Dear Gentlemen: I have had an opportunity to review the amendments drafted by our respective staffs which are embodied in Legislative Counsel Request #84004094. I find that these amendments substantially contain the proposal which I offered yesterday. This is the essence of the proposal which was suggested by the Chancellor of the Community Colleges, Mr. Jerry Hayward. These amendments meet my concerns and I understand that they also meet your concerns.

I am pleased to inform you that if AB 1XX comes to my desk with the specific amendments referred to above, I will sign the measure along with AB 470. This will allow the community colleges to have their base completely restored in the current fiscal year, and will provide for the imposition of fees and funding for actual ADA in the 1984-85 Budget Year.

Needless to say, time is of the essence. I believe that it would be advantageous to all for this issue to be settled immediately in order to restore certainty to community college funding.
