**2011–12 FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION**  
**Fiscal Emergency Proclamation**  
**by Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr.**  
*January 20, 2011\**

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**WHEREAS** on the 6th of December, 2010, pursuant to Section 10(f) of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of California, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger; proclaimed a fiscal emergency; and

**WHEREAS** that proclamation contained certain findings supporting the declaration of a fiscal emergency; and

**WHEREAS** on January 10, 2011, I released my proposed budget for the State of California and that budget reflected current economic, budgetary, and cash information; and

**WHEREAS** without corrective action the combined operating deficit for Fiscal Year 2010–11 and Fiscal Year 2011–12 is \$25.4 billion; and

**WHEREAS** revenues are \$3.1 billion lower than were projected at the time of the 2010 Budget Act; and

**WHEREAS** the passage, in November 2010, of Proposition 22 created an additional budget shortfall of \$1.6 billion; and

**WHEREAS** decisive action is required to solve the State's persistent and severe budget problems, continue economic recovery, promote job growth, and preserve public education and the quality of life for all Californians.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR.**, Governor of the State of California, in accordance with Section 10(f) of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of California, **HEREBY DETERMINE** that General Fund revenues for Fiscal Year 2010–11 will decline substantially below the estimate of General Fund revenues upon which the Budget was based, and General Fund expenditures will increase substantially above the estimate of General Fund revenues, and further, that this will create a carry-over deficit affecting the cash reserves and the budget for Fiscal Year 2011–12.

**I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR.**, Governor of the State of California, **HEREBY DECLARE** and **REAFFIRM** that a fiscal emergency exists.

**I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR.**, Governor of the State of California, **HEREBY IDENTIFY THE NATURE OF THIS FISCAL EMERGENCY** to be the projected budget imbalance for Fiscal Year 2010–11, which is causing budgetary and cash deficits in Fiscal Year 2011–12.

**I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR.**, Governor of the State of California, further determine, in accordance with the findings set forth herein, and the legislation that I am proposing to the Legislature in connection with this proclamation, that this proclamation dated January 20, 2011, supersedes the proclamations issued on December 6, 2010, for the purposes of Section 10(f) of Article IV of the Constitution.

**Fiscal Emergency Proclamation**  
**by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger**  
*Convened December 6, 2010.*  
*Superseded by proclamation issued January 20, 2011.*

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**WHEREAS** California is slowly emerging from the most severe economic downturn since the Great Depression; and

**WHEREAS** while the U.S. employment has dropped about 5 percent since 2007, employment in California has declined 9 percent (1.4 million jobs); and

**WHEREAS** due to the slow employment growth in the state, California's unemployment rate is expected to continue above 10 percent through 2012; and

**WHEREAS** in response to this dire fiscal situation, the Budget Act of 2010 was enacted in October to address a \$19.3 billion projected deficit; and

**WHEREAS** at the time the Budget Act of 2010 was enacted, the budget reserves for Fiscal Year 2010-11 totaled \$1.3 billion; and

**WHEREAS** the Legislative Analyst projects a current year budget shortfall of \$6 billion.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, ARNOLD SCHWARZENEGGER**, Governor of the State of California, in accordance with Section 10(f) of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of California, **HEREBY DETERMINE** that General Fund revenues for Fiscal Year 2010-11 will decline substantially below the estimate of General Fund revenues upon which the Budget was based, and as the result of unachieved budget reductions, General Fund expenditures will increase substantially above the estimate of General Fund revenues.

**I, ARNOLD SCHWARZENEGGER**, Governor of the State of California, **HEREBY DECLARE** that a fiscal emergency exists.

**I, ARNOLD SCHWARZENEGGER**, Governor of the State of California, **HEREBY IDENTIFY THE NATURE OF THIS FISCAL EMERGENCY** to be the projected budget imbalance for Fiscal Year 2010-11.

**FURTHER** on this day, as required by Section 10(f) of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of California, I will cause the Legislature to assemble in special session to address this fiscal emergency, and I will submit to the Legislature proposed legislation to address this fiscal emergency.

### **Proclamation by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger**

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**WHEREAS** on this date, pursuant to Section 10(f) of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of California, I have proclaimed a fiscal emergency; and

**WHEREAS** on this date, I am submitting to the Legislature proposed legislation to address that fiscal emergency; and

**WHEREAS** this extraordinary occasion having arisen and now existing, it requires that the Legislature of the State of California be convened in extraordinary session.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, ARNOLD SCHWARZENEGGER**, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me in accordance with Section 10(f) of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of California, do hereby convene the Legislature of the State of California to meet in extraordinary session at Sacramento, California on the 6th day of December 2010, at a time to be determined, to consider and act upon legislation to address the fiscal emergency proclaimed by me this day.

\*NOTE: The Proclamation issued by Hon. Edmund G. Brown Jr, Governor of the State of California, declares and reaffirms that a fiscal emergency exists and supersedes the Proclamation issued on December 6, 2010 by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger. Pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(f) of the Constitution of the State of California, March 6, 2011 is the 45th day following the issuance of the Proclamation.

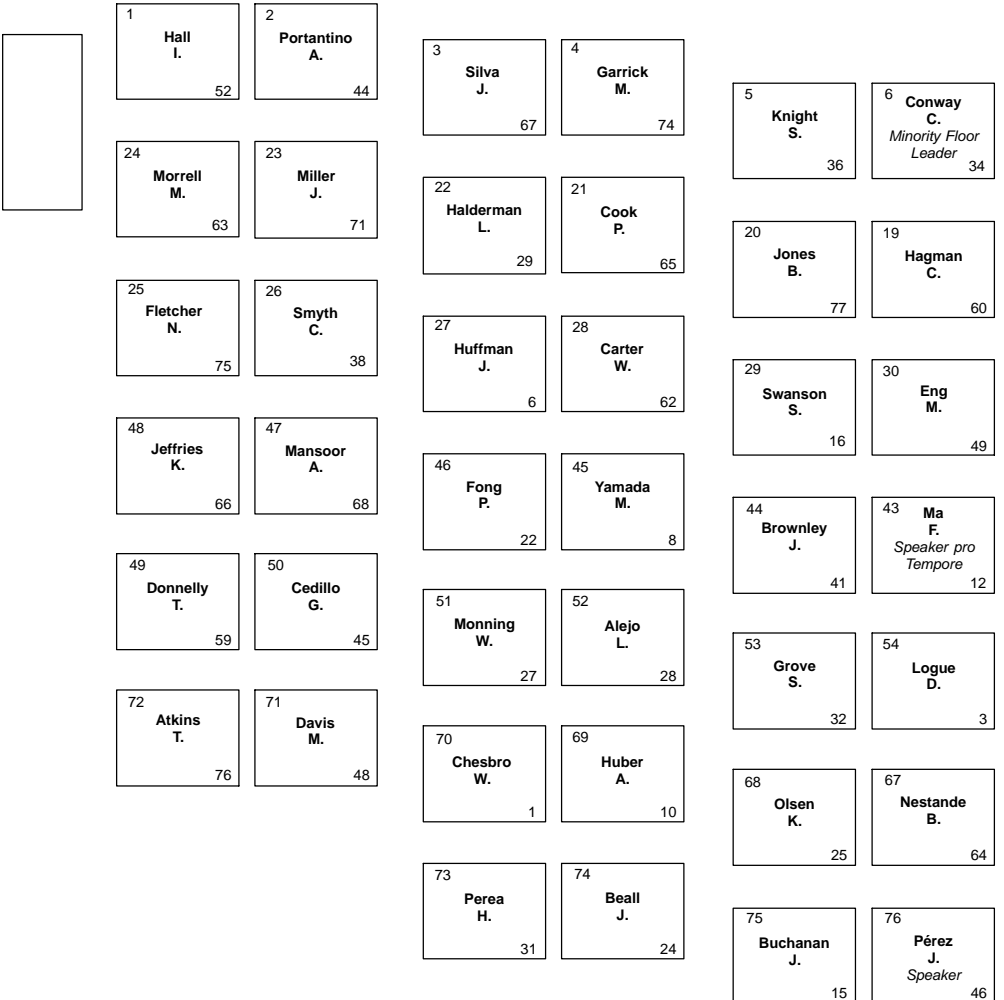
