It is the duty of the Legislative Councel to assist the Members of the Legislature, upon request, in the drafting and amendment of bills and resolutions; to prepare or assist in the preparation or amendment of legislative bills at the suggestion of the Governor or of any judge of a court of record or of any committee of the Legislature; upon request, to advise any state officer as to the preparation of bills to be submitted to the Legislature; and to co-operate with any legislative committee appointed to carry on investigations between sessions of the Legislature.
