THE LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL BUREAU.

The Legislative Counsel Bureau was created by an act of the legislature of 1913. Its purpose is to assist the members of the legislature in the drafting and amendment of bills and resolutions, and to render such consideration and service to any committee as may be required. The act establishing the bureau also provides that any state officer or department may request assistance in the preparation of bills to be presented to the legislature. Neither the chief nor any employee of the bureau is permitted to divulge the nature or contents of any matter brought to their attention except with the consent of the person bringing such matter before the bureau. Following adjournment the Legislative Counsel is required to assist the Governor in the consideration of such bills as may then remain in his hands for approval or rejection. The bureau is under the direction of Thomas M. Gannon and is located in Room 206 of the Capitol Building.

STATE LIBRARY LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE SERVICE.

Information on pending legislation and assistance in consulting the laws of other states and countries are given members by the Law and Legislative Reference Department of the California State Library, first floor, Capitol.

Bills and journals of previous sessions of the California Legislature, reports of State departments, the statutes and court reports of other American states, the United States, Great Britain, Canada and Australia and compiled laws on a wide variety of subjects are available for use. The bills of current sessions of the more important state legislatures and the bills, reports, calendars and proceedings of the current session of Congress are also on file.
