illustrate the boundary lines set forth in this
division. Maps deposited with the secretary of State
pursuant to this section may be used by the Secretary of
State and the several county clerks for purposes of
assisting in the interpretation of this division and to
facilitate the Secretary of State and the county clerks in
their administrative functions involved in the conduct of
elections.

30001. Each house of the Legislature shall be a
proper party to, and, if not originally named as a party,
shall have the right to intervene in, any action involving

the validity or application of any statute which provides for changes in the boundaries of any legislative districts of members of that particular house.

SEC. 1. Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 10010) of Division 16 of the Elections Code is repealed.
SEC. 4. Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 10010) is added to Division 16 of the Elections Code, to read:

CHAPTER 2. ASSEMBLY DISTRICTS

10010. It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this chapter to pass legislation essentially different from Assembly Bill 300 (Chapter 537 of the Statutes of 1981). It is further the intent of the Legislature to implement Article III of the California Constitution and to fully comply with the equal protection requirements of the California and United States Constitutions.

The Legislature has conducted a detailed analysis of Chapter 537 of the Statutes of 1981 and of Chapter 509 of the Statutes of 1981. It has also held public hearings and solicited public comment on the means by which the Legislature can enact a redistricting plan which meets the requirements of the California and United States Constitutions and is essentially different from Assembly Bill 300 (Chapter 537 of the Statutes of 1981). The Legislature accordingly finds that:

(1) Assembly Bill 300 (Chapter 537 of the Statutes of 1981) was placed on the ballot for the June 1982 primary election and was disapproved by the voters pursuant to Section 9 of Article II of the California Constitution and is therefore of no force and effect.

(2) This chapter is essentially different from that rejected by the voters and fully complies with the requirements of the California and United States Constitutions.

(3) Passage of this redistricting plan as this form is necessary in order to comply with the requirements of the California and United States Constitutions with regard to the equal protection of the laws, the decennial redistricting of the Assembly, the continuity of districts, the consecutive numbering of districts from north to south, and the geographical integrity of cities, counties, and regions.

If any census tract, block, block group, or enumeration district is omitted, listed more than once, or

is only partially provided for, it is the intent of the Legislature that the districts be defined in such a manner as to not omit any area of California from a district and to comply with the standard of Article III of the California Constitution requiring that districts be reasonably equal. In order to carry out the intent of the Legislature as expressed in these sections, the Secretary of State shall undertake necessary measures to insure compliance with this section.

10011. For purposes of this chapter, references to "city" shall mean "census tract", as that demographic unit is established by the United States Bureau of the Census for the 1980 census as described by maps and publications of the bureau. References to "block", "blocks", "block groups", "enumeration district", or "enumeration districts", refer to those demographic units as established by the United States Census Bureau for the 1980 census as described by maps and publications of the bureau.

1337.5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the annual Budget Act not provide for expenditures in excess of projected revenues. In the event that, after enactment of the Budget Act, revised estimates of expected revenues or expenditures, or both, show that expenditures will exceed estimated revenues, it is the intention of the Legislature that expenditures be reduced or revenues increased, or both, to ensure that actual expenditures do not exceed actual revenues for that fiscal year.

SEC. 2. Part 5 (commencing with Section 17300) is added to Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code, to read:

PART 5. STATE OF CALIFORNIA NOTES

17300. Whenever the Controller determines that moneys in the General Fund, after allowing for interest borrowing from other sources, are, or are expected to be, insufficient for the payment of all appropriations by the Legislature which are required to be paid in the then current fiscal year out of the General Fund, the Controller, based upon his estimate of the probable income to the General Fund during the then current fiscal year and the probable dates of receipt thereof, may issue demand or demands against appropriations made from the General Fund to be paid in the then current fiscal year prior to the receipt of the income, and deliver the same

to the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall register the same for redemption and notify the Controller. The Controller may then authorize the Treasurer to issue and sell notes of the State of California representing the registered demand or demands. Such notes shall be issued only to issue funds in an amount sufficient to satisfy the registered Controller's demand or demands.

17301. Notes authorized to be issued may be sold by the Treasurer from time to time as directed by the Controller. The notes may be sold on a negotiated or a competitive bid basis as the Treasurer shall deem advisable. The Treasurer shall authorize the issuance of notes on a fixed-maturity basis. Upon the maturity date of the notes, the Treasurer shall pay the notes from moneys then in the General Fund.

17302. The issuance of any notes pursuant to this part shall be authorized by a resolution adopted by the Treasurer with the approval of the Controller, and (a) may be negotiable, (b) may be payable in order or to bearer, (c) may be in any denomination, (d) shall be payable not later than the last day of the fiscal year in which the note has been issued and shall not be renewable beyond that date, and (e) may bear interest of up to a maximum rate to be determined by the Treasurer.

17303. Upon receipt of the purchase price of the notes, the Treasurer shall notify the Controller that funds for the payment of the registered demand or demands are in the State Treasury and available for the payment of claims represented by the registered demand or demands. The Controller may thereupon proceed to draw warrants against appropriations lawfully made by the Legislature to be paid in the fiscal year and represented by the registered demand or demands. Upon the payment in full of the notes representing the registered demand or demands, the registered demand or demands shall be canceled.

17304. Any revenues in the General Fund during the current fiscal year are available for the payment of all notes and the interest thereon until the same shall be fully paid and discharged. The notes, together with the interest thereon, shall be payable exclusively from moneys in the General Fund in the fiscal year of issuance, but not excepting, to the extent of interest borrowing from other funds in the event insufficient moneys are available from the General Fund.

17305. The aggregate amount of notes, as determined from their principal amount, issued pursuant to this part and outstanding at any one time, shall not

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exceed 10 percent of the General Fund revenues set forth in the annual report by the Controller to the Governor required by Section 14740. The annual report referred to in this section shall be the most recent report submitted by the Controller to the Governor at the commencement of the fiscal year in which the notes are issued. Notes may be issued in excess of the 10 percent limitation pursuant to a statute adopted by two-thirds of the membership of each house of the Legislature.

17306. All notes issued pursuant to this part by the state are legal investments for any of the following:

- (a) Trust funds.
- (b) Funds of insurers.
- (c) Funds of savings and loan associations.
- (d) Funds of banks.
- (e) Funds of State agencies, cities, counties, cities and counties or other public agencies or corporations.

17307. Notes issued under this part are acceptable and may be used as security for the faithful performance of any public or private trust or obligation or for the performance of any act, including the use of notes by banks as security for deposits of funds of the state and its agencies, or of any city, county, city and county, or other public agency or corporation.

17308. Any state or local agency that is authorized to invest funds in its treasury in securities which are legal investments for savings banks may invest the funds in notes of the state issued under this part.

17309. Whenever the Treasurer deems that it will increase the salability of the notes to obtain, prior to or after sale, a legal opinion as to the validity of the notes from attorneys other than the Attorney General, the Treasurer may obtain a legal opinion elsewhere.

17310. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund any unexpended money, as defined in Section 17220, in any amount necessary to pay the interest on, and the principal of, any notes issued and sold during the current fiscal year pursuant to this part, as the notes become due and payable.

17311. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund without regard to fiscal years, two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) which shall be set aside in a special account entitled State Notes Expense Account, and shall be used to pay expenses incurred by the

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Treasurer in providing for the preparation, sale, issuance, advertisement, legal services, or any other act which, in the discretion of the Treasurer, is necessary to carry out the purposes of this part. This account shall operate as a revolving fund and whenever notes are sold, out of the first money realized from their sale, there shall be expended for the above purposes that have been expended for the same purposes and repaid in the same manner whenever additional sales are made.

17312. This part shall remain in effect only until June 30, 1985, and on that date is repealed.

SEC. 1. It is the intent of the Legislature that Section 2 of this act shall, in all respects, fall within the procedure validated by, and meet the requirements for, court cases of *Siley v. Johnson* (1933), 219 Cal. 513 and *Siley v. Johnson* (1934), 6 Cal. 2d 529.

SEC. 4. Section 100.6 is added to the Revenue and Taxation Code, to read:

100.6. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for the 1982-83 fiscal year, the Controller shall deduct twenty-one million dollars (\$21,000,000) from the amount of local assistance funds, as defined in Section 100.5, which would otherwise be transmitted to cities, and fifty-four million dollars (\$54,000,000) from the amount of local assistance funds which would otherwise be transmitted to counties, to the extent these funds are available.

(b) The reductions provided in subdivision (a) shall be made in the following manner:

(1) The Controller shall separately total, for each city and county, the amount of local assistance funds for the remainder of the fiscal year which has not yet been transmitted to cities or counties, as estimated by the Department of Finance.

(2) The Department of Finance shall provide the Controller with the amount of 1982-83 fiscal year remaining not callout, as determined pursuant to Section 11005.66 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, for each city and county.

(3) The Controller shall, for each city, take the lesser of the sums computed in paragraphs (1) and (2), source of local assistance funds for cities.

(4) The Controller shall calculate a factor derived by dividing fifty-four million dollars

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(\$50,000,000) by the county amount determined pursuant to paragraph (1).

(f) If the factor determined in paragraph (e) for counties is less than 1.0, then this factor shall be multiplied by the amount of funds for each individual source of local assistance funds for counties. The resulting amount shall be the amount retained by the state from each source of local assistance funds for counties.

(g) If the factor determined in paragraph (e) for counties is greater than or equal to 1.0, then no funds from any source of local assistance funds for counties shall be allocated.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the amounts of local assistance funds which are not paid to counties or counties by operation of this section shall be transferred from their respective funds or accounts to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund.

We know that the truth must come out, but that there are actions and challenges we need to perform. Bless this noble group, Oh Father. Their leadership, courage, and decisions will make a difference in the minds and hearts of people all over the state. But somehow we sense the strength and courage that emanates from this community and this place. Perhaps our prayers too will be heard in Washington. Oh, Father, give us the strength and wisdom this day and this moment as we commemorate the day that brought so much tragedy when a simple, little paper was signed Executive Order 9066 and what a tragedy it became for the 120,000 people. But what a threat it has become to 200 million Americans and their children, and their children. Bless us Father, and give us the wisdom and the courage to dare to do the right thing. Give us this steadiness and the conviction and the courage to move forward. In Jesus name we pray.—AMEN.

(b) A service agency that employs a fair hearing procedure mandated by any other statute shall be considered to have an approved procedure for purposes of this chapter.

(c) The service agency's fair hearing procedure shall be stated in writing, in English and such other language as may be appropriate to the needs of the consumers of the agency's services. A copy of the procedure and a copy of the provisions of this chapter shall be prominently displayed on the premises of the service agency.

(d) All recipients, applicants and persons having legal responsibility for such recipients or applicants shall be informed verbally of, and shall be the service agency's fair hearing procedure when they apply for services, when they are denied services, and when notice of service modification is given pursuant to Section 4710.

Sec. 7. Section 4710 of the Welfare and Institutions Code is amended to read:

4710. (a) Adequate notice shall be sent to the applicant or recipient and the authorized representative, the following actions:

(1) The agency makes a decision without the representative's consent, or authorized representative to reduce, terminate, or change services set forth in an individual program plan.

(2) A recipient is determined to be no longer eligible for agency services.

(b) If the reason for denial of services or modification of services is a recipient's individual program plan is a lack of funds in the regional center budget, the regional center shall be the service agency responsible for giving adequate notice and participating in the fair hearing procedure under this chapter.

(c) ~~64 THE REGIONAL CENTER SHALL WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER HEARING NOTICE IS MADE TO THE APPLICANT OR CLIENT, NOTIFY THE APPLICANT IN WRITING OF THE DENIAL OF A LACK OF FUNDS IN THE REGIONAL CENTER BUDGET IN THE CASES FOR ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:~~

(2) the denial of services to a current regional center client requesting services not included in the client's individual program plan but determined to be necessary by the interdisciplinary team, or (3) denied services to a recipient set forth in the individual program plan who requests services within 30 days after written notice is mailed to the applicant or client, notify the department of writing of the denial.

The notification to the department shall include the nature of the service requested, a request that the department allocate sufficient funds to the regional center within 30 days to provide the service, the projected cost for such service for the balance of the fiscal year, and information substantiating the reason for the lack of funds to purchase such service.

(4) If a person requests regional center services and is found to be ineligible for such services, the regional center shall give adequate notice pursuant to Section 4701. Notice shall be sent within five days of the time limits set forth in Sections 4602 and 4611.

(e) The advance notice specified in subdivision (a) shall not be required when a reduction, termination, or change in services is determined to be necessary for the health and safety of the recipient. However, adequate notice shall be given within 10 days after such service agency action.

(c) Within 30 days of the receipt of the annual contract allocation, each regional center shall notify the department of the sufficiency of the allocation, using a format mutually agreed to by the department and the regional centers.

(d) If the director determines that the amount

of funds encumbered in the annual regional center contracts are insufficient for regional centers to provide and purchase services at the levels projected through the end of the 1983-84 fiscal year, the department shall notify each regional center of the department's estimate of the amount of the projected deficit and the basis upon which the deficit was determined.

(e) Within 30 days following the department's notification to regional centers of the projected deficit, pursuant to subdivision (d), each regional center shall prepare and submit a plan of action to the department, and provide a copy of that plan to the local area board. The plan of action shall include adjustments in expenditure levels consistent with the priorities established in the emergency regulations and the level of funding in the regional center contract. The failure of a regional center to submit a plan to the department shall constitute grounds for nonrenewal of the annual regional center contract.

(f) The department, upon receipt of the plans of action submitted by regional centers, shall review the plan in order to determine compliance with the regulations adopted pursuant to subdivision (a) and to determine whether the plan adequately addresses the projected deficiency in funding. The department shall also make a determination of the extent to which implementation of the plans may result in service inequities among regional center catchment areas. The department shall notify each regional center of the results of its review of the individual plans of action.

(g) Based upon its review, the department shall notify the regional centers and report to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee regarding the anticipated actions that will be taken to reduce expenditures, reallocate existing funds, or secure additional funds.

SEC. 2. Section 5141.5 is added to the Revenue and Taxation Code, to read:

5141.5. During the pendency of a final decision of the Supreme Court or a court of appeal, Section 5141 shall not apply to any claim for refunds which was filed and denied prior to April 3, 1983, if that claim for refund is a claim that is the subject of Chapter 14 of the 1983-84 First Extraordinary Session.

SEC. 3. It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting Sections 1 and 2 of this act to clarify provisions of Chapter 14 of the 1983-84 First Extraordinary Session. This act is not intended to change legislative interpretation of the provisions of Article XIII A of the Constitution, which are contained in Sections 52 and 50.1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, on the issue of which have been the inflation factor in subdivisions (b) of Section 2 of Article XIII A of the Constitution first applies.

SEC. 4. Notwithstanding Section 6 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution and Section 2231 or 2234 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, no appropriation is made by this act for the purpose of making reimbursement pursuant to these sections. The Legislature recognizes that the processing of refunds in a state-mandated local program. However, this processing involves both increased savings and costs. A local agency or account district may pursue any remedies to obtain reimbursement available to it under Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 2201) of Part 4 of Division 1 of that Code.
