

Charter Chapter 1—City of Salinas

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Salinas

[Filed with the Secretary of State January 3, 1989]

Section 5 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 5. City Council Powers of the City

All of the powers of the City, except as otherwise provided by this Charter, are hereby vested in a Council of seven (7) members, consisting of a Mayor, who shall be elected at-large and six Councilmembers, who shall be elected by District. No person shall be eligible to hold the office of Mayor or Councilmember unless on the date of his filing of nomination papers, he is a qualified elector of the City of Salinas, and unless he shall have been a resident of the district of the City of Salinas for which he is running, or territory lawfully annexed thereto, for at least twenty-eight (28) days preceding the opening date for the filing of papers, or his appointment to fill a vacancy therein and shall forfeit his office upon ceasing to reside therein. Designation for the office as Mayor or Councilmember for a District, as the case may be, shall be used on all nomination papers, certificates of election, and all election papers referring to the office.

The City Council shall district and subdivide the City into districts for the holding of municipal elections. The City shall be divided into six (6) contiguous districts. Following adoption of this section and thereafter, following each decennial federal census, and using the census as the basis, the City Council shall adjust the boundaries of any or all of the Districts of the City so that each District shall be as nearly equal in population as may be according to the latest federal decennial census. If, for any municipal election for Mayor or for Councilmember, there shall be no choice between candidates by reason of two or more candidates having received an equal number of votes then the City Council shall proceed to determine the election of such candidates by lots.

Section 31 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 31. Same Vacancies

Vacancies in the Council from the district vacated shall be filled by majority choice of the remaining Councilmembers. The person shall hold office for the remainder of the unexpired term, or until the next regular municipal election, when a Councilmember shall be elected from the vacant district to serve during the remainder of such term.

Section 7 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 7. General Municipal Elections

General municipal elections of officers and for such other purposes as the Council may prescribe, shall be held in the City of Salinas on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in June of each odd-numbered year, except as otherwise provided herein. Provided, that with respect to any such election to be held any year, the Council may by resolution or ordinance provide for the consolidation of the election with any election

to be conducted in the County of Monterey, State of California, or at an earlier date in any such year for the purpose of consolidation with any election to be conducted in the County of Monterey when such earlier date is established as a regular election date by the Elections Code of the State of California.

Commencing with the election in 1989, two additional Councilmember offices shall be added in order that the City Council shall consist of six (6) Councilmembers and one Mayor. The City Council shall designate one of the two newly added Councilmember seats to have a term of two (2) years from and after 12:00 noon of the first day of July next succeeding his election, and until his successor is elected and qualified. Thereafter, such Councilmember office shall be a four (4) year term, as shall all other Councilmembers.

Charter Chapter 2—City of Stockton

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Stockton

ARTICLE XXVIII

Section 8 is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 8. No recall proceeding shall be commenced against an incumbent council member or Mayor if the affected council member or mayor:

- (a) Has held office during the current term for a period of less than 6 calendar months, or
- (b) Has had a recall election determined in his/her favor within the past 12 calendar months, or
- (c) Has 6 calendar months or less remaining in his/her term of office.

Charter Chapter 3—City of Berkeley

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Berkeley

ARTICLE XVII

Section 121 (3) is amended to read as follows:

Section 121 (3). Conflict of Interest.

Commissioners shall be subject to the requirements of the California Political Reform Act and other applicable state and local conflict of interest codes.

Charter Chapter 4—City of Pacific Grove

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Pacific Grove

[Filed with the Secretary of State March 17, 1989]

Article 26 is amended to read as follows:

Article 26. Appointive Commissions and Boards. There shall be the Commission and Boards enumerated in this Article which shall have the powers and duties as provided herein. The appointment of persons to serve on these Commissions and Boards shall be made by the Mayor subject to the confirmation by affirmative vote of four members of the Council.

Before making such appointments the Mayor shall consult with the Council and shall consider fully any and all nominations suggested by other members of the Council.

Members of Commissions and Boards shall serve at the pleasure of the Council. The Council, by an affirmative vote of four of its members, may remove any member of any Commission or Board at any time during the Commission or Board member's term of office.

The term of office for members of Commissions and Boards shall be four years, but in no event shall any person serve more than three successive full terms on a single Commission or Board. For the purposes of this Article, service upon appointment to a vacated mid-term seat shall be deemed service for a full term. A person who has served for such three term period on a Commission or Board shall be eligible for reappointment to that Commission or Board after the expiration of two years.

Any person appointed to serve on such Commissions or Boards shall be a registered elector of the City and shall not hold any paid office or

employment in the City government or be a member of any other Board as herein enumerated, or be a member of the City Council, except as an ex officio member without vote.

a. CITY PLANNING COMMISSION

There shall be a Planning Commission consisting of seven members, and shall have the following powers and duties:

(1) Recommend to the Council the adoption, amendment, or repeal of a General Master Plan, or any part thereof, for the physical development of the City.

(2) Exercise such functions with respect to land subdivisions, planning and zoning as may be prescribed by ordinance or resolution.

(3) Perform such other duties relating to planning and zoning as the Council may require by ordinance or resolution, or as may be prescribed by the General Laws of the State.

b. LIBRARY BOARD.

There shall be a Library Board consisting of five members and shall have the following powers and duties:

(1) Act in an advisory capacity to the Council and City Manager in all matters pertaining to the operation of a public library.

(2) Recommend to the City Council the adoption of such laws, rules, and regulations as it may deem necessary for the administration and protection of the City Library.

(3) Perform such other duties relating to the library services as the Council may require by ordinance or resolution.

c. MUSEUM BOARD.

There shall be a Museum Board consisting of five members and shall have the following powers and duties:

(1) Act in an advisory capacity to the Council and City Manager in all matters pertaining to the operation of a public museum.

(2) Recommend to the City Council the adoption of such laws, rules, and regulations as it may deem necessary for the administration and protection of the City Museum.

(3) Perform such other duties relating to the museum service as the Council may require by ordinance or resolution.

d. RECREATION BOARD.

There shall be a Recreation Board consisting of five members and shall have the following powers and duties:

(1) Act in an advisory capacity to the Council and City Manager in all matters pertaining to the operation of a City recreation program.

(2) Recommend to the City Council the adoption of such laws, rules and regulations as it may deem necessary for the administration and operation of a City recreation program.

(3) Promote and stimulate public interest in a recreation program and solicit to the fullest extent possible the cooperation of school authorities and other public and private agencies interested therein.

(4) Perform such other duties relating to the recreation program as the Council may require by ordinance or resolution.

Article 13 is amended to read as follows:

Article 13. Meetings of the Council. All meetings of the Council shall be duly noticed and shall be open to the public and shall otherwise comply with applicable state law. All meetings of the Council shall be held in the Council Chambers, except that the Council may hold meetings at another location either to (1) accommodate those who wish to attend, or to (2) accommodate an emergency situation, or to (3) accommodate the needs of a particular meeting as determined in the sole discretion of the Council. There shall be two regular meetings of the Council in each month at a day and hour by ordinance determined, and any regular meeting may be adjourned to a date and hour certain and such adjourned meeting shall be a regular meeting for all purposes. The Council shall adopt rules for the conduct of its proceeding and shall provide by ordinance the manner in which its special meetings may be called.

Article 15 is amended to read as follows:

Article 15. Ordinances.

* * *

(g) Except as provided by General Law, or by this Charter, no action providing for the approval or amendment of the annual fiscal year budget, or for the acquisition, sale, lease, encumbrancing or disposition of real property of the City, or any interest therein, or for the levying of any tax or assessment, or for the granting of any franchise, or for the establishment or changing of zoning regulations, or for the imposing of any penalty, shall be taken except by ordinance.

* * *

(h) All ordinances subject to the right of referendum shall become effective 30 days following final passage. All other ordinances shall be effective immediately upon final passage. The provisions of this subarticle shall not affect the ability of the Council to adopt emergency measures pursuant to subarticle (d) of this Article.

Article 11 is amended to read as follows:

Article 11. The Mayor A Mayor shall be elected at each general municipal election and shall hold office for the term of two years from and after the Tuesday next succeeding the day of such election and until his successor is elected and qualified. The Mayor may receive compensation as provided by ordinance, but in no case shall the compensation exceed that amount which is permitted by State Law for General Law cities of comparable size to Pacific Grove. He shall be ineligible to hold any office or employment with the City except as a member of any board, commission or committee thereof of which he is constituted such member by General Law. In the name and on behalf of the City he shall sign all contracts, deeds, bonds, and other legal instruments in which the City is a party. The Mayor or his designate shall represent the City at all

ceremonial functions of a social or patriotic character when it is desirable or appropriate to have the City represented officially thereat. The Council shall choose one of its members to serve as Mayor pro tempore during the absence of the Mayor. The Mayor shall preside over all Council meetings and shall be entitled to one vote.

Article 19 is amended to read as follows:

Article 19. City Manager. There shall be a City Manager appointed by the affirmative vote of five-sevenths of the Council who shall be the administrative head of the City government. The City Manager shall be chosen by the Council without regard to political consideration and with reference solely to his qualifications for such office. The procedure for removal of the City Manager shall be prescribed by ordinance.

It shall not be necessary that he reside in the City at the time of his appointment, but he shall become a resident thereof within sixty days thereafter and thereafter during his incumbency actually reside in said City.

The powers and duties of the City Manager shall be:

- a. To see that all ordinances are enforced.
- b. To appoint all heads of departments, subordinate officials and employees, and remove the same, and have general supervision and control over the same.
- c. To exercise general supervision over all privately owned public utilities operating within the City so far as the same are subject to municipal control.
- d. To see that the provisions of all franchises, leases, contracts, permits and privileges granted by the City are fully observed and to report to the Council any violations thereof.
- e. To act as purchasing agent for the City. He shall know the exact condition of the treasury at all times, and shall approve all demands before the same have been allowed by the Council if he is satisfied that the money is lawfully due.
- f. To attend all meetings of the Council unless excused therefrom by three members thereof or by the Mayor.
- g. To examine, or cause to be examined, without notice, the conduct, or the official accounts and records, of any officer or employee of the City.
- h. To keep the Council advised as to the needs of the City.
- i. To have supervision over all City property, including public buildings, parks and playgrounds.
- j. To appoint such advisory boards as he may deem desirable to advise and assist him in his work provided the members of such boards shall receive no compensation.
- k. To cause a quarterly statement of all funds in the treasury to be submitted to the Council. Such statements shall be submitted not later than the first meetings in November, February, May and August.

l. To assume general control of the City government and all of its branches in case of riot, insurrection or extraordinary emergency, and to be responsible for the suppression of disorders and the restoration of normal conditions.

Charter Chapter 5—County of Santa Clara

Amendments to the Charter of the County of Santa Clara

[Filed with the Secretary of State March 22, 1989]

Section 604 is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 604

(a) The Board of Supervisors shall establish a county park fund in the county treasury. Each fiscal year through and including the 1992–93 fiscal year, the Board of Supervisors shall transfer from the general fund to the county park fund an amount of money which shall not be less than an amount estimated by the Auditor-Controller to equal the amount that would be raised for that year by a tax of one and one-half cents (\$.015) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation of all real and personal property situated within the County of Santa Clara. In addition, the Board of Supervisors shall transfer into such fund all fees and revenues generated by the operation of county parks and all other monies received from the United States Government, State of California, or any other public agency or any person for county park purposes. Any interest earned on the investment of money in the county park fund shall be credited to the fund.

(b) The Board of Supervisors shall appropriate the money in the county park fund for the acquisition, development, or acquisition and development of real property for county park purposes and for the maintenance and operation of county parks. At least 20% of the funds transferred from the general fund shall be used for the acquisition of real property for county park purposes. The remaining funds shall be appropriated for the development, maintenance, and operation of county parks.

(c) The county shall not acquire real property for any park purpose until the Board of Supervisors has determined that the acquisition is in conformity with the adopted county parks and recreation element of the general plan.

(d) This section shall be operative commencing with the 1987–88 fiscal year and shall be repealed at the end of the 1992–93 fiscal year; provided,

however, any unobligated monies remaining in the fund on June 30, 1993, shall be used only for the purposes set forth in subsection (b) of this section.

(e) The total annual appropriations limitation imposed on the county by Article XIII B of the California Constitution shall be increased by the county during the operative period of this section in an amount authorized by Section 1 of said Article XIII B and in an amount which reflects the monies transferred from the county general fund into the county park fund during each fiscal year.

(f) The intent of this section is to ensure that a minimum amount of money will be placed into the county park fund for acquisition, development, operation, and maintenance purposes. Nothing in this section shall be construed as a limitation on the amount of money the Board of Supervisors may transfer into the county park fund for county park purposes or otherwise appropriate for county park purposes.

Charter Chapter 6—City of Redondo Beach

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Redondo Beach

[Filed with the Secretary of State March 27, 1989]

Article VIII

Section 8.5 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 8.5. Mayor pro tem.

Prior to June 30 of each year, the City Council shall appoint one of its members as Mayor Pro Tempore. The Mayor Pro Tempore shall serve if the Mayor is absent or unable to act, and shall serve until the Mayor returns or is able to act. The Mayor Pro Tempore has all of the powers and duties of the Mayor, except the power of veto and the power to appoint members of Boards or Commissions. At any meeting where both the Mayor and the Mayor Pro Tempore are absent or unable to act, the City Council shall appoint one of its members to serve as acting Mayor Pro Tempore for the duration of that meeting. The Acting Mayor Pro Tempore shall have all of the powers and duties of the Mayor, except the power of veto and the power to appoint members of Boards or Commissions.

Article XV

Section 15.2 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 15.2. Membership, appointments, terms.

The members of each Board or Commission shall serve for a term of four (4) years and until his successor is appointed and qualified. The members of each Board or Commission, except the Taxation and Budget Commission, shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to the confirmation by the City Council within (60) days after the expiration of the four-year term or within sixty (60) days after a vacancy occurs. If the Mayor shall have failed to make an appointment within such period, any member of the Council may nominate an eligible person to fill such vacancy. Four (4) affirmative votes of the Council to appoint such nominated person shall result in the appointment. Any appointment to fill an unexpired term shall be for such unexpired term. The Taxation and Budget Commission shall be appointed by the City Manager and any member thereof may be removed by four (4) affirmative votes of the City Council. No person shall serve more than two (2) full terms on the same board or commission. No person shall serve simultaneously on more than one board or commission or on a board and commission.

Article 19

Section 19 is amended to read as follows:

Every contract involving an expenditure of more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for public works projects including the construction or improvements of public buildings, streets, drains, sewers, utilities, parks and playgrounds shall be let to the lowest responsible bidder after notice by publication in the official newspaper by one or more insertions, the first of which shall be published at least ten (10) days before the time for opening bids.

Public works projects of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) or less may be let to contract by informal bid procedures as shall be set by the City Council by ordinance.

Public works projects of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) or less may be performed by employees of the City by force account, by negotiated contract, or by purchase order.

The council may reject any and all bids received whenever in the opinion of the City Council:

a. The bid or bids do not strictly comply with the notice and specifications.

b. The Council finds and determines that the proposed project or purchase should be abandoned.

c. The Council determines that the materials may be purchased more reasonably on the open market and the work done cheaper by day or City labor.

d. The Council determines that the bids are higher than anticipated and a new call for bids would result in savings to the City.

e. The Council determines that it would be for the benefit of the City to delay the work or purchases for an indefinite period of time.

f. The best interests of the City would be served by a rejection of all bids.

Charter Chapter 7—City of Sunnyvale

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Sunnyvale

[Filed with the Secretary of State May 1, 1989.]

Section 1002 is amended to read as follows:

Section 1002. Appointments. Terms. Except as otherwise provided in this Article, the members of each of such boards or commissions shall be appointed, and shall be subject to removal, by motion of the City Council adopted by at least four affirmative votes.

Except as otherwise provided in this Article, the members of such boards and commissions shall serve for a term of four years and until their respective successors are appointed and qualified. Except as otherwise provided in this Article, no member of any board or commission shall be eligible to serve for more than one successive four year term nor shall such member be eligible for appointment to the same board or commission for two years after the expiration of the full term for which the member was appointed and served. Any person appointed to a board or commission to fill an unexpired term of not more than two years in length shall, however be eligible to serve one successive four year term upon the expiration of the unexpired term for which such person was appointed.

Notwithstanding the foregoing limitation on serving successive terms, members of the Planning Commission, the Personnel Board and the Board of Building Code Appeals created by Section 16.08.030 of the Sunnyvale Municipal Code as it existed on the effective date of this provision, or any successor body to the Board of Building Code Appeals, shall be eligible to serve no more than two (2) successive terms on the same board or commission. For purposes of this section, terms are deemed successive if the commencement of one term occurs less than two (2) years from the expiration of the other. No person having served two such successive terms shall be eligible for appointment to that same board or commission for two years following expiration of the second successive full term for which the member was appointed and served. For purposes of the foregoing, any person appointed to any of said boards or commissions to fill an unexpired term of not more than two years in length shall, however, be eligible to serve two successive four year terms

on the same board or commission upon expiration of the unexpired term for which such person was appointed. However, two nonconsecutive full terms shall be deemed successive if the member served an unexpired term of less than two years between the full terms, unless two years passed between the commencement or expiration of the member's partial term and either of the full terms.

No member of any board or commission shall be eligible for appointment to any other board or commission for two years after the expiration of the full term for which the member was appointed and served. Any person appointed to a board or commission to fill an unexpired term of not more than two years in length shall, however, be eligible to serve on another board or commission upon the expiration of the unexpired term for which such person was appointed, subject to the limitation to two successive terms on the same board or commission set forth above with respect to the Planning Commission, Personnel Board and Board of Building Code Appeals.

Unless otherwise provided, the members first appointed to boards and commissions composed of four members shall so classify themselves by lot that each succeeding July 1st, the term of one of their number shall expire. If the total number of the members of a board or commission to be appointed exceeds four, the classification by lot shall provide for the grouping of terms to such an extent as is necessary in order that the term of at least one member shall expire on each succeeding July 1st."

Charter Chapter 8—County of Alameda

Amendments to the Charter of the County of Alameda

[Filed with the Secretary of State March 31, 1989]

Section 66 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 66: No officer shall hold any other public office that is incompatible with his/her county office. No officer or employee shall be interested directly or indirectly in any contract or transaction with the County, or become surety upon any bond given to the County. No officer or employee shall receive any commission, money, or thing of value, or derive any profit, benefit or advantage, directly or indirectly, from or by reason of any dealings with, or service for the County, by himself/herself or otherwise, except his/her lawful compensation as such officer or employee. Any violation of the provisions of this section shall render the contract or transaction involved voidable at the option of the Board of Supervisors.

It shall be the duty of every officer and employee who shall have knowledge of any violation of the provisions of this Section immediately to report such violation to the Board of Supervisors, and failing so to do may be removed from his/her office or employment.

Charter Chapter 9—City of Alameda

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Alameda

[Filed with the Secretary of State March 30, 1989]

Section 2-7 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-7. Every vacancy in an elective office, arising otherwise than as provided in Article XX, shall be filled as follows:

(A) Vacancies caused by the election of a Councilmember to the office of Mayor shall be filled by the candidate not elected for a contested Council seat who received the highest number of votes, provided said candidate received votes from at least ten percent (10%) of the total number of voters.

(B) Vacancies occurring within six (6) months of any election shall be filled in the same manner provided by (A).

(C) All other vacancies shall be filled by the Council within 60 days or the compensation paid Councilmember pursuant to Section 2-4 shall be forfeited until the appointment is made.

(D) In the event that vacancies exist in a majority of the offices of Councilmember, such vacancies shall be filled by the two members of the Alameda School Board receiving the highest number of votes at the last election and the President of the Board of Library Trustees.

Section 10-1 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 10-1. The following Boards are hereby established:

Public Utilities Board; Civil Service Board; City Planning Board; Social Service Human Relations Board; Library Board; Historical Advisory Board.

ARTICLE XXVIII

Historical Advisory Board

Section 28-1 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28-1. BOARD CREATED—PURPOSE. In order to encourage broad community participation in the history of Alameda, and preserve and protect structures, sites and areas of historical significance in the city, there is hereby created the Alameda Historical Advisory Board, herein-

after referred to as the Board, which shall be appointed and organized, and shall have responsibilities, as hereinafter set forth.

Section 28-2 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28-2. **POWERS AND DUTIES.** The purposes, powers, procedures and duties of the Board shall be those set forth in Chapter 9 of Title X of the Alameda Municipal Code.

Section 28-3 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28-3. **ESTABLISHMENT AND COMPOSITION:** There is hereby established an Historical Advisory Board composed of five (5) members, appointed by the Alameda City Council and serving without pay. The members shall have demonstrated an interest in the history, heritage and architecture of the City of Alameda and shall be residents of the City.

Section 28-4 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28-4. **TERMS OF OFFICE:** Members shall serve for a term of four (4) years and may be re-appointed for a second term of office. Terms shall be staggered so that the number of terms expiring any year shall not differ more than one from the number of terms expiring in any other year. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed. Current members of the Commission shall have their terms decided by lot and their present terms shall not be considered.

Section 28-5 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28.5. **VACANCY AND REMOVALS:** Vacancies which may occur on the Board shall be filled by appointment of a new member by the City Council for the duration of an unexpired term of office. A person may be removed, by the City Council, for termination of residency, malfeasance or moral turpitude.

Section 28-6 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28-6. **ORGANIZATION:** The Board shall hold regular meetings on the first Thursday of each month in the City Council Chambers, unless proper notification is given for a change of location or time.

(A) The Board shall elect a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson from their membership. Each office shall be for one (1) year. However, an office holder may be returned to office. "Robert's Rules of Order" shall be used in the conduct of all meetings.

(B) Three (3) members shall constitute a quorum and a decision of the Board shall be determined by a majority vote of those members present at the meeting.

(C) A public record shall be kept by the Board of its resolutions, motions and actions. The City Manager shall provide such technical, administrative and clerical assistance as may be required.

Section 28-7 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28-7. **FEES:** All fines, fees and other monies arising out of the administration of the Historical Advisory Board of the City, or gifts or trusts therefor shall be deposited in the Historical Advisory Board Fund. The schedule of fines and fees shall be adopted by the City Council. Expenditures from the fund shall be approved by the Council.

Charter Chapter 10—City of Torrance

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Torrance

[Filed with the Secretary of State May 1, 1989]

Section 721 is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 721 ORDINANCES: PUBLICATION

At the time any ordinance is introduced to the City Council, the City Attorney shall prepare and submit a summary of the said ordinance. Upon adoption of an ordinance, the City Council may determine that the summary of the said ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation, printed, published and circulated within the City, or that the full ordinance shall be so published. In the event the City Council shall determine that a summary shall be published, it shall approve the summary as submitted or may modify it.

The City Clerk shall thereafter cause either the said ordinance, or the summary thereof approved by the City Council, to be published within fifteen (15) days after its adoption at least once in a newspaper of general circulation, printed, published and circulated within the City. If there is no such newspaper, then each such ordinance must be posted in at least three (3) public places within the City.

In the event the summary is published, the names of the Council Members voting for and against shall be shown.

Section 727 is amended to read as follows:

**SECTION 727 ORDINANCE VIOLATION: MISDEMEANOR
OR INFRACTION**

A. A violation of any ordinance of the City may be prosecuted by the authorities of the City either as a misdemeanor or an infraction, as the City Council may determine, in the name of the People of the State of California, or may be redressed by civil action, or both, at the option of said authorities.

B. For any ordinance of the City adopted after the effective date of this amended section, the City Council shall declare at the time of adoption whether the violation of such ordinance shall be a misdemeanor or an infraction or alternatively, a misdemeanor or infraction pursuant to Section 17(d) of the California Penal Code.

C. For each ordinance adopted before the effective date of this amended section, the City Council may determine, by the adoption of an ordinance or ordinances that the violation of any such previously adopted

ordinances shall be an infraction, or alternatively a misdemeanor or an infraction pursuant to Section 17(d) of the California Penal Code.

Section 728 is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 728 ORDINANCE PENALTY

The maximum fine or penalty for any violation of an ordinance of this City which is a misdemeanor, shall be the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000), or a term in the County Jail or in the City Jail for a period not exceeding six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment, or as otherwise provided in Section 36901 of the California Government Code. The maximum fine or penalty for violation of any ordinance of this City which is an infraction, or which is charged as an infraction, shall be provided in Section 36900 of the California Government Code. By ordinance or resolution of the City Council, any persons imprisoned for a violation of any ordinance may be compelled to labor on the streets or other public property or works within the City.

Section 59A is amended to read as follows:

Vice-Mayor

Section 59A. At the first regular meeting of the City Council in July or within not more than thirty days thereafter or within not more than thirty days after the first regular meeting in July following the adoption of this Charter Amendment, the City Council shall annually select a Vice-Mayor to serve a one-year term on a fiscal year basis from the duly qualified Councilmen by a majority vote of said Council.

Charter Chapter 12—City of San Diego

Amendments to the Charter of the City of San Diego

[Filed with the Secretary of State April 3, 1989.]

Section 10 is amended to read as follows:

Section 10. ELECTIONS

Elective officers of the City shall be nominated and elected by all of the electors of the City except that City Council members other than the Mayor shall be nominated and elected by the electors of the district for which elective office they are a candidate.

The regular municipal primary election shall be held on the third Tuesday in September in each odd-numbered year, and the general municipal election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of the same year, or, if either of these days falls on a legal holiday, then the election shall be held on the next succeeding day which is not a legal holiday; provided, however, that commencing with the year 1984 the elections to the offices of Mayor and City Attorney shall be held every four (4) years. The municipal primary election for these offices shall be held on the same date in each election year as the California State primary election, and the general municipal election for these offices shall be held on the same day as the California State general election for that year. All other municipal elections which may be held under this Charter shall be known as special municipal elections.

All elective officers of the City shall be nominated at the municipal primary election. In the event one candidate receives the majority of votes cast for all candidates for nomination to a particular elective office, the candidate so receiving such majority of votes shall be deemed to be and declared by the Council to be elected to such office. In the event no candidate receives a majority of votes cast as aforesaid, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for a particular elective office at said primary shall be the candidates, and only candidates, for such office and the names of only those two candidates shall be printed upon the ballots to be used at the general municipal election.

At the general municipal election held for the purpose of electing Council members other than the Mayor the electors of each Council district shall select from among the candidates chosen at the primary election in that district one candidate for the office of the Council member whose term expires the succeeding December. At the general municipal election held for the purpose of electing any other elective officer there shall be chosen by all of the electors of the whole City from among the candidates chosen at the primary one candidate to succeed any other elective officer who term expires in December succeeding the election.

After the result of an election for any office is declared, or when an appointment is made, the City Clerk, under his hand and official seal, shall issue a certificate therefor, and shall deliver the same immediately

to the person elected or appointed, and such person must within ten days after receiving such certificate file his official bond, if one be required for his office, and take and subscribe to the oath of office required of him by this Charter, which oath must be filed with the City Clerk.

Section 12 is amended to read as follows:

Section 12. THE COUNCIL

The Council shall be composed of nine (9) Council members, including the Mayor, and shall be the legislative body of the City, each of the members of which, including the Mayor, shall have the right to vote upon all questions before it.

At the municipal primary and general election in 1979, a Mayor shall be chosen by the electors for a term of five (5) years. A Mayor shall thereafter be elected for a term of four (4) years in the manner prescribed by Section 10 of this Charter. The Mayor shall hold office for the term prescribed from and after 10 a.m. the first Monday after the first day of December next succeeding his election and until his successor is elected and qualified.

Council members, other than the Mayor, shall be elected at either the municipal primary or the general municipal election held in the odd-numbered years and, except as hereinafter provided, shall hold office for the term of four (4) years from and after 10 a.m. the first Monday after the first day in December next succeeding their election and until their successors are elected and qualified. Upon any redistricting pursuant to the provisions of this Charter, incumbent Council members will continue to represent the district in which they reside, unless as a result of such redistricting more than one incumbent Council member resides within any one district, in which case the City Council may determine by lot which Council member shall represent each district. At the next municipal primary and general elections following a redistricting, Council members shall be elected from those districts not represented and from those districts represented by incumbent Council members whose terms expire as of the general election in said year. If as a result of any redistricting more than a simple majority of the City Council as redistricted shall be elected at either the municipal primary or general election next following any such redistricting, the City Council prior to any such election shall designate one or more new districts for which the initial councilmanic term shall be two (2) years in order to retain staggered terms for Council members.

Any vacancy occurring in the Council shall be filled from the District in which the vacancy occurs by appointment by the remaining Council members; but in the event that said remaining Council members fail to fill such vacancy by appointment within thirty (30) days after the vacancy occurs, they must immediately cause an election to be held to fill such vacancy; provided, however, that any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold office only until the next regular municipal election, at which date a person shall be elected to serve for the remainder of such unexpired term.

It is the duty of Council members to attend all Council meetings. The Council shall vacate the seat of any Council member who is absent from eight (8) consecutive meetings or fifty percent (50%) of any scheduled meetings within a month unless the absence thereof is excused by resolution of the Council.

Council members, including the Mayor, shall devote full time to the duties of their office and not engage in any outside employment, trade, business or profession which interferes or conflicts with those duties.

No Council member shall be eligible during the term for which he was appointed or elected to hold any other office or employment with the City, except as Mayor or City Attorney and as a member of any Board, Commission or Committee thereof, of which he is constituted such a member by general law or by this Charter.

Section 23 is amended to read as follows:

Section 23. INITIATIVE, REFERENDUM AND RECALL

The right to recall municipal officers and the powers of the initiative and referendum are hereby reserved to the people of the City. Ordinances may be initiated; and referendum may be exercised on any ordinance passed by the Council except an ordinance which by the provisions of this Charter takes effect immediately upon its passage; and any elective officer may be recalled from office. The Council shall include in the election code ordinance required to be adopted by Section 8, Article II, of this Charter, an expeditious and complete procedure for the exercise by the people of the initiative, referendum and recall, including forms of petitions; provided that the number of signatures necessary on petitions for the initiation of an ordinance for the consideration of Council shall be three percent of the registered voters of the City at the last general City election; that for the direct submission of a measure to the people it shall require a petition signed by ten percent of the registered voters of the City at the last general City election; that for a referendum upon an ordinance passed by the Council it shall require a petition signed by five percent of the registered voters of the City at the last general election; that for the recall of an elected officer who is elected by all of the electors of the City, it shall require a petition signed by fifteen percent of the registered voters of the City at the last general City election; and that for the recall of a Council member other than the Mayor it shall require a petition signed by fifteen percent of the registered voters of the Councilmanic District at the last general City election.

Charter Chapter 13—City of San Diego

Amendments to the Charter of the City of San Diego

[Filed with the Secretary of State April 3, 1989]

Section 43 (d) is amended to read as follows:

(d) CITIZENS' REVIEW BOARD ON POLICE PRACTICES.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Charter, the City Manager shall have the exclusive authority to create and establish a citizens' review board on police practices to review and evaluate citizens' complaints against members of the San Diego Police Department and the San Diego Police Department's administration of discipline arising from such complaints. The City Manager shall establish such rules and regulations as may be necessary for this board to carry out its functions; provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall be consistent with the laws of the State of California concerning citizens' complaints against peace officers. Nothing in such rules and regulations shall interfere with the board's authority to independently refer a completed citizen complaint investigation to the grand jury, district attorney, or any other governmental agency authorized by law to investigate the activities of a law enforcement agency. The board shall submit semiannual reports to the City Manager and City Council concerning its evaluation of the San Diego Police Department's investigation of citizens' complaints; provided, however, that such reports shall not disclose any information required to be kept confidential by law.

SECTION 2

NOTWITHSTANDING ANY ORDINANCE CURRENTLY IN FORCE, THE SALARY OF EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1989 SHALL BE ONE THOUSAND FORTY FIVE (\$1045.00) DOLLARS PER MONTH. THIS SALARY SHALL NOT BE CHANGED EXCEPT BY A VOTE OF THE PEOPLE AT THE TIME OF A GENERAL ELECTION.

Charter Chapter 15—City of Los Angeles

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Los Angeles

[Filed with the Secretary of State June 8, 1989.]

Section 355 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 355. (1) The head of any department not having control of its own funds may make application in writing to the City Administrative Officer for a transfer of amounts from one appropriated item to another in the budget allowance of the department of which he or she is head, or to a new item created subsequent to the adoption of the annual budget. On the approval of the City Administrative Officer, the Controller shall make such transfer; provided, however, that no transfer of an amount exceeding Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) shall be made unless approved by the Mayor and by a majority vote of the Council. In the case of requests for transfer of funds, where the amount exceeds Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), the City Administrative Officer shall investigate the same and make a report and recommendation thereon to the Mayor and the Council.

(2) The general manager of any department having control of its own funds may make application in writing to the board having control and management over such department for a transfer of amounts from one budget item to another in the annual budget of the department of which he or she is such general manager, or to a new item created subsequent to the adoption of the annual budget. On the approval of such board the Controller shall make such transfer; provided, however, that no transfer of an amount exceeding Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) shall be made unless approved in writing by the Mayor.

(3) The monetary limitations in Subsections (1) and (2) above shall commence at the beginning of the City's 1989-90 fiscal year and shall be subject in subsequent fiscal years to an annual adjustment at the beginning of the fiscal year based upon the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers for the Los Angeles area published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Charter Chapter 16—City of San Bernardino

Amendments to the Charter of the City of San Bernardino

[Filed with the Secretary of State July 3, 1989]

ARTICLE XIII

Section 234 is amended to read as follows:

Section 234. Reimbursement for Expenses. That elective officers shall be entitled to receive reimbursement for their necessary expenses while engaged on municipal business, including mileage in the City of San Bernardino, such expenses not to exceed the expenses authorized for other City employees or officers.

(a) The Mayor and Common Council shall, with all due diligence, contract with the Board of Administration of the State Employees Retirement System, and do all things necessary to provide for the participation by the City of San Bernardino and the employees thereof, in the State Employees Retirement System, with full credit being given to the employees of said City for prior service rendered.

(b) That any contract so entered into by said Mayor and Common Council with the Board of Administration of the State Employees Retirement System shall only be terminated by an ordinance adopted by a majority vote of the electorate of the City of San Bernardino.

Charter Chapter 17—City of Sacramento

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Sacramento

[Filed with the Secretary of State July 24, 1989]

ARTICLE XVII

Section 371 is amended to read as follows:

§ 371 Effective date.

At the time these amendments to the Sacramento City Charter are submitted to the electors of the city, they are intended to take effect on January 13, 1990. In the event that such amendments are adopted by the electors of the city, but for any reason are not filed with the Secretary of State on or prior to January 13, 1990, then in such event, they shall be effective on the first day of the month next following the date they are filed with the Secretary of State.

Section 372 is amended to read as follows:

§ 372 Transfer of safety members to PERS; continuation of PERS agreements.

The city council may enter into a contract with the Board of Administration of the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) for participation in that system of the city and employees who are, as of the effective date of any such contract, safety members of the Sacramento City Employees' Retirement System (SCERS). Any such contract (hereafter "new contract") shall be subject to the following conditions:

(a) The new contract shall cover all active safety employees who are members of SCERS.

(b) The existing contract with PERS for participation in that system of the city and employees whose date of city employment is on or after January 29, 1977, shall continue in effect, as amended by the city council from time to time.

(c) The new contract shall specify that active safety employees shall be transferred to PERS and become PERS local safety members.

(d) The benefits prescribed in the new contract shall, for safety employees, be as follows:

(1) 2% at age 50 with 3% cost-of-living allowance for transferred active safety SCERS employees.

(2) 2.5% at age 55 with 2% cost-of-living allowance for employees hired after the effective date of the new contract, with the statutory employee contribution rate. If the statutory employee contribution rate is other than 9%, the actual employee contribution rate shall be 9% of compensation.

(e) The procedures specified in Government Code Sections 20457 and 20458, as those sections may be amended or renumbered from time to time, relating to the holding of an election among the safety members of SCERS, shall be followed.

(f) The new contract shall specify that an allocable proportion of the assets and funds of SCERS shall be transferred to PERS pursuant to Government Code Sections 20522 and 20523, or some comparable procedure approved by the city council.

(g) The city council, if it enters into such contract, is authorized to take any action on behalf of the city required or permitted under the Public Employees' Retirement Law.

(h) The new contract shall provide that active safety employees who are SCERS members and who are transferred to PERS shall pay to PERS the same contribution rates as they were paying to SCERS, pursuant to Government Code Section 20605.5. In the event that the procedures specified in this paragraph require modification, the city council shall have the authority to adopt such modification by ordinance prior to approving a new contract with PERS.

(i) Any application for retirement or death benefit which is pending as of the effective date of these amendments to the Sacramento City

Charter shall be deemed to be an application under PERS. For purposes of this subsection (i) an application is "pending" when:

- (1) it is pending before the retirement system manager; or
- (2) an appeal relating to the application is pending before the Retirement Hearing Commission; or
- (3) the Retirement Hearing Commission has determined the appeal and the time for seeking judicial review has not expired; or
- (4) the Retirement Hearing Commission has determined the appeal and judicial review has been timely sought by any party to the appeal, and no final judgment has been entered in the Superior Court; or
- (5) a final judgment has been entered in the Superior Court and the appellate period has not expired, or timely appellate review has been sought and no final appellate judgment has been issued.

Section 373 is amended to read as follows:

§ 373 Modifications of system or PERS contract.

The city council shall secure an actuarial report of the probable cost and effect to the system, its members and the city, of any proposed change in the contribution rates or benefits under the system before enacting an ordinance or resolution relating to changes in the contribution rates or benefits under the system or before voting to submit to the electorate any proposed Charter amendment or ordinance providing for such changes. Prior to enacting any ordinance pursuant to former (1989) Charter section 400, defining or redefining the term "compensation," the city council shall secure an actuarial report of the probable cost and effect to the system, its members and the city resulting from the enactment of any such ordinance.

The city council may from time to time amend any contract with PERS. If it enters into any contract amendment, the city council is authorized to take any action on behalf of the city required or permitted under the Public Employees' Retirement Law. Prior to entering into any such amendment relating to contribution rates or benefits, the city council shall secure an actuarial report of the probable cost and effect to the city and the affected members of such amendment.

Section 374 is amended to read as follows:

§ 374 Duty to continue existing system.

Subject to section 372, the council shall provide, by ordinance or ordinances, for the continuance, as part of the retirement system, of all employee retirement plans in operation upon the effective date of this article. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this article, no such plan, or any provision thereof, shall be modified or amended except through the adoption of an ordinance approved by a majority of the voters voting upon such proposition at a general municipal election or a special municipal election called for such purpose. Allowances existing in favor of or on account of retired employees of the city at the time of the adoption of this article shall be continued in force in accordance with the provisions under which said allowances were made. Except as provided in section 379, relating to cost-of-living adjustments, nothing in this article

shall be construed as changing the status of members of such existing plans or the benefits thereunder. Notwithstanding any other provision in this article, the council shall provide by ordinance for continuation of the benefits of transferred members (as defined in former (1976) Charter section 359 and 360) pursuant to former (1976) Charter sections 359 through 366; provided, however, that any such transferred member shall have the right to elect in the manner provided by ordinance adopted by the city council, to have his or her rate of contribution, as required by former (1976) Charter section 365, based upon the rate of contribution for members of the plan established by former (1989) Charter section 399.

The council shall enact an ordinance or ordinances prescribing the conditions by which any member of the system retired for service or disability under the provisions of former (1976) Charter sections 173, 175.13 or 302 may make an election to receive a reduced retirement allowance during the member's lifetime in order that the member's surviving spouse may receive a continuation allowance. The provisions of said ordinance or ordinances shall substantially conform to the provisions of former (1989) Charter section 435(a), provided that no continuation allowance shall be payable unless one would otherwise be payable under the provisions of the Charter which apply to the member and provided further that the continuation allowance under former (1976) Charter section 173 shall be two-thirds of the member's reduced allowance.

Section 375 is amended to read as follows:

§ 375 Actuarial assumption for "equal shares retirement plan".

The ordinance or ordinances enacted by the council under section 374, providing for the continuance of the "equal shares retirement plan" created by former (1976) Charter section 302, shall provide that the board shall direct the actuary in making the actuarial investigations and evaluations required by former (1976) Charter section 300 for purposes of determining members' contribution rates to assume in addition to all other actuarial assumptions:

(a) That all persons who enter the employ of the city on or after the effective date of this article and who would have been eligible for membership in the "equal shares retirement plan" under former (1976) Charter section 302 and ordinances enacted thereunder before the effective date of this article, are members of the "equal shares retirement plan" if they would have remained in the employ of the city; and

(b) That no person who was a member of the "equal shares retirement plan" on the effective date of this article made the election provided by former (1989) Charter section 401.

Section 376 is amended to read as follows:

§ 376 City contributions for liability under prior plans.

The adoption of this article shall not alter or modify the liability of the city, the retirement system, or its members, for retirement plans which were in existence upon the effective date of this article, nor shall it alter or modify the method of funding such plans as prescribed in former

(1976) Charter sections 167 to 175.29 and 290 to 367, except as provided in former (1989) Charter sections 374, 375 and 379.

Section 377 is amended to read as follows:

§ 377 Validation of former Charter sections granting increased pensions to retire persons.

All provisions of former (1976) Charter sections 173.2, 173.3, 173.4 and 173.5 granting increased retirement allowances to or on account of retired members of the Sacramento City Employees' Retirement System shall be continued as an ordinance of the city and shall continue in effect until otherwise repealed by subsequent amendment of this Charter. The provisions of former (1976) Charter section 175.29 shall be continued in effect as an ordinance of the city, but only insofar as necessary to continue in effect cost-of-living adjustments and the funding of such adjustments which have been made under said section and were in effect prior to July 1, 1970.

Section 378 is amended to read as follows:

§ 378 City employees transferred to Sacramento County.

The city council shall enact an ordinance or ordinances prescribing the conditions according to which any and all employees of the city, who are members of the Sacramento City Employees' Retirement System and who, on or after January 1, 1963, are transferred to and become employees of Sacramento County and members of the Sacramento County Employees' Retirement System, as part of any consolidation of city functions with, or transfer of city functions to, Sacramento County, may retain their membership in the Sacramento City Employees' Retirement System. The provisions of said ordinance shall substantially conform to the provisions of former (1976) Charter section 175.27 with such modifications as are necessary to make the provisions of said section applicable to the transferred employees. This section shall not apply to any employee of the city who becomes a member of this system after the effective date of any reciprocity agreement entered into pursuant to former (1976) Charter section 367.

Section 379 is amended to read as follows:

§ 379 Cost-of living adjustment.

The city council shall enact an ordinance or ordinances prescribing the conditions according to which, as of July 1 of each year, every monthly allowance payable to or on account of a member of this system whose retirement or death as a member of this system occurred prior to July 1 of the preceding year shall be increased or decreased by a percentage of the allowance then being received. Such percentage shall approximate, to the nearest one-tenth of one percent, the percentage of annual increase or decrease, if any, in the cost-of-living during the whole of the preceding calendar year by reference to the current U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index for the San Francisco-Oakland area (or the Sacramento area, in the event the Index is established for the Sacramento area), for the whole of the preceding calendar year; provided that such increase or decrease shall not exceed

three percent of any allowance in any year, regardless of the percentage of change in cost-of-living; and provided further that no allowance shall be reduced below the amount payable at death or retirement.

In addition to the increase provided in the preceding paragraph, the city council shall enact an ordinance or ordinances prescribing the conditions according to which, as of July 1 of each year, every monthly allowance payable to or on account of a member of this system whose retirement or death as a member of this system occurred on or after July 1 of the preceding year shall be increased or decreased by a percentage of the allowance then being received. For each whole month of the preceding fiscal year during which a member was retired or for each whole month of the preceding fiscal year after the member's death, such percentage shall approximate one-twelfth of the percentage of annual increase or decrease (to the nearest one-tenth of one percent), if any, in the cost-of-living during the whole of the preceding calendar year by reference to the current U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index for the San Francisco-Oakland area (or the Sacramento area, in the event the Index is established for the Sacramento area), for the whole of the preceding calendar year; provided that such increase or decrease shall not exceed three percent of any allowance in any year, regardless of the percentage of change in cost-of-living; and provided further that no allowance shall be reduced below the amount payable at death or retirement. The provisions of this paragraph shall apply only to members whose retirement or death occurred on or after July 2, 1979.

The amount of any monthly allowance payable to a survivor or beneficiary upon death of a retired person shall be the amount which would be payable as of the date of death had payment of such allowance begun on the date of retirement, and shall thereafter be adjusted in accordance with this section.

The amount of any cost-of-living increase or decrease in any year which is in excess of the maximum annual allowance adjustment of three percent provided in this section shall be accumulated from year-to-year and included in the computation of increases or decreases in succeeding years. The provisions of this paragraph shall be applied to the allowance of individual beneficiaries by classes based upon the fiscal year in which the member retired or died, so that each allowance shall have applied to it only such increase or decrease as shall have accumulated during or after the fiscal year in which the member retired or died. No allowance shall be reduced by operation of this section below the amount payable at the time of retirement.

Increases in allowances payable pursuant to this section shall be funded by contributions of the members subject to this section and contributions of the city. The individual member's contribution shall be at the rate of 6.7% of his or her contributions (excluding additional contributions under former (1989) Charter section 404). The city's contribution shall be determined by the board in accordance with its funding policy in former

(1989) Charter section 385 at a rate required to fund the cost of increases under this section and former (1976) Charter section 354 not provided by member contributions. The board shall provide for transfer to members' accounts under this section of the portion of accumulated contributions under former (1976) Charter section 354 which were made by members thereunder becoming subject to this section.

The city council shall provide by ordinance for the continuation of benefits provided by former (1976) Charter section 354 for members of this system who have elected to receive the benefits provided by former (1976) Charter section 354. The provisions of said ordinance shall substantially conform to the provisions of former (1976) Charter section 175.29 and shall include the provisions of the second paragraph of this section; provided, however, that in fixing the rates for member contributions the board shall assume that all persons who are members of this system or are members of PERS and are in the employ of the city would continue to make contributions and receive benefits under former (1976) Charter section 354.

Section 380 is amended to read as follows:

§ 380 General definitions.

The following words and phrases as used in this article and ordinances enacted thereunder, unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context, shall mean:

“Board” shall mean the Administration, Investment and Fiscal Management Board as referred to in section 381 of this Charter.

“Charter” shall mean the Charter of the City of Sacramento.

“Commission” shall mean the Retirement Hearing Commission as referred to in section 388 of this Charter.

“Council” or “city council” shall mean the council of the City of Sacramento.

“Former (1976) Charter section” shall mean a section of this Charter as said section read on November 1, 1976 which was the date immediately preceding the date on which said section was repealed and shall further mean and refer to any section which was repealed at any earlier date, as such section read on the date immediately preceding its repeal.

“Former (1989) Charter section” shall mean a section of this Charter as said section read on June 5, 1989, which was the date immediately preceding the date on which said section was repealed.

“Member” shall mean any person who is a member of the retirement system.

“Miscellaneous member” or “miscellaneous officer or employee” shall mean any officer or employee who is a member of the retirement system and is not a safety member as defined in this section.

“Retirement system” or “system” shall mean Sacramento City Employees' Retirement System referred to in sections 372 and 374.

“Safety member” shall mean a member whose employment is, or was, as an officer or employee of the police or the fire departments of the city, whose principal duties consist of either active law enforcement or

full-time firefighting and fire prevention, respectively. "Safety member" does not include those persons employed in duties of clerical, communication, identification, repair, or other nature even though such persons may be subject to occasional call, or are occasionally called upon to perform duties within the scope of active law enforcement or full-time firefighting and fire prevention.

"Surviving spouse" shall mean the widow of a male member or the widower of a female member.

Words used in the masculine gender shall include the feminine and neuter genders and the singular shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

Section 381 is amended to read as follows:

§ 381 Administration, Investment and Fiscal Management Board.

The retirement system shall be managed by the Administration, Investment and Fiscal Management Board which shall consist of the following persons:

- (a) The city manager or designated representative;
- (b) The city finance director, or designated representative;
- (c) The city treasurer, or designated representative;
- (d) A resident of the city not connected with the government thereof, appointed by the city council, who is qualified by training and experience in the management and investment of funds; and
- (e) A resident of the city not connected with the government thereof, appointed by the city council.

A majority of members of the board shall constitute a quorum. Action by the board shall require the affirmative vote of three members, except that a lesser number may adjourn from time to time.

The two incumbent board members holding the seats described in subparagraphs (d) and (e) shall continue to serve until the expiration of the term for which they were initially appointed, or until a successor is appointed. Thereafter, such members shall be appointed for a term of three years, or until a successor is appointed.

Section 382 is amended to read as follows:

§ 382 General powers.

Subject to the provisions of sections 388 and 391, the board shall have full authority under the Charter and such general ordinances as may be lawfully adopted by the city council to maintain and manage retirement plans of this system, including but not limited to the adoption of investment standards, the fixing of contribution rates, the administration and investment of funds, the selection of investment advisors, the crediting of interest, any action required of it by the Charter and any action relating to the fiscal management of the system except those matters directly pertaining to claims for benefits, and claims for refunds under former (1989) Charter section 436, filed with the retirement system manager.

All references to the "retirement board" or "board" in former (1976) Charter sections 167 to 175.29, inclusive (and ordinances enacted to

maintain and implement the retirement plans created by said sections) and former (1976) Charter sections 290 to 367, inclusive (and ordinances enacted to maintain and implement the retirement plans created by said sections) shall mean the Administration, Investment and Fiscal Management Board; provided, however, nothing herein shall divest the Retirement Hearing Commission of the appellate powers granted to it by section 388 of this Charter; and when said commission has jurisdiction by virtue of an appeal having been lawfully taken to the commission, all references to the "retirement board" or "board" in such former Charter sections and ordinances shall mean the Retirement Hearing Commission. It is further provided that nothing herein shall divest the retirement system manager of the powers granted to him or her by section 391 of this Charter; and when said manager has jurisdiction by reason of a claim for benefits having been lawfully filed with him or her, all references to the "retirement board" or "board" in such former (1976) Charter sections and ordinances shall mean the retirement system manager.

The board may adopt rules and regulations consistent with this article to implement and carry out its provisions.

Section 383 is amended to read as follows:

§ 383. Administration and investment of funds.

The board shall have exclusive control of the administration of such fund or funds as may come into the possession of the system, provided that all investments shall be investments permissible by law for investment of trust funds (as provided in section 16040 of the California Probate Code) and shall conform to general investment standards approved by the city council. The board shall adopt general investment standards which the city council shall either approve or disapprove. The board shall employ and obtain advice and services from professional financial advisors, expert in their respective fields, such as investment counsel, trust companies or trust departments of banks, in regard to the management and investment of the funds in the system. Nothing contained in this article shall be construed to prevent the board from administering, managing and investing the funds of the system as a single fund.

Section 384 is amended to read as follows:

§ 384 Actuarial investigation.

The board shall use the services of a consulting actuary to advise it on matters relating to funding and administration of the system and to make actuarial valuations.

On or before January 1 of every third year, in accordance with the board's schedule in effect on the effective date of this article as amended, the board shall establish contribution rates for the next succeeding three-year period. Said contribution rates shall be those recommended by the actuary for the system in the actuarial report accepted by the board (except where the board rejects a report) as hereinafter set forth.

The actuary for the system either shall be an enrolled actuary under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA") or any succeeding law and a member of the American Academy of Actuaries, or

shall meet such experience and other requirements as are approximately equivalent to those applicable to an enrolled actuary under ERISA and to a member of the American Academy of Actuaries.

The actuary for the system shall carry out such valuations of the costs of the system as are required to estimate the contribution rates required to fund the system. Such valuation shall be made not less frequently than every three years. The actuary shall present to the board a valuation report covering the findings of each such valuation, which report shall be accepted by the board or rejected as hereinafter provided.

The board may reject a valuation report of the actuary of the system in its sole discretion. In the event that the board should reject a valuation report of the actuary for the system, the board shall forthwith appoint a new actuary for the system. If the new actuary for the system shall be unable to complete his or her report by the date when revised contribution rates are required to become effective or if the board should reject the new actuary's report, then the rejected valuation report by the former actuary for the system shall determine the contribution rates until the board subsequently accepts a valuation report from a new actuary for the system. The board may determine that the contribution rates adopted pursuant to the new actuary's report shall be retroactive to the date when revised contribution rates were required to become effective.

No actuarial method or assumption to be used in any actuarial study of the system shall be adopted by the board unless the actuary retained by the board recommends such method or assumption. No method shall be used in any actuarial valuation of the system unless such method is a widely used, sound, and well-recognized actuarial method which is used to establish the cost of pension plan benefits and expenses.

The actuary for the system shall develop the actuarial assumptions to be used in evaluating the costs of the system. To the extent deemed appropriate by the actuary, actuarial assumptions shall be based on the experience of the system. The actuary shall use his or her best judgment in interpreting prior experience of the system, similar experience elsewhere, trends, and opinions in his or her development of such actuarial assumptions. Each actuarial assumption shall represent as realistic an appraisal of relevant future experience (including expected inflation) at the time the assumption is made, and all assumptions considered together shall be such that their use shall permit the actuary to make an estimate of costs which he or she believes to be a reasonable one. The actuary shall submit in his or her report a full discussion of all assumptions used in the actuarial valuation.

The board shall direct the actuary to determine the amount and character of all unfunded liability of the system using widely used, sound, and well-recognized actuarial methods and shall direct the actuary to determine the contribution rates according to section 385. Neither terminal funding cost method nor the current funding (pay-as-you-go) cost method is an acceptable method, and neither of such methods shall be recommended by the actuary or adopted by the board; provided,

however, this section shall not apply to the funding of benefits for service rendered prior to April 1, 1935, or to the funding of benefits provided pursuant to the retirement plans created by former (1976) Charter sections 173, 175, 175.1, 175.13 and to benefits payable to transferred employees as provided in section 374 of this Charter.

Section 386 is amended to read as follows:

§ 386. Accounting.

As nearly as practicable, the accounting system for the retirement system shall conform to generally accepted accounting principles. The board shall cause the funds of the retirement system to be accounted for according to membership in, and funds contributed to, each plan in the system. Accumulated contributions of members shall be accounted for according to individual members' accounts. In accounting for contributions under this plan and the "equal shares retirement plan" created by former (1976) Charter section 302, the city's contributions for safety members and for miscellaneous members shall be accounted separately by group. The accounting system shall account separately for accumulated contributions of all retired and deceased members held for payment of annuities to or on account of such members and city contributions held for payment of pensions to or on account of such members.

Section 388 is amended to read as follows:

§ 388. Retirement Hearing Commission.

The Retirement Hearing Commission shall have jurisdiction only to hear appeals as hereinafter described. Any person who has a direct financial interest who is adversely affected by a decision of the retirement system manager with respect to such person's claim for benefits, or claim for a refund pursuant to former (1989) Charter section 436, shall have the right to appeal to the Retirement Hearing Commission.

Prior to the commission acting upon any appeal filed with it, the commission shall refer said appeal to an independent hearing officer. Such hearing officer shall hear the matter and make a recommendation to the commission, which recommendation shall include proposed findings of fact and a proposed decision. The commission, after reviewing the record, the proposed findings of fact and proposed decision, and taking such additional evidence as may be necessary, may adopt, modify or reject the proposed findings of fact and proposed decision.

All hearing officers shall be provided by the Office of Administrative Hearings of the State of California, or its successor in interest; provided, however, that the commission, with the approval of the city council, may prescribe rules for selecting hearing officers other than from the Office of Administrative Hearings.

The cost of securing hearing officers shall be borne by the city.

The city council shall by ordinance prescribe procedures to be followed by the commission in matters relating to its duties. The commission, with the approval of the city council, may contract to obtain such services and advice as are necessary to carry out its duties pursuant to the Charter.

Section 389 is amended to read as follows:

§ 389. Membership.

The commission shall consist of the following persons:

- (a) The city manager, or designated representative;
- (b) The city finance director, or designated representative;
- (c) A resident of the city, not a member of the board, not connected with the government of the city; and
- (d) Two miscellaneous members of the system.

A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum. Action by the commission shall require the affirmative vote of three members, except that a lesser number may adjourn from time to time.

Section 390 is amended to read as follows:

§ 390. Selection of members; terms.

(a) Selection.

Members of the commission other than the city manager or designated representative and the city finance director or designated representative, shall be selected as follows:

(1) The city resident member of the commission shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the city council; and

(2) Each employee member shall be selected under election procedures established by the city council by and from active miscellaneous members of the system

(b) Terms.

The terms of office of the commission members, other than the city manager or designated representative and the city finance director or designated representative, shall be for fixed terms of four (4) years and until their successors are selected. Provided, however, that the first term of each such member shall be as follows:

(1) The city resident member serving on the commission on the day preceding the effective date of these amendments shall serve as a commission member until the expiration of his or her current four-year term, or until a successor is selected.

(2) The miscellaneous members serving on the commission on the day preceding the effective date of these amendments shall serve as a commission member until December 31, 1993, or until a successor is selected.

(3) So as to stagger the terms of the two miscellaneous members, the first term of the second miscellaneous member shall end December 31, 1991, or until a successor is selected. Thereafter, the member selected to serve as the second miscellaneous member shall serve for the four-year fixed term.

Section 391 is amended to read as follows:

§ 391 Retirement system manager.

The city manager shall appoint a retirement system manager who shall serve as secretary of the board and secretary of the commission. Subject to the provisions of section 388, the retirement system manager shall have full authority under the Charter and such general ordinances as may be

lawfully adopted by the city council to determine when and to what extent members may receive or may continue to receive benefits of any type or kind under the retirement system. All claims for benefits payable by the Sacramento City Employees' Retirement System, and claims for refunds under former (1989) Charter section 436, shall be filed with the retirement system manager. The city council shall by ordinance prescribe procedures to be followed by the retirement system manager in matters relating to his or her duties.

The retirement system manager, with the approval of the city council, may contract to obtain such services and advice as are necessary to carry out his or her duties pursuant to this Charter.

Section 394 is amended to read as follows:

§ 394 Social security coverage.

The city council shall enact an ordinance or ordinances prescribing the conditions according to which any and all miscellaneous employees of the city may be covered under the Old Age, Survivors, Disability and Health Insurance provisions of the Social Security Act. The provisions of any ordinance or ordinances applicable to miscellaneous members of the system shall substantially conform to the provisions of former (1976) Charter section 175.12.5 with such modifications as are necessary to make the provisions of said section applicable to miscellaneous members of the "equal shares retirement plan" and the former (1989) Charter Section 399 Plan.

Section 395 is amended to read as follows:

§ 395 Reciprocity with other governmental retirement systems.

The city council may, subject to the provisions of section 373 of this article, enact ordinances and enter into agreements concerning reciprocity with the retirement systems of other governmental entities.

The ordinance may provide for a modification of rights and benefits of a member of the system because of membership in a reciprocal system similar to and under the same conditions as those provided under the County Employees' Retirement Law of 1937 and the Public Employees' Retirement Law because of membership in two or more retirement systems established by or pursuant to such laws. The ordinance shall be filed with each board administering a reciprocal system and shall become effective upon the adoption of a resolution of such administering board accepting the city system as a reciprocal system. Such modification shall apply only to a member whose termination and entry into employment occurred after such effective date.

As a condition precedent to his or her eligibility to receive reciprocal benefits under this section, the ordinance may require a member of the system to relinquish any benefits to which he or she would be entitled under ordinances enacted pursuant to section 378 of this article. The ordinance shall provide that the provisions of section 378 of this article shall not be applicable to any employee of the city who becomes a member of this system after the effective date of any reciprocity agreement entered into pursuant to former (1976) Charter section 367.

A reciprocal system, for purposes of this section, means a retirement system established under the County Employees' Retirement Law of 1937, the Public Employees' Retirement System, a retirement system of a city whose retirement ordinance contains the provisions authorized by this section, or a retirement system of a city or city and county established by its charter and providing for modification of rights and benefits similar to and under the same conditions as those provided for under this section.

Section 399 is amended to read as follows:

§ 399 Continuation of "Section 399 plan".

Subject to the requirements of section 374 of this Charter relating to enactment of ordinances providing for continuance of employee retirement plans, sections 399 through 444 of the Sacramento City Charter are repealed as of the effective date of these amendments.

Section 400 is amended to read as follows:

§ 400 Implementation; administrative remedy; saving provision.

The city council may at any time provide by ordinance for implementation of any procedure, or for any matter arising due to unforeseen circumstances, or for any remedy necessary to accomplish full transfer in an equitable manner of all active safety employees to PERS, including but not limited to such hearing procedures as may be required by Government Code Section 21026 or any other section of the Government Code, procedures for any determinations required by that code to be made by the city with respect to disability retirement, and any provisions necessary to resolve questions relating to the following categories of persons:

(a) Former SCERS safety members who have left city employment but are covered by reciprocity provisions or agreements.

(b) Former SCERS safety members who have left city employment but who elected deferred retirement and have left their contributions in the system.

(c) Former SCERS safety members who left city employment, were reemployed by the city prior to the effective date of the new contract, again became SCERS safety members, and who have redeposit rights which as of the effective date of the new contract have not been exercised so as to receive service credit for the break in service.

(d) Former SCERS safety members who left city employment and are reemployed after the effective date of the new contract, and who did not elect deferred retirement or leave their contributions in the system.

(e) Former SCERS safety members who retired for disability and who returned to city employment pursuant to former (1989) Charter section 417 as a miscellaneous employee, but who elected to retain safety membership.

In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction determines in a final judgment that all or any provision of this article or any new contract entered into with the Public Employees' Retirement System, or any

ordinance enacted pursuant to this article is invalid, the city council shall provide by ordinance for compliance with the terms and conditions of any such court order.

The city council shall provide by ordinance, prior to the effective date of any new contract, for an administrative appeal and remedy procedure to address any claim made by a member of SCERS, any employee, any retiree or any beneficiary that this article or any new contract entered into with the Public Employees' Retirement System, or any ordinance enacted pursuant to this article, is invalid for any reason. As adopted, such procedure shall be mandatory, final and binding on all parties thereto, and shall be reviewable only by court proceedings instituted pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure 1094.5.

Section 445 of the Sacramento City Charter is renumbered to become § 401.

Charter Chapter 18—City of Pomona

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Pomona

[Filed with the Secretary of State July 25, 1989]

Section 403(h) is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 403. VACANCIES.

(h) If for any reason a majority or more of the five seats on the Council are vacant, the remaining member or members of the Council shall appoint temporary members of the Council who shall serve as such until their successors are qualified, and who shall immediately proceed to cause all of such vacancies to be filled by election unless the vacancies occur less than one year before the next general municipal election. If all seats on the Council are vacant the seats shall be filled by the Board of Library Trustees as temporary members of the Council.

Section 601 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 601. OFFICE AND APPOINTMENT.

There shall be a City Administrator who shall be the chief administrative officer of the City and who shall be appointed by the affirmative vote of three members of the Council. In the selection of a City Administrator the Council shall invite applications by qualified and available persons and shall carefully consider and screen all applicants to the end that the person appointed shall be the one the Council considers to be the best qualified on the basis of executive and administrative qualifications, with special reference to experience in, and knowledge of, accepted practice in respect to the duties of the office as set forth in this Charter. The City

Administrator shall serve at the pleasure of the Council and may be removed at any time by the affirmative vote of three members of the Council. The City Administrator shall devote full time to the discharge of official duties. The City Administrator shall be paid a salary fixed by the Council, which salary shall be commensurate with the responsibilities of the office.

Section 701 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 701. OTHER OFFICERS TO BE APPOINTED BY COUNCIL.

There shall be a City Clerk, a City Attorney, and a City Treasurer, each of whom shall be appointed by the affirmative vote of three members of the Council, shall serve at the pleasure of the Council and may be removed at any time by the affirmative vote of a majority of three members of the Council.

Section 704(d) is repealed.

Section 802 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 802. QUALIFICATIONS.

Each member of a board or commission created by or pursuant to the provisions of this article, including the Board of Library Trustees, shall be a qualified elector of the City and no voting member of any such board or commission shall hold any other office or position in the City government for which compensation is paid. All appointments of members of boards and commissions, including the Board of Library Trustees, shall be made without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex or political affiliation.

Section 807(a) is repealed.

Section 807(e) is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 807. POWERS AND DUTIES OF BOARD OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES.

(e) The Council shall have the power to establish the number and compensation of all professional employees of the department. The Council shall have the power to establish the number, position classifications, qualifications and compensation of all non-professional employees of the department and the personnel merit system shall apply to such employees.

“Non-professional employees” means employees who are not required to have, for the proper performance of their duties, previous professional education or experience in the field of library operation.

Section 1112 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1112. DEMANDS.

All demands against the City except claims for damage must be in writing, must specify the date, nature and amount of each item included therein, and may be in the form of a bill, invoice, payroll or formal demand. Each such demand shall be presented to the Director of Finance within one year after the last item of the account or claim accrued, or within such shorter time as is otherwise prescribed by law. The Director of Finance shall examine and audit each such demand. If the amount thereof is legally due and there remains on the books an unexhausted

balance of an appropriation against which the same may be properly charged, the Director of Finance shall approve such demand and prepare a check on the City checking account, payable out of the proper fund and present the check to the City Treasurer for signatures. Otherwise the Director of Finance shall reject it.

Each such demand rejected by the Director of Finance shall be transmitted to the Council and the Council may overrule the objection of the Director of Finance and order a check for the payment thereof drawn and issued; provided, that if the demand is one for an item for which there does not remain an unexhausted balance of an appropriation against which the same may be properly charged, the Council shall not order a check for the payment thereof drawn and issued until it has amended or supplemented the budget, as in this Charter provided, to make an appropriation against which such claim may be properly charged.

The Council may from time to time adopt such additional regulations as it may deem necessary for the orderly processing and payment of demands which regulations may include, but need not be limited to a requirement that certain types of demands or demands over a specified amount shall be approved by the City Administrator or by the Council before a check is issued in payment thereof.

The City Treasurer shall draw and issue a check, without approval of any body or officer, for payment of the principal of or interest on municipal or other bonds payable out of funds in the City Treasury, upon presentation and surrender of the bond or coupon evidencing the same.

Section 1114 is repealed.

Charter Chapter 19—City of Sacramento

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Sacramento

[Filed with the Secretary of State October 25, 1989]

ARTICLE X

Section 152 is amended to read as follows:

§ 152. Elections.

(a) Commencing with the year 1992, the primary city election shall be held on the same date in each election year as the California statewide direct primary election, and the general city election shall be held on the same date as the California statewide general election for that year. All other elections shall be known as special elections.

To implement this provision, primary and general elections for council districts one, three, five and seven shall be held in the year 1994, and the primary and general elections for council districts two, four, six and eight, and for the office of mayor, shall be held in the year 1992.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this charter, the term of office of each person who is, on the effective date of this amendment, an incumbent of the council seat for district two, four, six or eight, or of the office of Mayor, and whose term of office would otherwise normally expire in 1991, shall be extended until a successor is elected in 1992 and has been seated.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this charter, the term of office of each person who is, on the effective date of this amendment, an incumbent of the council seat for district one, three, five or seven, and whose term of office would otherwise normally expire in 1993, shall be extended until a successor is elected in 1994 and has been seated.

(b) At the primary election, there shall be chosen by the voters of each council district with a council member whose term expires at the end of or during the same year as the election, two candidates for the office of council member from that district. When the term of office of mayor expires at the end of or during the same year as the election, there shall be chosen by the voters of the entire city at the primary election two candidates to fill the office of mayor. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Charter to the contrary, in the event that any candidate for nomination to the office of council member or the mayor shall receive a majority of the votes cast for all the candidates for nomination for such seat or office at such primary election, the candidate so receiving such majority of all votes shall be deemed to be, and declared by the city council to be, elected to such office.

(c) At the general election, the voters of each council district in which a primary election was held shall select from among the two candidates chosen at the primary election in each district one candidate to succeed to the office of the council member whose term expires at the end of or during the same year as the election. At the general election, the voters shall select from among the two candidates chosen at the primary election one candidate to succeed to the office of mayor whose term expires at the end of or during the same year as the election.

ARTICLE 1

NAME, BOUNDARIES AND POWERS OF THE CITY.

Sec. 1.1 Name.

The municipal corporation now existing and known as the "City of Monterey" shall remain and continue a body politic and corporate as at present, in fact and in law, by the name of the "City of Monterey," and by such name shall have perpetual succession.

Sec. 1.2 Boundaries.

The boundaries of the City of Monterey shall continue as now established until changed in some manner authorized by law.

Sec. 1.3 Rights and Liabilities.

The City of Monterey shall remain vested with and continue to have, hold and enjoy, all property, rights or property, and rights of action of every nature and description now pertaining to said municipality and is hereby declared to be the successor to same. No right, liability, pending suit or prosecution on behalf of, or against, the City shall be affected by the adoption of, or any amendment to this Charter. All contracts entered into by the City prior to the taking effect of this Charter, or any amendment hereto, shall continue in full force and effect.

Sec. 1.4 Powers.

The City shall have all powers to make and enforce all laws and regulations with respect to its municipal affairs, subject only to such limitations and restrictions as may be provided in this Charter and in the Constitution of the State of California. The City may exercise any right, power, or privilege granted to municipal corporations by the general laws of the State of California.

Sec. 1.5 Tidelands Inalienable.

The City may lease its tidelands, subject to the terms and conditions of the grant, but they shall be otherwise inalienable.

ARTICLE 2.

ELECTIONS, INITIATIVE, REFERENDUM AND RECALL.

Sec. 2.1 Elective Officers.

Elective officers of the City of Monterey shall be a Mayor and four (4) Councilmembers.

Sec. 2.2 Eligibility of Elective Officers.

No person shall be eligible for election to, or hold, any elective office of the City unless he/she shall have been a resident and elector of the City for the period of time and have such other qualifications as are prescribed by State law for Councilmembers of General Law Cities.

Sec. 2.3 Elections.

General Municipal elections shall be held in said city on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in each even-numbered year under and pursuant to the provisions of the General Laws of the State of California so far as they may be applicable, except as otherwise

may be provided herein. All other municipal elections may be held by authority of this Charter, ordinance, or the general laws of the State of California. Elections to incur bonded indebtedness, to impose special assessments, or to annex territory shall be held in conformance with the general laws of the State.

Sec. 2.4 Canvass of Returns.

The Council of said City shall meet at its usual meeting place at the first regular or adjourned meeting following certification of the election results of any municipal election and duly canvass the returns and declare the results thereof. The Council shall install any newly-elected officers as soon after said canvass as possible, provided, however, that no officer shall be installed prior to filing by said officer of all disclosure or other statements required by ordinance or State law.

Sec. 2.5 Vacancies.

A vacancy in an elective office shall be filled by appointment by the Council, such appointee to hold office until the next General Municipal Election and until a successor is elected and installed. Should the Council fail to fill any such vacancy within forty (40) days after the same occurs, then it shall be filled by appointment by the mayor. Such successor shall be elected for the unexpired term of his/her predecessor at the General Municipal Election next succeeding such appointment.

If the offices of a majority or more of the Council becomes vacant, the City Clerk shall call a Special Municipal Election to fill said vacancies, which election shall be held within sixty (60) days of the existence of said vacancies. Each candidate elected at such election shall hold office for the unexpired term of his/her predecessor. The candidate or candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be deemed to fill the longest unexpired term or terms. Said vacancies, whether occurring by recall, resignation, legal disability or physical disability, shall be filled by the persons holding the following offices and in the following order: chairperson of the Planning Commission, Chairperson of the Parks and Recreation Commission, Chairperson of the Library Board of Trustees. Such persons shall serve as interim elective officers until said vacancies are filled by election and the newly elected officers are installed. Said persons shall be sworn in by the City Clerk in the same manner and form as elected officers as soon as possible after the vacancy or vacancies occur and shall have all the rights, duties and obligations of an elected officer during said interim appointment.

In the event of a vacancy in the office of the Mayor, the remaining elective officers, including any interim elective officers appointed pursuant to this Section, shall elect one of their number to serve as Mayor during the period of said vacancy.

Sec. 2.6 Initiative, Referendum and Recall.

Unless otherwise provided by ordinance hereafter enacted, the provisions of the General Laws of the State of California, as the same now exist or may hereafter be amended, governing the initiative and referendum,

and the recall of municipal officers shall apply in the City insofar as such provisions of the General Laws are not in conflict with this Charter.

With regard to recall, any elective officers may be recalled from office under and in pursuance of the provisions of the Constitution and general laws, provided, however, that in no case shall candidates be elected to fill the place or places of any officer sought to be recalled, but in case of such recall such office shall be deemed vacant and shall be filled by appointment as set forth in Section 2.5.

Sec. 2.7 Voter Approval Required for Eminent Domain Actions to Acquire Property for Re-Sale in Redevelopment Projects.

In any Redevelopment Project adopted or substantially amended after May 1, 1983, neither the City nor Redevelopment Agency shall by eminent domain proceedings acquire property within a Redevelopment Project for the purpose of re-sale for private redevelopment without first submitting to and receiving the approval of the electorate.

This section shall not prohibit either the City or Redevelopment Agency from acquiring property by eminent domain proceedings for any other public purpose nor shall it prohibit either the City or Agency from acquiring property within a Redevelopment Project from a willing seller for any purpose.

The proposal to acquire property within a Redevelopment Project for re-sale to private redevelopers shall be placed before the electorate at either a general election or special election called for that purpose.

Sec. 2.8 Term of Office of Councilmember Filing as a Candidate for Mayor.

Terms of office for councilmembers who file for the office of Mayor shall automatically expire on the date the next municipal election is held after filing. The filing period for candidates to fill the councilmember's term shall be extended an additional five (5) days.

ARTICLE 3.

THE MAYOR.

Sec. 3.1 The Mayor.

The Mayor shall be a member of the City Council and entitled to vote on all matters coming before the Council. He/she shall preside at all meetings of the City Council and perform such other duties as prescribed by the Council consistent with the office of Mayor. The Mayor shall execute all official documents of the City as required by law or order and shall represent the City at ceremonial functions as he/she deems appropriate.

A Mayor shall be elected at each general municipal election and shall hold office for the term of two (2) years from and after his/her installation and until his/her successor is elected and qualified. The Mayor shall be ineligible to hold any other office or employment with the

City except as a member of any board, commission or committee thereof of or to which he/she is constituted such member by general law or appointed to by the Council.

Sec. 3.2 Vice-Mayor.

The Council shall select one of its members to serve as Vice-Mayor. The Vice-Mayor shall serve in the absence or incapacity of the Mayor and shall have all rights and duties of the Mayor in his/her absence. The term of Vice-Mayor shall be coterminous with that of the Mayor unless a specific term is established by the City Council. The Vice-Mayor shall serve at the pleasure of the City Council.

ARTICLE 4.

CITY COUNCIL.

Sec. 4.1 The Council.

The Council shall be comprised of the Mayor and four (4) Councilmembers and shall be the legislative body of the City.

Two Councilmembers shall be elected at each General Municipal Election and shall hold office for the term of four (4) years from and after their installation in office and until their successors are elected and qualified.

Councilmembers shall not be eligible to hold any other office or employment with the City except as members of Boards, Commissions and other agencies of which they are constituted such a member by General Law or by appointment of the Mayor and/or Council.

The Council may, by ordinance, provide for the compensation of Councilmembers provided that said compensation shall not exceed the amount permitted by State Law for General Law Cities of the same population; may provide for additional compensation for the Mayor; and may provide that increases shall take effect during the term of office of Councilmembers.

Monies paid by other agencies to Councilmembers serving on the legislative body of said agencies shall not be considered compensation for the purposes of this section.

No former Mayor or Councilmember shall hold any compensated appointive City office or regular City employment until one (1) year after the expiration of the term for which he/she was elected to the Council.

Sec. 4.2 Meetings of the Council.

The Council shall provide by ordinance for the conduct, time and place of holding its meetings and the manner in which its special meetings may be called, provided, however, that there shall be at least one (1) regular meeting each month.

Sec. 4.3 Quorum.

A majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a lesser number may adjourn from time to time and postpone the consideration of or action upon pending business in like manner.

Sec. 4.4 Legislation.

In addition to other acts required by law or specific provisions of this Charter to be done by ordinance, acts which provide for the following shall be done by ordinance:

(a) Provide for a criminal or civil penalty or adopt any rule or regulation for violation of which a criminal or civil penalty is imposed.

(b) Levy any tax.

(c) Regulate the use of property or regulate the conduct of persons.

No ordinance or resolution shall be passed without receiving the affirmative vote of at least three (3) members of the Council.

No ordinance shall be passed by the Council on the day of its introduction, or within five (5) days thereafter, or at any time other than a regular, adjourned, or special meeting or until its publication at least three (3) days before its adoption. In the case of an ordinance being amended before its adoption as amended, and where such amendment is made for the correction of clerical error or omission of form only, then such ordinance need not be republished.

Ordinances and resolutions need not be read either in whole or in part prior to their adoption except as may be otherwise required by ordinance or general law.

An ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its final passage except an ordinance shall take effect immediately if it is an ordinance:

(a) Relating to an election.

(b) For the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety, containing a declaration of the facts constituting the urgency and is passed by a four-fifths ($\frac{4}{5}$) vote of the Council.

(c) Relating to taxes for the usual and current expenses of the City.

(d) Covered by particular provisions of law prescribing the manner of its passage and adoption.

No ordinance, or portion thereof, shall be amended or repealed except by ordinance.

All ordinances and resolutions shall be signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

Sec. 4.5 Appointment and Removal of Officers, Employees and Appointees.

(a) Appointment of officers and employees:

1. The Council shall appoint a City Manager and a City Attorney by affirmative vote of three (3) of its members. The City Council may retain the City Manager and City Attorney by contract setting forth the terms and conditions of employment. In the event said contract provides

conditions of employment contrary to this Charter, or any ordinance, rule or regulations, provided said provisions are lawful, the provisions of said contract shall prevail.

In addition to the City Manager and City Attorney, the Council shall designate and determine the compensation of all employees. The City Council may authorize the City Manager to employ said officers by contract.

2. The Council shall appoint by affirmative vote of three (3) of its members, all members of municipal boards, commissions and committees and representatives of the City to other agencies.

3. The City Manager shall appoint all other officers and employees of the City except as otherwise herein provided.

4. The City Attorney shall appoint all officers and employees of the City Attorney's Department.

(b) Removal of officers:

1. The Council may remove any of its appointees at pleasure without cause stated or hearing had by affirmative vote of four (4) members, and may remove any of its appointees for cause after a hearing by affirmative vote of three (3) of its members.

2. The City Manager may remove any of the appointive officers appointed by him/her at pleasure, provided that:

(i) Said officer is served with reasonable written notice of the reason for such removal.

(ii) Said officer shall have the right of appeal to the City Council, the procedures for which shall be established by ordinance or resolution. The decision of the City Council shall be final.

(c) Removal of subordinate officers and employees:

1. The City Manager and City Attorney may remove all other officers and employees appointed by them only for cause. An officer or employee removed for cause shall have the right of appeal to, and a hearing before the City Council. The procedures for removal for cause, appeal and hearing shall be established by ordinance or resolution.

(d) Limitations on removals:

1. The Council shall not remove any officers within three (3) months next succeeding a general municipal election except for cause.

2. The City Manager shall not remove any chief appointive officer within three (3) months next succeeding his/her appointment except for cause.

(e) Suspension in lieu of removal:

1. Any officer or employee, in lieu of removal, may be suspended up to thirty (30) days with or without pay for the same reasons or on the same grounds and on the same procedure as herein provided for removal.

Sec. 4.6 Residential Qualification.

All voting members of City boards and commissions shall be residents of the City of Monterey.

Sec. 4.7 Interference With or By City Manager.

Neither the Council nor any of its members shall in any manner dictate the appointment or removal of any City administrative officers or employees whom the City Manager or any of his/her subordinates are empowered to appoint, but the Council may express its views and fully and freely discuss with the City Manager anything pertaining to appointment and removal of such officers and employees.

The Council or its members shall deal with City officers and employees who are subject to the direction and supervision of the City Manager or the City Attorney solely through the City Manager or the City Attorney, and neither the Council nor its members shall give orders to any subordinate officer or employee, either publicly or privately.

No elective officer, nor candidate for elective officer of the City, shall solicit support for nomination or election from any salaried officer, appointee or employee of the City, except members of boards, commissions and committees appointed by the City Council. Support includes but is not limited to financial contribution, services or endorsement.

Sec. 4.8 Contract Work.

The construction, reconstruction or improvement of any public works in excess of \$25,000.00, including the supplying of materials, supplies or labor, shall be let by contract to the lowest responsible bidder after public bidding. The Council shall, by ordinance, establish the procedures for public bidding, contracting for public works less than \$25,000.00 and the purchase of equipment, supplies, materials or services.

The \$25,000.00 limit set forth above shall be increased by \$5,000.00 on July 1, 1995 and by the same amount on July 1st of each fifth year thereafter.

The City may contract with other governmental agencies or with public utility companies for the erection of public works, or for the purchase of equipment, supplies, materials or services where it finds that there is substantial compliance with the City's bidding and/or purchasing procedures.

In the event of an emergency caused by fire, flood, earthquake, storm or other similar disaster, the Mayor or the City Manager may order the suspension of the purchasing requirements and purchase such supplies, materials or services as may be necessary to meet the emergency. The Council shall, if possible, meet within seventy-two (72) hours to consider further suspension of the purchasing procedures for a period of time necessary to meet the emergency condition.

Sec. 4.9 Membership on Intergovernmental Agencies.

Councilmembers may be members of the governing body of any board, commission, agency or other intergovernmental agency to which the City is entitled to appoint a representative. A Councilmember shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the City Council.

Sec. 4.10 Adoption of Codes by Reference.

Any code or codification of ordinances may be adopted by reference. To adopt a code by reference the Council shall pass to print an ordinance stating the general contents of the code to be adopted, the place or places

where said code is available for public inspection and the date, time and place where interested parties may appear before the Council and speak for or against the adoption of the code. The ordinance shall be published in the manner provided for all ordinances. The code need not be published. Following public testimony, the Council may adopt the code, reject it, or adopt the code with modifications. Once adopted, a code may be amended in the same manner as provided for the amendment of an ordinance.

ARTICLE 5.

CITY MANAGER AND ADMINISTRATIVE DEPARTMENT.

Sec. 5.1 City Manager.

The Council shall select the City Manager who shall serve at the pleasure of the City Council, except as otherwise provided by contract. The City Manager shall be the administrative head of the City and shall have such powers as are necessary to carry out and enforce all ordinances, resolutions, rules and directions of the City Council and the general laws of the State of California applicable to the City.

The City Manager shall appoint and remove all officers and employees of the City except those appointed by the City Council, in accordance with the rules and regulations established by the City Council for appointment and removal.

The City Manager may appoint an Assistant City Manager who shall have all of the powers and duties of the City Manager in the event of the City Manager's absence or disability. In the absence of the Assistant City Manager and the City Manager, the Council may appoint an Interim City Manager to act during the absence or disability of the City Manager.

The City Manager may appoint a Secretary to the City Manager, who shall serve at the pleasure of the City Manager, the provision of this Charter or any ordinance, resolution or regulation pertaining to the removal of officers and employees notwithstanding.

The City Manager shall appoint a City Clerk who shall maintain the official records of the City and perform such other duties as required.

Sec. 5.2 City Attorney.

The Council shall select the City Attorney who shall serve at the pleasure of the City Council, except as otherwise provided by contract. The City Attorney shall be the legal advisor to the City Council, its Boards and Commissions and the officers and employees of the City on all matters concerning the municipal affairs of the City, and shall have such other duties and responsibilities as prescribed by the City Council. The City Attorney shall at all times be licensed to practice law in the State of California.

Sec. 5.3 Compensation of Officers and Employees.

The compensation of all officers and employees of the City shall be fixed, increased or changed by ordinance or resolution, adopted by the four-fifths ($\frac{4}{5}$) vote of the Council.

ARTICLE 6.

FISCAL ADMINISTRATION.

Sec. 6.1 Fiscal Year.

The fiscal year of the City shall commence on the 1st day of July of each year, or at such other time as may be fixed by ordinance.

Sec. 6.2 Annual Financial Audit.

The City shall employ a certified public accountant annually to investigate the accounts and transactions of all City officers and employees having the collection, custody or disbursement of public money or property, or the power to approve, allow or audit demands on the City treasury. As part of the annual audit, the money and securities in the City treasury shall be verified.

Sec. 6.3 Budget.

Based upon the recommendation of the City Manager, the City Council shall adopt a budget estimating the revenues and expenditures of the City for the period covered.

Sec. 6.4 Leases of City Property.

All leases of City property shall be at fair market rent as established by sound appraisal practices. All leases in excess of one (1) year shall contain a provision for the increase or reconsideration of rent at fair market value in accordance with accepted commercial lease practices.

Sec. 6.5 Levy and Collection of Taxes.

The City Council shall have the power to levy and collect any tax that may be lawful to levy for municipal purposes including but not limited to assessments and taxes to retire bonded debt.

Sec. 6.6 Neighborhood and Community Improvement Program.

a) Purpose: The purpose of the Neighborhood and Community Improvement Program is to insure that a minimum portion of the City's annual budget is expended to improve the residential neighborhoods of the City and to provide for capital projects of community-wide benefit.

b) Capital Projects Defined: Capital Projects include, but are not limited to, streets, storm drains, sewers, sidewalks, lighting, traffic control devices, landscaping and beautification, parks, recreational facilities and other public buildings. Capital Projects do not include ordinary services.

c) Annual Budget: As part of the annual budget, the City Council shall appropriate at least sixteen percent (16%) of the Transient Occupancy Tax estimated to be collected during the fiscal year to be expended on Neighborhood and Community Improvements. If the Council determines that there are insufficient funds available to provide for the ordinary and necessary services in any budget year, they may, by an affirmative vote of four (4) members of the City Council, reduce the amount to be appropriated for Neighborhood and Community Improvements.

d) Neighborhood Improvement Program Committee: The City Council shall appoint at least one (1) resident from each residential neighborhood to the Neighborhood Improvement Program Committee. The

Committee shall recommend a list of capital improvements desired to be accomplished in each neighborhood.

Recommendations may include multi-year projects and funding.

e) Council Action: From the recommendations of the Neighborhood Improvement Program Committee the Council shall include a Neighborhood Improvement Program in the annual budget. The determination of the projects, priorities and expenditures shall be within the sound discretion of the City Council.

ARTICLE 7.

PUBLIC LIBRARY.

Sec. 7.1 Public Library and Board of Library Trustees.

There shall be a Board of Library Trustees consisting of five (5) members to be appointed by the Council. Terms of Library Trustees shall be four (4) years. The terms shall be staggered.

The Board of Library Trustees shall have the following powers, duties, and responsibilities:

(a) To select all books, magazines, periodicals, recordings, films, pictures, photographs, programs received through electronic media, documents, or any other cultural items for circulation from or study in the Monterey Public Library.

(b) To make and enforce such bylaws, rules and regulations as it may deem necessary for the administration of the Monterey Public Library program.

(c) To appoint and remove the Library Director who shall be the department head, and any such other library personnel as may be necessary for the operation of the library program.

(d) To perform such additional duties and have such additional powers as may be prescribed by ordinance or resolution.

There shall be maintained a library trust fund which shall consist of the present library trust fund together with all gifts, devises or bequests received for the use of the library hereafter and all miscellaneous revenues of the library, except fines. Expenditures from said fund shall be made by the Council for such library purposes as are requested by the Library Board and as are in conformity with the conditions of any such gifts, devises, or bequests.

ARTICLE 8.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Sec. 8.1 Visitor Accommodation Zone.

There is hereby established a Visitor Accommodation Zone. No hotel, motel, bed and breakfast, or other overnight accommodation facilities, as more precisely defined in Appendix A shall be permitted except in said zone. Ancillary facilities such as conference and meeting rooms and recreational facilities for guests may be constructed on property adjacent to said VAF zone if the Zoning Ordinance permits said uses.

Appendix A entitled "Visitor Accommodation Facility (VAF) Zone" sets forth the development standards, uses and procedures for said zone and is hereby made a part of this Charter.

Appendix B, consisting of the following seven (7) zoning maps, designates those parcels which are zoned VAF: 1. Cannery Row; 2. Downtown; 3. Munrus Avenue Area; 4. Aguajito Area; 5. Fremont; 6. Del Monte Avenue; 7. Highway 68. Appendix B is hereby made a part of this Charter. Said maps shall be as amended through November 4, 1986.

Visitor Accommodation Facilities shall not be developed on any parcel except those zoned VAF by Appendix B including parcels subsequently annexed to the City.

The Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to delete Visitor Accommodation Facilities as a principal or conditional use on all other parcels.

The development standards and related matters may be amended, or additional parcels zoned VAF only by amendment of Appendices A and B of this Charter."

APPENDIX A TO SECTION 8.1

ARTICLE 21 A.

VISITOR ACCOMMODATION FACILITY (VAF) ZONE

Sec. 38-147A. Description and Purpose.

A zone which establishes the requirements for development of visitor accommodation facilities in the City of Monterey. A visitor accommodation facility is defined as any building, portion of any building, or group of buildings in which there are guest rooms or suites, including house-keeping units, for transient guests where lodging with or without meals is provided in the Zoning Ordinance. Visitor accommodation facilities are those required to pay transient occupancy tax by Article 3, Chapter 35 of this code. Visitor accommodation facilities include limited-occupancy visitor accommodations as defined in Section 38-151A below. Visitor accommodation facilities include hotels, motels, bed and breakfast inns, and hostels.

Sec. 38-148A. Principal Permitted Uses.

(a) None.

Sec. 38-149A. Accessory Uses.

(a) Commercial incidental uses to a visitor accommodation facility, such as sale of candy, magazines, sundries, and similar items; beauty and barber shops; recreation facilities to serve guests and employees; living accommodations for manager or caretaker; facilities for conferences and meetings; commercial restaurant businesses, clothes and cleaning pick-up agency; and related personal visitor sales and services when related to and developed as an incidental part of a visitor accommodation facility.

Sec. 38-150A. Conditional Uses.

(a) Visitor accommodation facilities as defined in Section 38-147A above.

(b) Any conditions of an existing Use Permit or Special Permit shall remain in force.

Sec. 38-151A. Property Development Standards.

(a) Hotels and Motels.

1. Visitor accommodation facilities shall contain not less than one thousand (1,000) square feet of site area per sleeping unit for one-story units, and eight hundred (800) square feet of site area per sleeping unit for structures of two (2) stories and over, provided, however, that the Planning Commission or City Council may, as a part of the Use Permit application, consider a density of up to six hundred (600) square feet of site area per sleeping unit for structures containing three (3) stories or more. The exception to these standards may be those standards which are specified in an adopted area or coastal plan in the City of Monterey.

(b) Bed and Breakfast Inns (Limited-Occupancy Visitor Accommodation Facilities).

The following standards are adopted to establish minimum standards for approval of Limited-Occupancy Visitor Accommodation Facilities in residential areas (Planning Commission Resolution No. 83-05). Compliance by an applicant does not, in any manner, ensure approval, and each application will be judged on its individual merits by the Planning Commission based on the criteria set forth herein and in the Zoning Ordinance, and compatibility with the surrounding neighborhood.

1. Limited-Occupancy Visitor Accommodation Facilities are hereby defined as the conversion of single-family residences to country inns or bed and breakfast types of use, whereby limited numbers of visitors may obtain accommodations and a single meal upon the premises. Only existing single-family dwellings that present unique historical or architectural features shall be considered as limited-occupancy visitor accommodation facilities.

2. Minimum site area is one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) acre.

3. The number of guest rooms shall be limited to one per five thousand (5,000) square feet of land area, provided, however, that in no event shall the number of permissible rental rooms exceed ten (10). This shall not include manager quarters or accommodations.

4. Off-street parking: one (1) per guest room, plus two (2) for the resident family. If over eight (8) rooms, add employee parking; if ten (10) rooms, add visitor parking.

5. The property owner shall occupy and manage the limited-occupancy visitor accommodation facility.

6. Breakfast to guests shall be the only meal and persons served.

7. No long term rental of rooms shall be permitted. The maximum stay for guests shall not exceed fourteen (14) days.

8. The Architectural Review Committee and the Site Plan Review Committee shall review the proposed limited-occupancy visitor accommodation facility prior to Planning Commission review, and their recommendations shall be considered by the Planning Commission in imposing Conditions of Approval on the project.

9. Signs: The maximum sign area shall not exceed four (4) square feet and shall be approved by the Architectural Review Committee. Wording such as "motel," "hotel," "motor hotel," "lodge," etc. will not be permitted. The establishment shall be referred to as an "INN." The sign may only be externally illuminated.

10. No cooking facilities shall be allowed in the guest rooms.

11. Applications shall be subject to a two-year (2 year) review period as established by the Planning Commission.

12. If the application becomes objectionable at any time, the application may be reopened for possible revocation.

(c) Hostels.

Hostel is defined as a visitor facility providing short-term, dormitory type, visitor accommodations. The City Council may, by ordinance, permit the construction, operation and maintenance of one (1) hostel in any area of the City not principally zoned for residential use.

(d) When computing the number of units permitted under the above provisions, all areas on the site to be devoted to non-visitor accommodation facility uses, such as restaurants, cocktail lounges, retail, and service stores, service stations, and similar uses, including related parking areas as required by this Chapter, shall be deducted from the gross site area.

(e) The buildings shall not occupy, in the aggregate, more than thirty percent (30%) of the area of the lot.

(f) All areas not used for access, parking, circulation, buildings, and services shall be completely and permanently landscaped, and the entire site maintained in good condition.

(g) All buildings shall be located not less than ten (10) feet from all lot lines and shall respect all zoning district setback lines.

(h) Off-street parking shall be provided as stipulated in the Zoning Ordinance. However, the Planning Commission may adjust the parking requirements whenever restaurants, bars and night clubs, auditoriums, ballrooms, theaters, assembly halls, or meeting rooms occur on the same site with visitor accommodation facility complexes. There shall be no reduction in the parking requirements for visitor accommodation facilities. The parking requirements of other uses outlined above shall not be adjusted more than fifty percent (50%). The Planning Commission may allow such reductions when it finds:

1. That all required parking to be provided for all proposed uses will occupy the same parking facility.

2. That the proposed uses and proposed parking facilities are to be located on the same site in one ownership.

3. That if the proposed uses and proposed parking facilities are not to be located on the same site, that parking may be located on adjacent sites if in the same ownership.

(i) Any visitor accommodation facility may be expanded, provided it meets the above development standards. Any existing facility which

exceeds the above standards, and is substantially destroyed by fire, earthquake, or other natural disaster may be reconstructed substantially as it was prior to said destruction.

(j) Accessory facilities on property zoned VAF may be added to visitor accommodation facilities with a Use Permit.

(k) All proposals for structural remodeling, as defined in the Zoning Ordinance, shall be reviewed by the Planning Commission. Ordinary non-structural repairs, alterations, or maintenance shall be reviewed by the Architectural Review Committee. The procedures for said review, including the right of appeal, shall be the same as for a Use Permit.

(l) Development Review Committee and Architectural Review Committee approval is required for all proposed visitor accommodation facility expansions.

(m) All remodelings of existing visitor accommodation facilities and accessory uses appurtenant thereof which involves changes in exterior appearance shall be subject to review and approval by the Architectural Review Committee, including exterior landscaping changes.”

Charter Chapter 21—City of Modesto

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Modesto

[Filed with Secretary of State December 4, 1989.]

SECTION 500. ENUMERATION. The elective officers of the City of Modesto shall be a Mayor and six (6) Councilmembers.

The Council shall consist of the Mayor and six (6) Councilmembers, each of whom, including the Mayor, shall have the right to vote on all questions coming before the Council.

SECTION 501. ELECTED AT LARGE. The Mayor and Councilmembers shall be elected at the regular municipal election on a general ticket from the City at large.

SECTION 600. TERM OF OFFICE. The Mayor shall hold office for a term of four (4) years from and after the first Tuesday following the Mayor's election and until the Mayor's successor is qualified and elected.

SECTION 601. POWERS AND DUTIES. The Mayor shall be recognized as the official head of the City for all political, representative and ceremonial purposes, and by the Governor for military purposes. In time of public danger or emergency, the Mayor may, with the consent of the Council, or pending a meeting of the Council, direct the administration of the City Government through the City Manager.

The Mayor shall be charged with the duty of making recommendations to the Council on all major matters of policy and program which require Council decision. The Mayor shall have the primary, but not exclusive, responsibility for interpreting the policies, programs and needs of the City government to the community. The Mayor may also, on the Mayor's own account, as may each individual Councilmember, inform the community on any matters of policy or program which the Mayor believes the welfare of the community makes necessary.

It shall be the duty of the Mayor to represent the Council in its relationships with civic groups within the City, and by direction of the Council, the Mayor shall represent the City in its relationships with other governmental agencies on matters of policy and program.

The Mayor shall preside at meetings of the Council and shall have a vote as a member of the Council. The Mayor shall have no power to veto any ordinance or resolution adopted by the Council.

The Mayor shall have authority to preserve order at all Council meetings and to remove or cause the removal of any person from any meeting of the Council for disorderly conduct, to enforce the rules of the Council, and to determine the order of business under the rules of the Council. The Mayor shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be consistent with the Mayor's office or as may be granted to the Mayor by the Council not inconsistent with this Charter.

Nothing in this section shall be construed in any way as an infringement or limitation on the powers and duties of the City Manager as chief administrative officer and head of the administrative branch of the City government as prescribed in other sections of this Charter.

SECTION 700. COUNCILMEMBERS. TERM OF OFFICE. Except as otherwise provided in this Charter, the members of the Council shall hold office for a term of four (4) years from and after the first Tuesday following their election. The members of the Council in office at the time this Charter takes effect shall continue in office until the expiration of their terms or until their successors are elected and qualified.

Three (3) Councilmembers shall be elected at the regular municipal election in 1963 and at each regular municipal election thereafter.

A Mayor shall be elected at the regular municipal election in 1963 and at each alternate regular municipal election thereafter.

If a tie vote makes it impossible to determine which of two (2) or more candidates has been elected, said tie shall be settled by the drawing of

lots, the procedure for which shall be determined by the Council. Each member of the Council shall have the right to vote on all matters coming before the Council.

Each elective office shall be deemed a separate office to be filled at any election. The City Clerk shall designate each such elective office by an appropriate descriptive designation. No candidate shall file for more than one (1) elective office; and no incumbent member of the Council shall run for a seat other than that which the member holds, except that any incumbent member of the Council may run for the seat of Mayor, and an incumbent Mayor may run for the seat of Mayor or for any other seat on the Council. Such designation shall be used on all nomination papers, certificates of election and all election papers referring to the office. After election, the designation shall have no further significance except for the purpose of designating incumbency.

SECTION 701. ELIGIBILITY. No person shall be eligible to be nominated for or to hold office as a member of the Council or as Mayor unless the person is and shall have been for at least thirty (30) days preceding the person's nomination or appointment a resident and registered elector of the City of Modesto or of territory annexed thereto.

SECTION 702. VACANCIES. If a vacancy shall occur in the office of Mayor or Councilmember, the Council shall forthwith appoint a person to fill such vacancy. Said appointee shall possess such qualifications for eligibility as are set forth in Section 701 of this Article and shall hold office until a successor is duly elected and qualified. Such successor shall be chosen at the next regular municipal election, or as otherwise may be required by recall proceedings instituted involving the office of Mayor or a Councilmember.

In the event that the Council shall fail to fill a vacancy by appointment within thirty (30) days after such office shall have become vacant, it shall forthwith cause an election to be held to fill such vacancy.

SECTION 704. COUNCILMEMBER TO HOLD NO OTHER OFFICE. No member of the Council shall hold any other municipal office or hold any office or employment the compensation of which is paid out of the municipal moneys, nor be elected or appointed to any office created or the compensation of which is increased by the Council while the person is a member thereof, until one (1) year after the expiration of the term for which the member was elected.

SECTION 708. SPECIAL MEETINGS. A special meeting may be ordered at any time by the Mayor whenever in the Mayor's opinion the public business may require it, or upon the written request of any four (4) members of the Council. Whenever a special meeting shall be called, the City Clerk shall cause written notice of such meeting to be given to each member of the Council and to each local newspaper of general circulation, radio or television station requesting notice in writing. Such notice must be delivered personally or must be deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, at least twenty-four (24) hours before the time of such meeting as specified in the notice. The notice and order shall

specify the time and place of the special meeting and the business to be transacted. No other business shall be considered at such meetings by the Council.

Written notice to each member of the Council may be dispensed with as to any member of the Council who, at or prior to the time the meeting convenes, files with the City Clerk a written waiver of notice. The waiver may be given by telegram. The written notice may also be dispensed with as to any member of the Council who is actually present at the meeting at the time it convenes.

SECTION 800. CITY MANAGER. There shall be a City Manager who shall be the chief executive officer and head of the administrative branch of the City government. The City Manager shall be chosen on the basis of the person's executive and administrative qualifications with special reference to the person's actual experience in, or the person's knowledge of accepted practices with respect to the duties of the office as hereinafter set forth. No member of the Council shall be eligible for appointment to the office of City Manager during the term for which the member shall have been elected or appointed, nor within one year thereafter. The City Manager need not be a resident of the City or State at the time of appointment, but during the City Manager's tenure of office, the City Manager shall reside within the City.

The council shall appoint the City Manager for an indefinite term and may remove the City Manager by a majority vote of its members provided, however, that the City Manager shall not be removed from office during or within a period of ninety (90) days next succeeding the election of a member of the Council. The purpose of this provision is to allow any newly elected member of the Council to observe the actions and ability of the City Manager in the performance of powers and duties of this office.

SECTION 801. POWERS AND DUTIES. The City Manager shall be head of the Administrative Branch of the City government. The City Manager shall be responsible to the Council for the proper administration of all affairs of the City and to that end, subject to the personnel provisions of this Charter, the City Manager shall have power and shall be required to:

(a) Appoint and, when necessary for the good of the service, discipline and remove all officers and employees of the City except as otherwise provided by this Charter, and except as the City Manager may authorize the head of any department or office to appoint or remove subordinates in such department or office.

(b) Prepare the budget annually and submit it to the Council and be responsible for its administration after its adoption by the Council.

(c) Prepare and submit to the Council within ninety (90) days of the end of the fiscal year, a complete report on the finances and administrative activities of the City for the preceding year.

(d) Review procedures relating to the assessment, levy and collection of ad valorem property taxes and make recommendations regarding the same to the Council if deemed appropriate.

(e) Establish a centralized purchasing system for all City offices, departments and agencies.

(f) Establish and enforce specifications for supplies, materials and equipment required by the City.

(g) Cause all supplies purchased by the City to be inspected and a determination made that the same comply with specifications.

(h) Prepare rules and regulations governing the contracting for, purchasing, storing, inventory, distribution or disposal of all supplies, materials and equipment required by any office, department or agency of the City government and recommend them to the Council for its adoption by ordinance. Preference shall be given to the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment from local merchants, quality and price being equal.

(i) Enforce the laws of the State pertaining to the City, the provisions of this Charter and the ordinances, franchises and rights of the City.

(j) Keep the Council advised of the financial conditions and future needs of the City and make such recommendations on any matter as the City Manager may deem desirable.

(k) Make and execute contracts on behalf of the City involving budgeted or appropriated expenditures which do not exceed the amount specified by ordinance of the City Council.

(l) Appoint advisory boards, without compensation, to assist the City Manager in the performance of the City Manager's duty, if the City Manager deems it necessary.

(m) Interchange employees between or among departments if the City Manager deems it proper so to do.

(n) Immediately upon taking office, and annually thereafter, inventory and place a value on all real estate, buildings, furniture and fixtures, supplies and moveable property of every kind and nature belonging to the City; and to require each officer or department head to inventory the same or any portion thereof. One (1) copy of such inventory shall be filed with the Council and one (1) with the auditor.

(o) Be responsible for the custody and control of all City property, the custody and control of which has not otherwise been provided for by this Charter.

(p) Perform such other duties as may be prescribed by this Charter or required of the City Manager by the Council not inconsistent with this Charter.

(q) Sign all contracts, deeds and other documents on behalf of the City when authorized to do so by the Council or by this Charter.

(r) The City Manager shall have the authority to transfer equipment and supplies between departments, and with the approval of the Council, sell obsolete, unused or surplus personal property of the City.

(s) The City Manager shall be accorded a seat at the Council table and shall be entitled to participate in the deliberations of the Council, but shall not have a vote.

(t) The Council shall have the right to instruct the City Manager in matters of policy and any action, determination or omission of the City Manager shall be subject to review by the Council, but no such action, determination or omission shall be overruled or modified by a vote of less than four-sevenths of the members of such Council.

SECTION 901. OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK. The office of the City Clerk is hereby established. It shall be the duty of the City Clerk to:

(a) Attend all meetings of the Council and be responsible for the recording and maintaining of a record of all the actions of the Council;

(b) Keep all ordinances and resolutions of the Council in such manner that the information contained therein will be readily accessible and open to the public; the City Clerk shall attach to the original copy of each ordinance a certificate which will state the date that the ordinance was adopted, and as to an ordinance requiring publication, that the same has been published in accordance with the Charter;

(c) Keep all records of the Council and of the City Clerk's office in such manner that the information contained therein will be readily accessible and open to the public until such time as any of the records may be destroyed, or reproduced and the original thereof destroyed, in accordance with State law;

(d) Be the custodian of the seal of the City;

(e) Administer oaths or affirmations, take affidavits and depositions pertaining to the affairs and business of the City and certify copies of the official records;

(f) Have charge of all City elections;

(g) Be responsible for the publication of all official advertising of the City; and

(h) Perform such other duties consistent with this Charter as may be required of the City Clerk by the Council.

SECTION 902. OFFICE OF THE CITY ATTORNEY. The Office of the City Attorney is hereby established. The City Attorney shall be an attorney at law, and shall be licensed to practice the profession in the State of California. In addition, the City Attorney should have had at least five (5) years' experience in the practice of law prior to appointment. The City Attorney shall have the power and duty to:

(a) Represent and appear for the City, its Council, boards and commissions in all actions or proceedings in which they are concerned or are a party; and represent and appear for a City officer or employee, or a former City officer or employee, in all actions or proceedings in which such officer or employee is a party-defendant due to the performance of the person's official duties, provided such representation and appearance, in the opinion of the City Attorney will not conflict with the City Attorney's duties to the City and will not affect the interests of the City;

(b) Advise the Council and all City officers in all matters of law pertaining to their offices;

(c) Attend all meetings of the Council, except when excused or disabled, and give such advice or opinion on the legality of all matters under consideration by the Council or by any of the boards, commissions or officers of the City;

(d) Prepare ordinances, formal resolutions, contracts and other legal instruments as shall be required or as may be deemed necessary by the City Attorney for the proper conduct of the business of the City, and approve the form of such contracts and the form of all bonds given to the City;

(e) Upon direction of the Council prosecute on behalf of the people all criminal cases for violation of City ordinances;

(f) Perform such other legal duties as may be required by the Council.

The Council may retain or employ other attorneys to take charge of any litigation or legal matter or to assist the City Attorney therein.

SECTION 904. COMPENSATION OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES. The compensation of all City officers and employees, except as otherwise provided in this Charter, shall be by salary to be fixed by ordinance or resolution. No officer or employee shall be allowed any fees, perquisites, emoluments, rewards or compensation, aside from the salary or compensation as fixed by the Council, but all fees received by an officer or employee in connection with said person's official duties shall be paid into the City Treasury.

SECTION 905. OATH OF OFFICE. Every officer of the City, before entering upon the duties of the person's office, shall take the oath of office as provided for in the Constitution of this State, and shall file the same with the City Clerk.

SECTION 906. OFFICIAL BONDS. The Council shall fix by ordinance the amounts and terms of the official bonds of all officials or employees who are required by ordinance to give such bonds. All bonds shall be executed by responsible corporate surety, shall be approved as to form by the City Attorney and shall be filed with the City Clerk. Premiums on official bonds shall be paid by the City.

There shall be no personal liability upon, or any right to recover against, a superior officer, or a superior officer's bond, for any wrongful act or omission of a subordinate, unless such superior officer was a party to or conspired in such wrongful act or omission.

SECTION 1104. MEETINGS. CHAIRPERSONS. As soon as practicable following the first day of January of each year, each of such boards and commissions shall organize by electing one of its members to serve as chairperson at the pleasure of such board or commission. Whenever a special meeting of any board or commission shall be called, the secretary shall cause written notice of such meeting to be given to each member of such board or commission and to each local newspaper of general circulation, radio or television station requesting notice in writing. Such notice must be delivered personally or must be deposited in the United

States mail, postage prepaid, at least twenty-four (24) hours before the time of such meeting as specified in the notice. The notice and order shall specify the time and place of the special meeting and the business to be transacted. No other business shall be considered at such meetings by said boards or commissions.

Written notice to each member of any board or commission may be dispensed with as to any member of any board or commission who, at or prior to the time the meeting convenes, files with the Secretary of such board or commission a written waiver of notice. The waiver may be given by telegram. The written notice may also be dispensed with as to any member of any board or commission who is actually present at the meeting at the time it convenes.

The affirmative or negative vote of a majority of the entire membership of such board or commission shall be necessary for it to take action.

Unless otherwise provided by the Council, or by this Charter, the City Manager shall provide a secretary for the recording of the minutes of each of such boards and commissions who shall keep a record of its proceedings and transactions. Each board and commission shall prepare and submit to the Council an annual report of its activities. Such report shall be made on the fiscal year basis and shall be submitted on or before September 1st of each year. Each board or commission shall prescribe its own procedural rules and regulations which shall be consistent with this Charter and copies of which shall be kept on file in the office of the City Clerk where they shall be available for public inspection.

SECTION 1105. COMPENSATION. VACANCIES. The members of boards and commissions shall serve without compensation for their services as such, but may receive reimbursement for necessary traveling and other expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties.

Any vacancies in any board or commission, from whatever cause arising, shall be filled by appointment by the Council. Upon a vacancy occurring, leaving an unexpired portion of a term, any appointment to fill such vacancy shall be for the unexpired portion of such term. If a member of a board or commission is absent from three (3) regular meetings of such board or commission, consecutively, unless by permission of such board or commission, expressed in its official minutes, or is convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude, or ceases to be a qualified elector of the City, the member's office shall become vacant and shall be so declared by the Council.

SECTION 1109. BOARD OF PERSONNEL APPEALS, POWERS AND DUTIES. The Board of Personnel Appeals shall have the power and duty to:

(a) Select a hearing officer to hear the appeals of any person in the classified service relative to any suspension, demotion or dismissal, so long as a separate and distinct procedure has not been delineated by a valid and existing Memorandum of Understanding.

(b) Act in an advisory capacity to the City Manager on such personnel matters as may be referred to it by the City Manager.

SECTION 1302. ANNUAL BUDGET. On such date in each year as shall be fixed by the Council, the City Manager shall send to the Council a careful estimate, in writing, of the amounts of expenditures required for the business and proper conduct of the various departments, offices, boards and commissions of the City, over which the City Manager has control during the next ensuing year. Said estimate shall be in such detail as the Council shall specify. The City Manager shall also at said time submit to the Council an estimate of the amount of income from fines, licenses and other sources of revenue, exclusive of taxes upon property, and the probable amount required to be levied and raised by taxation.

SECTION 1305. TAX LIMIT.

(a) **Additional Taxes.** There shall be levied and collected at the time and in the same manner as other property taxes for municipal purposes are levied and collected, as additional taxes, if no other provisions for the payment thereof is made:

(1) A tax sufficient to meet all obligations of the City for principal and interest of all bonds or judgments due and unpaid or to become due during the ensuing fiscal year which constitute the general obligations of the City;

(2) A tax sufficient to meet all obligations of the City to the State Employees' Retirement System for retirement of the City employees, if any, due and unpaid or to become due during the ensuing fiscal year.

(b) **Special Levies.** Special levies in addition to the above may be made annually in amounts not to exceed the limits hereinafter enumerated in this section, respectively, on each One Hundred and no/100th Dollars (\$100.00) of the assessed value of the taxable property in the City;

(1) For the support and maintenance of free public libraries and reading rooms, twenty cents (\$.20).

The proceeds of any such special levy shall be used solely for the respective purposes for which it is levied.

SECTION 1307. PUBLIC WORK TO BE DONE BY CONTRACT. Every project involving an expenditure of City moneys of more than the amount which the City Council shall establish by ordinance, for the construction or improvement of public buildings, works, drains, sewers, utilities, parks, playgrounds, and streets (exclusive of projects for resurfacing, maintenance and repair of streets) shall be let by contract to the lowest responsible bidder after notice by publication in the official newspaper by one or more insertions, the first of which shall be at least seven (7) days before the time for opening bids.

All bids shall be accompanied by either a certified or cashier's check, or a bidder's bond executed by a corporate surety authorized to engage in such business in California, made payable to the City. Such security shall be in an amount not less than that specified in the notice inviting bids or in the specifications referred to therein, or if no amount be so specified then in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the aggregate amount of the bid. If the successful bidder neglects or refuses to enter into the contract, within the time specified in the notice inviting bids or

specifications referred to therein, the amount of the person's bidder's security shall be declared forfeited to the City and shall be collected and paid into its general fund and all bonds so forfeited shall be prosecuted and the amount thereof collected and paid into such fund.

The Council may reject any and all bids presented and may readvertise in its discretion.

The Council after rejecting bids, or if no bids are received, may declare and determine that, in its opinion, based on estimates approved by the City Manager the work in question may be performed better or more economically by the City with its own employees and after the adoption of a resolution to this effect by at least five (5) affirmative votes of the Council may proceed to have said work done in the manner stated, without further observance of the provisions of this section. Such contracts likewise may be let without advertising for bids, if such work shall be deemed by the City Council to be of urgent necessity for the preservation of life, health or property and shall be authorized by resolution passed by at least five (5) affirmative votes of the Council and containing a declaration of the facts constituting such urgency.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to the acquisition or purchase of electricity, electric power or electric energy by the City for any use or purpose.

SECTION 1400. FRANCHISES TO OPERATE. No person, firm or corporation shall exercise any franchise, right or privilege mentioned in this Article in the City except insofar as the person or it may be entitled to do so by direct authority of the Constitution of the State of California or of the United States, unless the person or it shall have obtained a grant therefor in accordance with the provisions of this Charter and in accordance with the procedure prescribed by ordinance. Nothing contained in the Article shall be construed to invalidate any lawful franchise heretofore granted nor to necessitate the obtaining of a new franchise for a use for which a franchise holder shall have a valid unexpired franchise.

SECTION 1500. BOARD OF EDUCATION. The control, management and administration of the public schools of the City of Modesto, and the territory that is now or may hereafter be annexed thereto for school purposes, in accordance with the Constitution and general laws of the State of California, are hereby vested in a Board of Education. In all matters not specifically provided for in this Article, the Board shall be governed by the provisions of the general law relating to such matters and shall be vested with all the powers and charged with all the duties provided by the laws of the State for city boards of education. The Board of Education shall be the governing body of the Modesto City School District of Stanislaus County and the Modesto High School District of Stanislaus County. The Board of Education shall consist of seven (7) members who may receive compensation pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Education Code of the State of California. The members of the Board of Education shall be elected at large from the territory within the boundaries of the school district or districts which are under

the jurisdiction of the Board. The members of the Board of Education shall hold office for a period of four (4) years from and after the first Tuesday following the Regular Municipal Election at which they are elected and continuing until their successors are elected and have qualified. No person shall be eligible to be nominated for or to hold office as a member of the Board of Education unless the person is and shall have been for at least thirty (30) days preceding the person's nomination or appointment a resident and registered elector of the school district or districts which are under the jurisdiction of the Board of Education.

When a vacancy, as defined in Government Code 1770, occurs on the Board of Education, the Board of Education shall, within thirty (30) days, either make a provisional appointment to fill the vacancy or call for an election. Failure to take any action within thirty (30) days shall be treated as a call for an election. If a provisional appointment is made, registered voters of the district shall have thirty (30) days to present a petition to the Board of Education calling for a special election to fill the vacancy. The petition must contain the City Clerk's estimate of the cost of the special election and must be signed by at least one and one-half (1 ½) percent of the registered voters, at the last municipal election, of the territory within the boundaries of the school district or districts which are under the jurisdiction of the Board at the last municipal election. If the City Clerk determines that the petition is legally sufficient, the provisional appointee shall step down and an election shall be called to fill the vacancy. The provisional appointment shall confer no powers and duties for the first thirty (30) days. If no petition is filed within thirty (30) days, the provisional appointee shall have all the powers and duties of a Board of Education member and shall hold office until the next regularly scheduled municipal election. If an election is held, it shall be to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term. The members of the Board of Education shall be subject to recall as provided in this Charter.

All territory included within the limits of any school district or districts which are under the jurisdiction of the Board of Education, but not within the City limits, shall be deemed a part of the City for the purpose of holding municipal elections and shall constitute one (1) or more separate election precincts; and the qualified electors therein shall vote only for members of the Board of Education and on questions submitted to a vote of the people at special or regular elections pertaining to school matters.

The members of the Board of Education in office at the time this amendment to the Charter takes effect shall continue in office until the expiration of their terms. Their successors shall be elected at the regular municipal election to be held during the year that each said respective term expires.

SECTION 1602. VIOLATION OF CHARTER AND ORDINANCES. The violation of, or the failure to comply with, any provision of this Charter or of any City ordinance or of any provision of any code adopted by reference by the Modesto Municipal Code, shall be unlawful. Except

as otherwise provided, such violation or failure to comply shall be deemed a misdemeanor, unless the City Attorney shall elect to charge the offense as an infraction, so long as any such election shall not adversely affect the citizen appeal process existing under this Charter.

Any such violation may be prosecuted by the authorities of the City in the name of the people of the State of California, or may be redressed by civil action, at the option of said authorities. The maximum penalty for a misdemeanor upon conviction for the violation of, or failure to comply with, any provision of this Charter, or of any ordinance of the City, or of any provisions of any law adopted by reference by this code, shall be a fine not exceeding One Thousand and no/100ths Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one (1) year or both such fine and imprisonment. The maximum penalty for any infraction upon conviction shall be by a fine of Five Hundred and no/100th Dollars (\$500.00), and there shall be no imprisonment.

Charter Chapter 22—City of Santa Barbara

Amendments to the Charter of the City of Santa Barbara

[Filed with the Secretary of State December 6, 1989]

Section 1508. Nonresidential Growth Limitations.

In furtherance of the policy stated in Section 1507, and to assure that nonresidential development does not exceed the City's water resources, traffic capacity, and affordable housing supply, the City Council shall place the following limits on nonresidential development through adoption of General Plan amendments and subsequent adoption of ordinances and resolutions which are consistent with the General Plan amendments (collectively referred to as "growth limitations" in this section). The growth limitations shall reduce non-residential development from the existing General Plan potential of one hundred, sixteen million (116,000,000) square feet and restrict it to no more than three million (3,000,000) square feet over the next twenty (20) years, commencing January 1, 1990. If the growth limitation ordinances and resolutions have not been adopted by January 1, 1993, no further projects shall be approved until after said ordinances and resolutions are adopted.

(a) Limitations on New Development. The growth limitations shall restrict nonresidential development (including pending and approved projects) over the next twenty (20) years to no more than three million (3,000,000) square feet above the October 1988 baseline condition. This allowable square footage shall be allocated as follows:

<i>Category</i>	<i>Square Footage</i>
Approved Projects	900,000
Pending Projects	700,000
Vacant Property	500,000
Small Additions	600,000
Community Priorities	300,000
TOTAL:	3,000,000

This limitation shall be implemented by zoning ordinance amendments, parcel rezoning, a project evaluation system, a floor area ratio ordinance and other appropriate means to reduce or restrict the zoning to allow a maximum of three million (3,000,000) additional square feet above the October, 1988, baseline condition at full buildout. The balance of any square footage which is not utilized in any category shall be either (i) set aside for possible use after twenty (20) years, or (ii) used during that twenty (20) year period for a project approved by the voters. Small additions will be limited to no more than thirty thousand (30,000) square feet annually.

(b) Traffic, Water and Affordable Housing Resources. The growth limitations shall provide that a new or pending nonresidential project may be constructed only if it will not cause a significant and unmitigated adverse impact on any of the following:

1. The City's water resources.
2. Traffic within the City.
3. The supply of affordable housing in the City and South Coast area.

A finding shall be made that resources will be available and traffic improvements will be in place at the time the project is ready for occupancy.

(c) Community Priority Projects. Community Priority Projects are those which are found by the City Council as necessary to meet present or projected needs directly related to public health, safety or general welfare. Such projects shall not be subject to the provisions of Subsection (b).

(d) Interim Limitations. The City Council shall adopt, on an interim basis, ordinances and resolutions adequate to limit nonresidential development until such time as the growth limitations required by this section are adopted. No projects shall be approved between the effective date of this Charter section and the date these interim measures are effective. At such time as the growth limitations ordinances and resolutions required in (a), (b), and (c) above are in effect, this section (d) shall be deemed repealed. The interim limitations shall:

1. Prohibit nonresidential development which, if approved, would prejudice the City's ability to comply with this section.
2. Prohibit approval of a pending project if it will cause either an unavoidable and unmitigated significant adverse environmental effect, or an adverse effect on traffic in violation of adopted City policies as set forth in the Circulation Element and other applicable ordinances and

resolutions. This policy does not apply in the event that a project's only significant environmental effect is a cumulative effect on air quality.

3. Prohibit the conversion of residential units to nonresidential uses within R-4 zone and all nonresidential zones. Prohibit demolition of any residential unit in any nonresidential zone unless it will be replaced on site with an affordable unit.

4. Require that any nonresidential project on vacant land not exceed a floor area ratio of 0.25.

5. Allow Community Priority Projects to proceed, notwithstanding paragraphs 1 through 4 of this Subsection (d), provided the City Council finds that the project is needed to satisfy a present or projected need directly related to public health, safety or general welfare.

(e) *Definitions.* A minor addition of one thousand (1,000) square feet or less shall not be considered a project under this section. Hotel rooms replaced on a room-for-room basis shall not be considered a project under this section. A "general welfare project" is defined as a project which has a broad public benefit (for example: museums, childcare facilities, or community centers), and which is not principally operated for private profit. The remaining terms used in this section shall be defined by ordinance.
