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



Facilities of the bureaus are available for special reports prepared at the request of individual legislators and legislative committees The reports are concise, factual, objective, impartial. The bureaus offer no recommendations as to the desirability of any proposed legislation They limit their services to gathering and analyzing factual information. Special requests may be directed to the Bureau of Public Administration, University of California, Berkeley 4, or to the Bureau of Governmental Research, University of California, Los Angeles 24.

# JOINT LEGISLATIVE AUDIT COMMITTEE AND AUDITOR GENERAL

The Joint Legislative Audit Committee determines the policies of the Auditor General, reviews his reports and makes reports and recommendations to the Legislature. It is the duty of the Auditor General to examine and report upon financial statements prepared by the executive branch of the State, and make special audits and investigations of any agency as may be required by the Legislature He has access and authority to examine any and all books, accounts, reports, correspondence, etc., of any agency of the State.

## LEGISLATIVE BUDGET COMMITTEE AND LEGISLATIVE ANALYST

Joint Rule No 37 provides \* \* \* " "the Legislative Analyst shall assist any Member of the Legislature or any committee thereof in any matter, and to that end shall make available to such members or committees any

records, documents, or other data under his control."

The Legislative Budget Committee ascertains facts and makes recommendations to the Legislature and to the houses thereof concerning the state budget, the revenues and expenditures of the State and of the organization and function of this State, its departments, subdivisions and agencies with a view of reducing the cost of state government and securing greater efficiency and economy

In 1943, the committee was made repository for all documents and materials of all committees, except standing committees, when the work

of such committees is concluded

Pursuant to subdivision (d) of Section 9900, Government Code, as amended, the Legislative Analyst is designated as the person embraced by the definition of "Clerk" set forth in that section. (Assembly Rule No 30, and Senate Rule No 97)
