PLAN OF THE CHAMBER OF LEGISLATIVE BUSINESS



**BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF BILLS INTRODUCED IN THE  
ASSEMBLY AT THE FIFTY-THIRD (FOURTH EXTRAOR-  
DINARY) SESSION. (PREPARED BY LEGIS-  
LATIVE COUNSEL)**

The following applies only to bills introduced. Because of the time element no attempt has been made to digest each measure in detail. Each description purports to contain only a statement of the subject of the measure and what appears to be its principal features.

**A B 1 -TENNEY AND OTHERS** Adds Secs. 2540.3, 2540.4 and 2540.9, Elec. C., re parties on ballot.

Provides that no party may be recognized or qualified to participate at primary election if party designation contains word 'Communist' or any derivative of word "Communist".

Makes similar provision as to any party affiliated with Communist Party of United States, the Third Communist International, or any foreign agency, political party, organization or government advocating overthrow of government by sabotage, force and violence, sedition or treason.

Provides that Secretary of State, with advice and consent of Attorney General, is to determine qualifications of party and for court review of such determination.

**A B 2 -KEPPLER AND DOYLE** Adds Sec. 399, Sch. C., re maintenance of school on Saturdays.

Permits high school district or unified school district to provide day or evening classes on Saturday for vocational education in connection with defense program.

**A B 3 -GANNON AND OTHERS** Adds Sec. 152, Act 1404 re leaves of absence for civil service employees for military service.

Permits leave of absence in time of war or during emergency declared by Governor to exist in preparing for national defense. Leave to extend until 90 days after enlistment terminates or emergency declared to no longer exist.

**A B 4 -HAWKINS** New act.

Authorizes housing authorities to provide housing for persons engaged in national defense activities. Includes workers in essential industries. Authorizes cooperation by public agencies as defined in Act 3484 (1938 (E. S.) 2-2).

**A B 5 -KING**, Amends Sec. 13107 adds Secs. 13150-13156, H. & S. C., re State Fire Marshal.

Authorizes Fire Marshal to sponsor and cooperate in adoption of measures for protection against sabotage by means of arson and to disseminate information re such protection.

Authorizes Fire Marshal to make examinations of buildings and premises to determine causes of fire, to investigate and gather evidence as to commission of arson or other cause. Permits holding of hearings and subpoena of witnesses. Provides for turning over evidence to district attorney.

**A B 6 -WALKER** New act.

Appropriates \$255,000 to be allocated by Director of Education with approval of Director of Finance to school districts for reconstruction, replacement and repair of buildings and facilities damaged or destroyed in earthquakes in May, 1940. Requires school districts to match money allocated.

**A B 7 -CROWLEY** Amends Secs. 607.4, 607.6, 608 and 608.2, Veh. C., re vehicular crossings.

Recasts certain provisions now relating to vehicular crossings (toll bridges and approaches) under jurisdiction of Department of Public Works pursuant to the California Toll Bridge Authority Act. Excepts from provisions prohibiting towing, vehicular crossings where department does not maintain tow service. Excepts from prohibition against bicycles, crossings on which department posts signs indicating bicycles are permitted. Excepts from prohibition of pedestrian traffic, crossings on which sidewalks are maintained and on which signs indicate pedestrians are permitted.

A. B. 8—DESMOND AND DOYLE. Amends Secs. 17, 108 and 109, Act 5847, the State Employees' Retirement Law, re members absent in military service.

Provides that periods of service with armed forces during war or national emergency and 90 days thereafter counts as time in State service for purpose of death benefits and retirements but not in calculation of benefits. Permits, but does not require, continuation of contributions by employee during these periods in which case the State is also to contribute as if member were not absent.

A. B. 9—KING. New act, Council of Defense Act.

Creates California State Council of Defense. Number of members to be determined by Governor. Members to be appointed by and serve at pleasure of Governor. One member is to be appointed from State Planning Board and one is to represent cities and counties. Governor is chairman of council and is to appoint chairman and vice chairman of standing committees. Executive Committee is to consist of chairman of council, chairman and vice chairman of standing committees and representatives of State Planning Board and cities and counties.

Council is given general power to study, make recommendations and cooperate in regard to defense measure.

Bill creates 6 standing committees and council permitted to establish others.

Requires public agencies to cooperate. Permits establishment of local councils of defense.

Provides for 2 Senators appointed by President pro tempore and 3 Assemblymen appointed by Speaker to work with State council and keep Legislature informed.

Makes money appropriated for State Planning Board for National Defense Program available for Executive Committee of State council.

**BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF BILLS INTRODUCED IN THE SENATE  
AT THE FIFTY-THIRD (FOURTH EXTRAORDINARY)  
SESSION. (PREPARED BY LEGISLATIVE  
COUNSEL)**

The following applies only to bills introduced. Because of the time element no attempt has been made to digest each measure in detail. Each description purports to contain only a statement of the subject of the measure and what appear to be its principal features.

**S B 1 -BREED** New act, Council of Defense Act

Creates California State Council of Defense. Number of members to be determined by Attorney General. Members to be appointed by, and serve at pleasure of, Attorney General. One member to be appointed from State Planning Board, 1 to represent cities and counties. Attorney General to be chairman of council. Executive Committee is to consist of chairman of council, chairman and vice chairman of each standing committee, representative of Planning Board and representative of cities and counties.

Bill creates six standing committees and Executive Committee may create others.

Council given broad general powers to make studies, recommendations, and cooperate with Council of National Defense.

Two members of Senate, appointed by President pro tempore, and 3 members of Assembly, appointed by Speaker, are to participate in work of council and keep Legislature informed.

Bill provide for local councils of defense and their cooperation with State council.

Transfers unexpended money appropriated to State Planning Board to study and formulate plans for participation in National Defense Program to Executive Committee of State Council of Defense.

**S B 2 -SLATER, QUINN AND RICH** Amends Sec. 1, adds Secs. 2 and 2.1 Chapter 1, 1940 (2d Ex. Sess.) re restoration and repair of property damaged by storms or floods.

Excepts expenditure for investigations, estimates, budgets, and reports by Chief of Division of Water Resources from restrictions on expenditures for work or repair.

Permits Department of Public Works to do work by force account or by contract. Permits persons, corporations, political subdivisions, public districts and public agencies to contract to do work.

Provides that when Federal Government assures that matching funds will be made available work may be done without money being actually available.

**S B 3 -KENNY AND SHELLLEY** Amends Sec. 13105, adds Secs. 13150-13156, inc. H & S. C. re State Fire Marshal.

Adds to general powers of Fire Marshal the sponsoring, and cooperating in adoption, of measures for protection against sabotage by means of arson and dissemination of information re such protection.

Authorizes Fire Marshal to make examinations of buildings or premises to determine causes of fire, to investigate and gather evidence as to commission of arson or other crime. Permits holding of hearings and subpoena of witnesses. Provides for turning over evidence to district attorney.

**S B 4-FLETCHER** New act.

Appropriates \$255,000 to be allocated by Director of Education, with approval of Director of Finance, to school districts for reconstruction, replacement and repair of buildings and facilities destroyed or damaged by earthquakes in May, 1940. To be available only if school districts provide matching funds.

**S B. 5--NIELSEN.** Adds Sec. 395.4, amends Sec. 395.5, Mil & Vet. C. re State officers and employees in military or naval service.

Provides that officer or employee having permanent civil service status who has been in State service one year or more is entitled to maximum of 30 days' pay while absent on account of ordered military or naval duty with armed forces.

Provides for retention of civil service rights and reinstatement of such officers and employees.

## BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF SENATE BILLS—Continued

S B 6—NIELSEN. Adds Sec. 1525, Act 1401, the State Civil Service Act, re leaves of absence of permanent civil service employees of State.

Provides for leave of absence during war, or emergency existing in preparation for national defense proclaimed by Governor, and for 90 days thereafter.

S B. 7—NIELSEN. Amends Secs. 47, 108 and 109, Act 5847, the State Employees' Retirement Law, re members absent on military service.

Provides that period of service with armed forces during war or emergency and 90 days thereafter counts as time of State service for purpose of death benefits and retirement but not for calculating retirement benefits. Permits but does not require continuation of employees contributions while so absent, and if contributions are made by employees State is also to contribute as if member were not absent.

S B. 8—SHELLEY. Amends Sec. 152, Act 1404, the State Civil Service Act, re leaves of absence of permanent civil service employees of State.

Provides for leave of absence during war, or emergency existing in preparation for national defense proclaimed by Governor, and for 90 days thereafter.

S.B. 9—SHELLEY. Amends Secs. 47, 108 and 109, Act 5847, the State Employees' Retirement Act, re members absent on military service.

Provides that period of service with armed forces during war or national emergency and 90 days thereafter counts as time in State service for purpose of death benefits and retirement but not as to amount of retirement benefits. Permits, but does not require, employees to continue contributions during such absence in which case State is also to contribute its share.

S.B. 10—SWING. New act.

Appropriates \$255,000 to be allocated by Director of Education, with approval of Director of Finance, to school districts for reconstruction, replacement, and repair of buildings and facilities damaged or destroyed by earthquakes in May, 1940. Requires districts to match from their own money amount allocated under bill.

S B 11—PHILLIPS AND OTHERS. Adds Div. VII, Secs. 1400 to 1411, inc. Mil. & Vet. C., re State Council of Defense.

Creates council to consist of Governor and 33 members appointed by Governor with advice and consent of President pro tempore of Senate and Speaker of Assembly and subject to confirmation by Senate. In addition 2 members of Senate appointed by President pro tempore and 3 members of Assembly appointed by Speaker shall meet with and participate in work of the council and keep Legislature informed. Legislators so appointed are to appoint Advisory Committee of 15 nonlegislative members representing industry, labor, and other elements.

Executive Committee of 11 members to be appointed by Governor with advice and consent of President pro tempore and Speaker. Executive Committee may appoint other committees to consider specific fields.

Council given general powers to consider, recommend and cooperate in defense measures.

Bill provides for local councils of defense and requires cooperation of State and local agencies with State Council.

Appropriates \$10,000 for expenditure under direction of Executive Committee.
